10	A RESOLUTION
11	EXTENDING THE EMERGENCY PROCLAMATION DECLARED BY THE MAYOR ON
12	SEPTEMBER 27, 2021, BY FORTY DAYS, EXPIRING AT NOON ON NOVEMBER 8,
13	2021, PURSUANT TO SECTION 20-1.3(C) SFCC 1987.
14	
15	WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, Mayor Webber proclaimed a state of emergency in
16	response to the Public Health Emergency that is the rapid spread of an infection called COVID-19
17	(COVID-19 Proclamation I); and
18	WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020 the Governing Body voted to extend Mayor Webber's
19	Proclamation, pursuant to SFCC 1987, Section 20-1.3(C); and
20	WHEREAS, on March 23, 2020 the Mayor proclaimed a state of emergency a second time
21	in response to the continuing Public Health Emergency, due to the continued and growing
22	emergency (COVID-19 Proclamation II); and
23	WHEREAS, on March 25, 2020 the Governing Body adopted amendments to Section 20-
24	1.3 SFCC 1987 that allow the Governing Body to extend the proclamation of emergency by up to
25	sixty (60) days in the event a public health emergency has been declared by the New Mexico

Department of Health; and

2 WHEREAS, the public health emergency declared by the New Mexico Department of
3 Health continues; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the Governing Body's amendments to Section 20-1.3, the
Mayor has proclaimed a state of emergency nine times in response to the continuing public health
emergency on May 25, 2020; July 27, 2020; September 28, 2020; November 30, 2020; January 20,
2021; March 29, 2021; May 24, 2021; July 12, 2021; August 9, 2021; and September 27, 2021
(COVID-19 Proclamations II through XII); and

9 WHEREAS, in Santa Fe County, at least 90.5% of eligible residents ages 18 or older have
10 had at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine and at least 80.4% are fully vaccinated, nearly 20
11 percentage points more than New Mexico as a whole; and

WHEREAS, despite the County's high vaccination rate, instances of positive cases and
hospitalizations remain high as the highly infections Delta variant accounts for nearly all of the
positive cases throughout the State, requiring ongoing diligence and City response to suppress the
spread of the virus; and

WHEREAS, as a result of Proclamation XI and its associated Emergency Orders, the City
of Santa Fe reached a 75% vaccination rate among employees – an increase from 50% five weeks
prior – and five percentage points higher than the State as a whole; and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 Proclamation I and the resolution extending it, Resolution
No. 2020-10, are attached as Exhibit A; COVID-19 Proclamation II and the resolution extending
it, Resolution No. 2020-13 are attached as Exhibit B; COVID-19 Proclamation III and the
resolution extending it, Resolution No. 2020-20, are attached as Exhibit C; COVID-19
Proclamation IV and the resolution extending it, Resolution No. 2020-30 are attached as Exhibit
D; COVID-19 Proclamation V and the resolution extending it, Resolution No. 2020-39 are attached

8	WHEREAS, if not extended, Proclamation XII would expire on September 30, 2021; and
9	WHEREAS, the Governing Body wishes to extend Proclamation XII for an additional
10	forty (40) days pursuant to Section 20-1.3(C), an extension that will allow, if needed, reissuance of
11	a proclamation by the Mayor on November 8, 2021, and an extension by the Governing Body on
12	November 10, 2021, a regularly scheduled Governing Body meeting.
13	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE
14	CITY OF SANTA FE that Proclamation XII is hereby extended by forty (40) days, expiring at
15	noon on November 8, 2021, pursuant to Section 20-1.3(C).
