MINUTES OF THE SANTA FÉ MPO TECHNICAL COORDINATING COMMITTEE February 25, 2013

CALL TO ORDER

A regular meeting of the Santa Fé MPO Technical Coordinating Committee was called to order on the above date by Chair John Romero at approximately 1:38 p.m. in the Councilors Conference Room, City Hall, 200 Lincoln Avenue, Santa Fé, New Mexico.

ROLL CALL

Roll call indicated the presence of a quorum as follows:

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Ms. Lucero moved to approve the agenda as presented. Ms. Leigland seconded the motion and

it passed by unanimous voice vote.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES – January 28, 2013

Ms. Baer moved to approve the minutes of January 28, 2013 as presented. Mr. Aune seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.

1. COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE PUBLIC

There were no communications from the public.

2. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION:

a. Election of the Chair

Mr. Wilson explained that the by-laws required the chair to be elected annually.

Mr. Aune moved to re-elect John Romero as Chair. Mr. Quintana seconded the nomination.

Ms. Leigland nominated Mr. Aune but there was no second.

Chair Romero accepted re-election as Chair.

b. Review and Recommendation on the Proposed Amendments to the FFY 2012-2015 Transportation Improvement Program

Mr. Wilson provided a handout on the Proposed Amendments to the FFY 2012-2015 TIP [attached as Exhibit 1].

Mr. Wilson said two bridge rehabilitation projects came in at the last minute before release for public review. They would be done with federal bridge maintenance funds.

Under the Transit and Rail Section (#29) using federal safety funds for rail crossings was the Santa Fé Southern Rail Crossing improvements including signage from the Santa Fé Depot to Lamy.

Three non-motorized projects were the Santa Fé Rail Trail at almost \$800,000 and local match, \$500,000 for City of Santa Fé Safe Routes to School and \$165,000 enhancement funds for the Rail Trail Retaining Wall

The recommendation would go to the MPO-TPB on March 14. To date there were no public comments but they had one more week to go. He saw no major issues on them.

Mr. Aune asked about the Safe Routes to Schools.

Mr. Wilson said that involved improvements to sidewalks and crossings based on recommendations in the Bicycle Master Plan. Most of the trail and bikeways for schools had run their course and that had to be spent before getting Safe Routes funds. It was for pedestrian and safety improvements at Gonzales, Carlos Gilbert, Chaparral, and at Cesar Chavez in Tierra Contenta.

Mr. Wilson said last time he talked with Ms. Baker there was one more EA certification and then finalization on the county project. Ms. Baker had said the bid packet was approved.

Mr. Quintana moved to recommend approval of the amended TIP to the TPB. Ms. Leigland seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.

c. Review and Recommendation on the Proposed Urbanized Area Boundary

Mr. Wilson provided a handout on the Proposed Urbanized Area Boundary [attached as Exhibit 2]. It was approved at the January meeting for public review. He had upgraded the map showing transit routes and a zoomed in version. They received no public input on it so it was going to the TPB on March14 and be forwarded to DOT to approve the new boundary and then it would be official and used for future allocations.

Ms. Baer moved to recommend approval of the Urbanized Area Boundary map to the TPB. Mr. Quintana seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.

d. Review and Release for Public Review of the Draft FFY 2014-2017 Transportation Improvement Program

Mr. Wilson provided a handout of the Draft FFY 2014-2017 TIP [attached as Exhibit 3]. He recalled at the last meeting the Committee discussed the NE Connector rating and raised the score making it the highest at 34.

The Trails section used the rating of the Bicycle Master Plan. Lots of trails were in segments in the MP so they put them together and averaged the score.

There was no new funding for projects but the table would be an appendix in the TIP and whenever funding became available the Committee could use the table for funding recommendations.

He provided another handout of the 2014-2017 TIP Summary draft for the TPB April 11 meeting [attached as Exhibit 4].

SFMPO-TCC

Mr. Wilson quickly reviewed the individual projects. The roadway projects were already receiving funding under the old TIP. The first construction project was phase II-C for Cerrillos Road reconstruction at \$1.5 million; the second was the I-25 interchange at Cerrillos with funding in 2014.

For the Transit & Rail Projects he confirmed the funding source for Santa Fe Trails - 5307 and 5340 in the 2012-2015 TIP

Projects 4 - 7 were for Ridefinders service; 8 - 11 were the 5339 Bus and Facilities funding using the new fund category for buses and transit facilities at \$150,000 plus 20% match. 12 was for Transportation Alternatives Program Funding wherein the state would distribute fund based on population. Prior year's funding was about \$625,000 which was an over-calculation before federal guidance and now would be about half of that amount. He anticipated about \$60,000 plus local match for the rural areas of the MPO.

