Dear City Councilors, Mayor Gonzales and City Manager:

The 2016 New Mexico Legislative Session has concluded. The session was dominated largely by two issues: the state's budget woes as a result of decreased oil and gas revenues on which the state is so dependent; and legislation dealing with the state's compliance with the Real ID Act. There was also an extensive amount of legislation involving criminal sentencing and judicial proceedings. The legislature did pass legislation addressing Real ID, and the legislature also passed a balanced budget as mandated by the Constitution. The Governor has 20 days from the close of the session, until March 9<sup>th</sup>, to sign or veto any legislation that has reached her desk.

The following pages show the work product put forth by the City lobbying team, it begins with a listing of the City's top priorities via the Council resolution adopted in December. Of those priorities, you will see the various projects that were funded or un-funded. I think it is fair to say, especially given the pressure on capital outlay and the budget, the city did tremendously well but it is your conclusion that matters most. Please note that we were successful in getting three of last year's projects re-authorized for the same intent and that we used the session to position the city's top Water Trust Board priority where the final decision on funding will be made in April. After the priority listing is a summary of the dozens of bills the lobbying team worked on including several that we directly testified on, amended, etc. The Hold Harmless legislation really never got off the ground during the session. The team did work on amending Veteran's Cemetery language to insure that the city was first paid its money in HB 185. We also testified against the many provisions in the Regional Water System bill which our Water Department had concerns about. That legislation died in the committee in which we testified. Neither the Curfew bill nor the Police Return to Work passed the legislature. Please see the complete list at the end of the report.

As usual, the City of Santa Fe Day was a tremendous success. It is important to note that any successes of the lobbying team are attributable to an entire team effort that begins with the excellent coordination by the City Manager and extends to almost your entire City Staff who participates at one point or another in the legislative process. I would like to extend a special thanks to Celeste Valentine who serves as the point person for nearly all our communication needs. I want to make sure and thank the Council and the Mayor for all of your hard work and finally, I can't say enough about the support we receive from the entire Santa Fe delegation towards the city's best interests and priorities.
