1	of whom may be residents of Santa Fe county. Members shall be persons who have expressed an						
2	interest in serving on the Parks and Recreation Commission, who represent a broad range of parks						
3	and recreation users; have backgrounds related to active, passive, regional, community or						
4	neighborhood parks and recreation policies; have knowledge of parks and recreation use, maintenance						
5	or construction; and who are qualified by training, experience, and ability to exercise sound and						
6	practical judgment regarding the duties and responsibilities of the PARC.						
7	B. Officers. The mayor, with the approval of the city council, shall appoint the						
8	chairperson. The chairperson shall reside within the municipal boundaries of the city of Santa Fe. The						
9	chairperson shall designate the vice chairperson.						
10	C. Representatives. Youth representatives, in order to involve them in the public						
11	process, will be named each year by the chair. Youth representatives will be recruited from Santa Fe						
12	public and private schools and the Santa Fe Community College and will be non-voting members.
