11	ESTABLISHING CITY OF SANTA FE LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES FOR
12	CONSIDERATION BY THE NEW MEXICO STATE LEGISLATURE DURING THE 55 TH
13	LEGISLATURE – STATE OF NEW MEXICO – SECOND SESSION, 2022.
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15	WHEREAS, the 30-day Legislative Session of the 2022 New Mexico State Legislature
16	("Legislature") begins on January 18, 2022 and ends on February 17, 2022; and
17	WHEREAS, the Governing Body desires to establish City of Santa Fe ("City") legislative
18	priorities to be considered by the City's Legislative Delegation and the Legislature; and
19	WHEREAS, the Governing Body's legislative priorities include City-wide capital outlay
20	priorities, statutory priorities, general fund priorities, City Council District capital outlay priorities, and
21	other legislative priorities beneficial to the City to be introduced during the 2022 New Mexico
22	Legislative Session.
23	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE
24	CITY OF SANTA FE that the Governing Body hereby establishes the following city-wide capital
25	outlay legislative funding priorities for consideration by the Legislature during the 2022 Legislative

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Session:

From any statewide capital outlay initiative associated with economic development,
 the City requests <u>\$11,000,000</u> for construction of the Santa Fe Regional Airport terminal building
 expansion and related infrastructure to accommodate additional airlines, flights, increased seating, and
 enhanced flow of passenger traffic;

6 2. From any statewide capital outlay initiative associated with municipal parks, the City
7 requests funding in the amount of <u>\$3,500,000</u> for Phase II improvements of the Southwest Activity
8 Node ("SWAN") Park;

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3. From any statewide capital outlay initiative associated with economic development, the City requests funding in the amount of <u>\$10,000,000</u> that will be used to plan, design, and construct infrastructure within the Midtown Santa Fe property including, but not limited to, digital, transportation, drainage, facility, and utility infrastructure;

4. From any statewide capital outlay initiative associated with medians, the City requests
 <u>\$3,000,000</u> to reduce maintenance and improve median beautification and safety throughout the City,
 specifically 80 identified medians along St. Francis Drive, Cerrillos Road, Zia Road, and Airport Road;
 and

From any statewide capital outlay initiative associated with emergency services and
fire safety and prevention, the City requests <u>\$9,380,000</u> for the construction of Fire Station #2 to provide
public safety coverage on the Westside of Santa Fe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body requests the Legislature enact a
Joint Resolution ratifying and approving the transfer of one or more tracts of City-owned real property
to the State of New Mexico Department of Public Safety in trade and exchange for the transfer of
multiple tracts of State-owned real property to the City of Santa Fe, New Mexico.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body supports and endorses the
establishment of a regional drug treatment facility that would serve the residents of Santa Fe and

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northern New Mexico.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body supports and endorses legislation
during the 2022 Legislative Session that would allow for a New Mexico Public Bank owned by and for
the people of New Mexico that would direct the State's investment decisions to support and diversify
the economy including achieving goals in eco-tourism, food security, solar energy installations,
broadband expansion, health clinic upgrades, and clean energy infrastructure projects.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body requests that the Legislature ensure
hold harmless payments to counties and municipalities are not eliminated or further reduced and
returned to their original schedule and/or ensure that any tax reform continues to hold counties and
municipalities harmless in lieu of the enactment of legislation reinstating the gross receipts tax on food
and medical.

12 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Governing Body requests that the Legislature 13 appropriate money from the general fund to support the Santa Fe Thrive public safety program, which 14 allows law enforcement officers to work with the Santa Fe Fire Department to redirect persons 15 suspected of involvement in non-violent, low-level crimes to community-based services in lieu of 16 prosecution or jail.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body supports and endorses any
 legislation that improves broadband infrastructure throughout the state, specifically as it relates to
 associated economic development.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body supports and endorses any
 legislation that supports the development and construction of affordable housing to decrease and/or
 subsidize the cost of housing for residents of Santa Fe and New Mexico.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body supports and endorses any
legislation that establishes an additional lodgers' tax, the proceeds of which would be used by
municipalities and counties to defray the cost of providing affordable housing or to leverage federal

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funding for affordable housing.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Santa Fe supports and endorses any
legislation that slows down the timeline for eviction and improves opportunities for mediation between
renters and landlords.