Mr. Wilson received word that the HSIP allocation would be \$2.276 million per year. His question was whether the local match was included in that number or to be added on. Some projects were 100% federal and some were not. In the past the state provided the local match. He shared a handout on HSIP [attached as Exhibit 5].

Mr. Morelli asked if the projects could be ready that quickly.

Mr. Wilson said he met last week with the County and Tesuque and for this year, they probably needed to go with as many DOT projects as possible.

Mr. Quintana said there were some projects ready for 2014 and they could do ROW acquisitions this year.

Mr. Wilson explained that the MPO had control over the \$3m for projects and there is still money at the state level so we can use up our allocation and then apply for statewide funds. Over the next week or two we need to meet to bring forth ideas to the next TCC and get them in the TIP amendment.

Ms. Baer asked if this money could be used for trails.

Chair Romero said probably not. Mr. Wilson agreed because this was specifically for safety projects. There were no accidents on the Rail Trail.

Mr. Wilson proposed to release this for public review for 30 days which would take it to April 1st and he wanted to have the public meeting prior to the March 25th TCC meeting. He suggested March 20 or March 21.

Ms. Baer asked for a Ridefinders description.

Mr. Wilson said it was for people calling into Santa Fé Trails and it needed a staff person who could

identify carpooling and what transit services were available.

Ms. Baer didn't think that seemed like a full time job. She thought it needed more justification.

Chair Romero thought if they denied the project, the money would go back to Washington instead of being reallocated.

Mr. Wilson said the position wasn't just for Santa Fé Trails but included the Park and Ride. This was the draft TIP for public review. The other transit funds were formula funds. The City was not likely to turn them down.

Mr. Quintana moved to release the Draft FFY 2014-2017 Transportation Improvement Program for public review. Mr. Aune seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.

e. Presentation of Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS)

Mr. Wilson recalled they did an update to the ITS architecture. Basically it was a lot of charts on procedures so it could talk to each other. It was updated last April and a year ago they had an ITS work group to work out how to utilize it. He want to set up an ITS working group again with some from the TCC and others that were more involved in ITS. The first task was to look at major arterials and what infrastructure they should have.

Mr. Wilson introduced Mr. John Dijirio who was with the ITS Bureau and he shared a PPT on the ITS system.

Mr. Dijirio said the Command Center was located in Albuquerque to serve the whole state. They collect data to be ported out into the roads system. He explained what functional services were available on the web site. They were planning to install more ITS readers in the Santa Fé area.

The ITS Bureau's purpose was to use technology to improve safety. Sharing information with other organizations made it more of a reality. Through the TIP process they reviewed each project with the characteristics and what functional services were going to be used.

As the MPO went through the certification process there was a package with all the technologies that were available. They wanted to share the information they had with others to make it easier for everyone. The infrastructure was there so they could avoid duplication of effort to better meet the needs of the community and provide the information as quickly as possible.

Ms. Baer asked about traffic counts.

Mr. Dijirio said they used traffic data collected by others. They used an algorithm for projecting driving times to locations ahead on the traffic information signs. They also used river crossings service in

Albuquerque to predict the best routes for motorists to use. The architecture was dynamic and the city's traffic signal network was used by ITS for best recommended routes.

He was a member of the ITS Association to network with others in the nation. The organization's interest was to attain zero fatalities and zero congestion. He looked forward to working with the MPO and indicated the ITS Bureau had some training and documentation available to the SFMPO.

Mr. Aune asked about the location.

Mr. Dijirio said the City of Albuquerque had just purchased back the old armory to build a regional transportation management center. There was more and more need for collaboration. They have done white papers on the need and shown that by having people in a common physical location leads to better performance. Many issues remain but he hoped it would be achievable and provide better collaboration. Albuquerque wanted the ITS Bureau to run their signs. But they had to have more access such as to their traffic cameras in order to manage the signs in real time. If the information was not communicated to ITS readers timely it lowered their credibility.

Mr. Aune asked if Albuquerque would compensate the ITS Bureau for doing that.

Mr. Dijirio said they used an MOU. He discussed the limitations of messages that could be used on the boards. The federal government allowed 15% additional ITS funding for rural states and New Mexico qualified as a rural state. Funding and desire were important factors.

Mr. Wilson said the working group would develop a scope and send it out to member agencies to see how it fit. They would probably have a quarterly meeting schedule to begin with.

f. Update on the Highway Safety Improvement Program

Mr. Wilson referred to the handout on HSIP set aside for 2014. At the state quarterly meeting it was announced that RPO/MPOs in the state would get funding. The total set aside was \$8.23 million with \$5.69 million going to MPOs and \$2.439 million to RPOs. There was a need to maximize the utilization of the funds or else the percentages would go down. These levels were good for the next two years. He expected more guidance in the next few weeks but wouldn't wait to set up another meeting. This was the opportunity to show the GO Bond folks that they could come up with good safety projects to justify the funding.

