11	CREATING A NEW SECTION 7-16 SFCC 1987 TO REQUIRE THAT SINGLE-OCCUPANT
12	PUBLIC OR EMPLOYEE RESTROOMS IN ANY COMMERCIAL FACILITY BE GENDER
13	NEUTRAL AND IDENTIFIED AS SUCH BY APPROPRIATE SIGNAGE.

15	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE:
16	Section 1. A new Section 7-16 SFCC 1987 is ordained to read:
17	7-16 [NEW MATERIAL] SINGLE-OCCUPANT RESTROOMS.
18	7-16.1 [ <u>NEW MATERIAL</u> ] DEFINITIONS.
19	Gender neutral signage means a sign that indicates a restroom without preference to a
20	specific gender.
21	Private or private use restroom means plumbing fixtures in residences and apartments,
22	private bathrooms in hotels and hospitals, and restrooms in commercial establishments where the
23	fixtures are intended for the use of a family or an individual and are accessible only from a private
24	room or office.
25	Single-occupant restroom means a lockable restroom available for an individual for use with

1	or without assistance.
2	7-16.2 [NEW MATERIAL] Applicability.
3	This section applies to single-occupant restrooms within commercial facilities that are not
4	private or private use restrooms. This section is an additional requirement to those already required in
5	the Santa Fe City Code.
6	7-16.3 [NEW MATERIAL] Signage Required.
7	A. A single-occupant restroom subject to this Section shall have gender-neutral signage.
8	B. A person with control over a commercial facility with at least one (1) single-occupant
9	restroom shall install and maintain gender-neutral signage for each single-occupant restroom.
10	7-16.4 [NEW MATERIAL] Amendment to Section 2902.2 of the International Building
11	Code; Separate Facilities.
12	2902.2 Separate facilities. Where plumbing fixtures are required, separate facilities shall be
13	provided for each sex.
14	Exceptions:
15	1. Separate facilities shall not be required for dwelling units and sleeping units.
16	2. Separate facilities shall not be required in structures or tenant spaces with a total
17	occupant load, including both employees and customers, of 15 or less.
18	3. Separate facilities shall not be required in mercantile occupancies in which the
19	maximum occupant load is 50 or less.
20	4. Single-occupant public or employee restrooms shall not be restricted to use by a
21	specific sex or gender identity by means of signage, design or installation of fixtures.