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Santa Fe supports and endorses any
6 legislation that replenishes and seeks a recurring funding source to support MFA's Housing Trust Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body requests the Legislature support
legislation that promotes water reuse and water planning and other legislation designed to improve
overall sustainability at the state and local level.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body supports and endorses any legislation that would support municipal recycling program, product packaging changes that reduce waste, and programs that support recycling market development.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body supports any legislation that
advances the environmental sustainability goals of the City of Santa Fe including carbon neutrality,
ecological resilience, economic vitality, and quality of life and social equity.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body supports and endorses any legislation that would provide an option for local governments to opt-in to adopting an emissions inspections program under the Air Quality Control Act.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body supports and endorses any
 legislation that would eliminate the 3% cap on annual property tax increases on residences that are not
 owner-occupied as the owner's principal place of residence.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body supports and endorses any
legislation that would improve and expand early childhood education.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Santa Fe continues to support statewide paid
sick leave legislation, as reinforced by the City's Resolution No. 2021-11 unanimously passed in 2021.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body supports and endorses any
 legislation that would increase funding for the New Mexico Tourism Department for use in advertising,
 a state-wide co-op grant program, and/or personnel expansion that restores the reduction in services at
 the Department between 2010-2018.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body supports the one-time allocation of
monies received by the State from the American Recovery Act of 2021 to the New Mexico Tourism
Department for the purpose of additional marketing of New Mexico, increased co-op advertising
support with municipalities, job training, and for other uses to benefit the restoration of tourism to New
Mexico.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body requests the Legislature adopt
 legislation that pertains to statewide business licensing that permit business owners to operate in all
 cities, counties, and municipalities provided business owners comply with local land use and safety
 requirements.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body hereby establishes the following
 City Council District capital outlay legislative funding priorities for improvements of citywide
 infrastructure for consideration by the Legislature during the 2021 Legislative Session:

For a capital outlay initiative located within City Council District 1, funding is
 requested in the total amount of <u>\$264,005</u> for sidewalk and lighting improvements along Harrison Road.

For a capital outlay initiative located within City Council District 2, funding is
 requested in the total amount of <u>\$700,000</u> for pedestrian and bike safety improvements in dense
 business areas on Pacheco Street from Alta Vista to San Mateo.

- 3. For a capital outlay initiative located within City Council District 3, funding is
 requested in the total amount of <u>\$1,000,000</u> for constructing improvements to the Tierra Contenta trail
 system.
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For a capital outlay initiative located within City Council District 4, funding is

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1	requested in the total amount of <u>\$2,450,000</u> to reconstruct Governor Miles Road to improve safety for
2	bicycles and pedestrians.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body directs the City lobbyist to work
with the New Mexico Municipal League in support of any Municipal League 2022 Legislative Priority
where the City would benefit from the passage of such initiative.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body directs the City lobbyist to make any capital outlay project directly or indirectly included in the City ICIP Priority List a priority.

8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body directs the City lobbyist to work to
9 advance any legislation introduced during the 2022 New Mexico Legislative Session deemed to be
10 beneficial to the City.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body directs the City lobbyist to work to
 defeat any legislation introduced during the 2022 New Mexico Legislative Session deemed to be
 detrimental to the City.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that while this Resolution represents a majority of the intent
of the Governing Body as to 2022 New Mexico legislative priorities, other timely priorities may be
approved by the Governing Body, incorporated into the City's 2022 state legislative agenda, and
forwarded to the City's lobbying team for action.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk be directed to forward a copy of this
Resolution to the City of Santa Fe lobbyist, the City of Santa Fe State Legislative Delegation, and the
Governor of New Mexico.