Mr. Morelli said a number of the categories were labeled as an "emphasis."

Mr. Wilson asked members to bring possible projects to the next meeting.

Mr. Morelli said this was similar to the ITS committee and the TCC might want to do that in a safety committee.

g. Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Project Updates

Mr. Quintana reported on the state projects from the TIP list.

- 1. They were closer to getting the agreement and were getting city and state signatures and the developer was chomping at the bit for the 90% design review. Construction would probably begin in June or July.
- 2. This project was now open with some paving and draining work to be done once the weather permitted. Landscaping for roundabouts was yet to be done.
- 3. The contract had been awarded to Albuquerque Interdome Construction would begin in early March.

Mr. Wilson asked about public information to address questions from the public.

Mr. Quintana said the state PIO was working with the City PIO on it.

Chair Romero said he had been asked to give small presentation on it.

- 6. The project was the same as last month. Haven't met with develop consultants for about 2 months. They were amending the contract.
- 7. For Cañoncito there should be a public hearing in April and letting the contract in October.
- 9. The project was not let yet and was projected to start in warmer weather. It was not a corridor-wide improvement. They were still waiting on what the Indian School was doing out there.
- 11. The project would get going once the weather was warmer. The ramps in Eldorado were taken care of.
- 15 & 16 were off the top for bridges around the state. Plans would be ready in April or May with a June let and 16 would be a month later.

Mr. Leigland gave the County updates.

- 4. The contract meeting would be on Wednesday. It would be a 9-month contract with Ockham and it was open to the public.
- 8. This is progressing.
- 12. The County awarded the contract last week.
- 14. They just got approval back from DOT and it was scheduled to start in May or June.

Ms. Luján provided updates on city projects.

- 5. They got agreement from DOT last week and it would be going to committee next week.
- 13. They had the first public information meeting three weeks ago. Documents were done in last couple of weeks.

Regarding Trail projects, Mr. Quintana said DOT needed to fix an earthen berm that had been breached. Louis Berger would do on-call projects for stabilization.

Chair Romero asked Mr. Wilson to meet with him on the school projects. He mentioned Capshaw.

3. MPO OFFICER REPORT

Mr. Tibbetts reported staff was still finalizing the PPP to be finished for the March 25 meeting as final.

They were revising UPWP right now for additional funding.

They were also responding to the study completed in December on MPO -

They were working on hiring an additional staff member and were going through the City HR.

Last week staff went to an interesting conference on transit and economic impacts dealing with Ft. Collins, Flagstaff, Eugene, Oregon and also on Albuquerque. It was very well attended because they provided free lunch.

4. COMMUNICATIONS FROM TCC MEMBERS

There were no communications from TCC members.

5. ADJOURN - Next TCC Meeting: Monday, March 25, 2013

Having completed the agenda, the meeting was adjourned at 3:15 pm.

