

#### **VOLUNTEER**







### **HUNGER IS CLOSER THAN YOU THINK**



Hunger in New Mexico is often hidden, but it affects **one of every five people in our state.** And one of every three children in our state suffers from hunger. Hunger is a growing crisis in New Mexico.

- Hunger causes children lasting harm.
   Without enough to eat, children experience developmental delays and can have a tough time learning.
- Hunger affects even those who have jobs. Over 50% of hungry families have at least one employed adult.
- Hunger makes our seniors physically vulnerable, at higher risk for depression and disease.


For those who struggle with hunger, the effects are far-reaching and often difficult to see. Hunger has an immediate impact on basic health, causing problems such as weight loss, fatigue, and headaches. It exacerbates chronic and acute diseases and speeds the onset of degenerative diseases.

Providing food to individuals who are hungry positively impacts their capacity to be contributing members of society.

### THE FOOD DEPOT IS NORTHERN NEW MEXICO'S FOOD BANK

The Food Depot is committed to ending hunger in Northern New Mexico. As part of *Feeding America* and the *New Mexico Association of Food Banks*, The Food Depot partners locally with more than 145 nonprofit agencies to feed children, seniors, and families in need.

Local partners include food pantries, meal programs, shelters for battered families and the homeless, youth programs, and senior centers. The Food Depot serves as the food bank for these agencies, allowing them to focus on their primary missions such as providing hot meals, sheltering families, and teaching life skills to youth.

The Food Depot provides food to those in need through its partner agencies in **nine Northern New Mexico counties** —many of them in remote areas with high rates of poverty.

In The Food Depot's service area, over 70,000 people seek emergency food assistance each quarter. That's the equivalent of the entire population of the City of Santa Fe.

## SERVING THE MOST VULNERABLE IN NORTHERN NEW MEXICO

The Food Depot serves those who do not have sufficient income to meet basic needs. Even with a working adult in the family, many face difficult choices every day, forced to choose between buying food or medicine or paying their utility bills.



Of the households The Food Depot serves through its partner agencies, 89% have an income of less than \$20,000 per year, and 53% have at least one working adult in the family.

The Food Depot accepts food and financial donations from both individuals and businesses—such as grocery stores, growers, and small manufacturers—and then distributes the food through its partner agencies. The food bank provides more than 430,000 meals per month to people in need.
