### ITEM

The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) has appropriated \$1,562,515 to the City of Santa Fe in FY 2013 operating assistance for Santa Fe Trails.

Operating assistance grants from FTA require a 50 percent local match. Thus, the total eligible cost is \$3,125,030. The local match will come from the ¼ percent gross receipts tax to support public transportation in Santa Fe.

Due to early uncertainty in appropriations under the new transportation legislation (MAP-21), the City of Santa Fe had originally received only 50 percent of its FY 2013 allocation. When the full appropriation was released late in 2013, staff simply amended the grant to include the new funds and did not obtain formal approval for the amended amount from City Council. Thus, we are seeking formal approval at this time, so that Finance may load the budget and we may expend the funds.

### ACTION REQUESTED

Recommend to the Finance Committee to approve the grant application for FY 2013 Section 5307 Urbanized Area funds in the amount of \$1,562,515 to support the operations of Santa Fe Trails; and a corresponding budget increase in the amount of \$1,562,515 to Business Unit/Line Item 51400.490550 (U.S. Dept. of Transportation) for the grant funds.