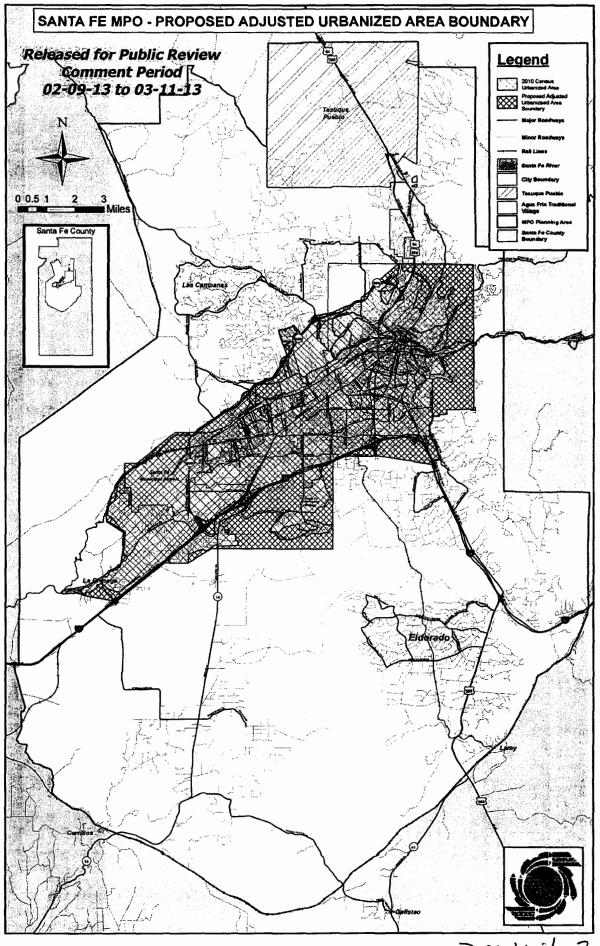
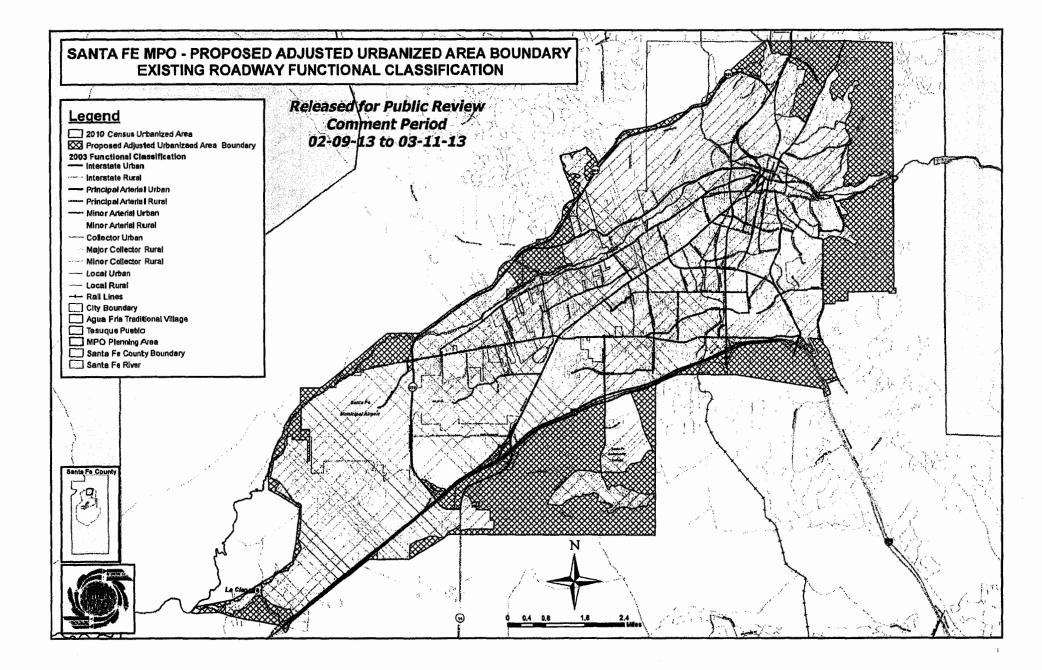
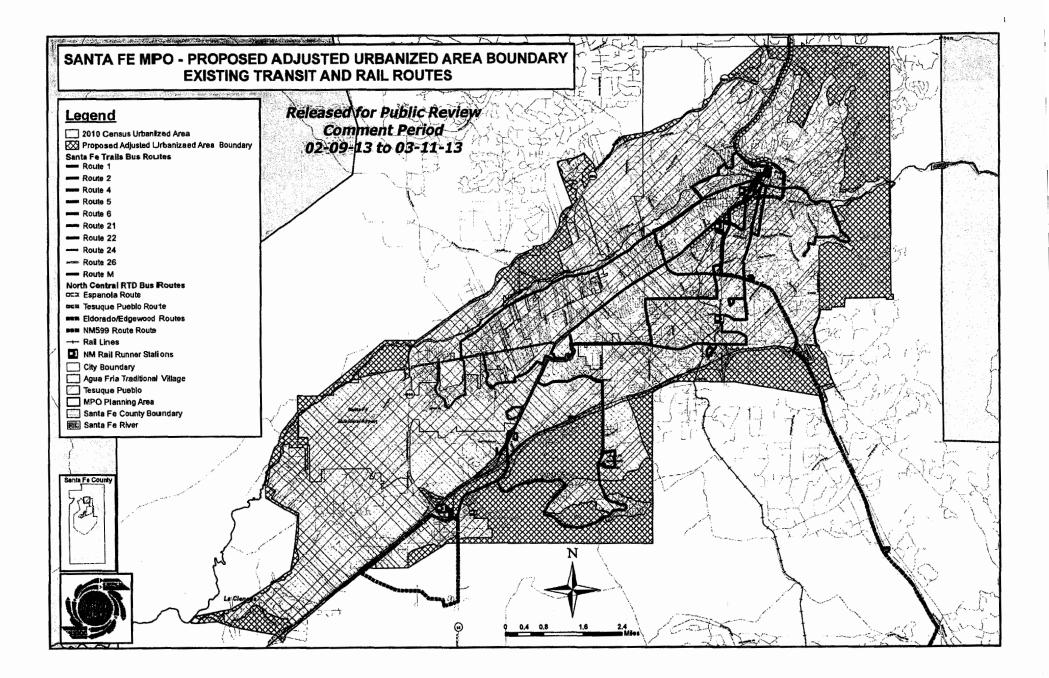
