11 ESTABLISHING CITY OF SANTA FE LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES, BY CITY COUNCIL
12 DISTRICT, FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE NEW MEXICO STATE LEGISLATURE
13 DURING THE 52ND LEGISLATURE - STATE OF NEW MEXICO - FIRST SESSION, 2015.

15 WHEREAS, the 60 day session of the 2015 Legislative Session begins on January 20, 2015;
16 and

17 WHEREAS, on August 13, 2014 the Governing Body adopted Resolution 2014-67 which
18 established the 2016-2020 Infrastructure Capital Improvements Plan (2016-2020 ICIP) and priorities
19 for the financing of City of Santa Fe public capital projects; and

20 WHEREAS, the Governing Body desires to establish City of Santa Fe legislative priorities,
21 by City Council district, to be considered by the State Legislature based on the 2016-2020 ICIP; and

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE
23 CITY OF SANTA FE that the Governing Body hereby establishes the following legislative funding
24 priorities for consideration by the New Mexico Legislature, during the 2015 Legislative Session.

25 Section 1. Funding is requested, in the total amount of \$1,678,000, for the following

1 **City Council District 2 ICIP projects, as identified in the City's 2016-2020 ICIP:**

2 **A. Project:** Fort Marcy Complex

3 **Amount Requested:** \$378,000

4 **Project Description:** To renovate and repair existing facility to include
5 stucco and paint exterior, tile locker rooms, roof drain repairs, new weight
6 room roof, new gym floor, new equipment.

7 **B. Project:** West Alameda Street

8 **Amount Requested:** \$500,000

9 **Project Description:** Complete design and construction of drainage and
10 widening safety improvements to address flooding and provide pedestrian
11 facilities.

12 **C. Project Description:** City Hall Improvements

13 **Amount Requested:** \$800,000

14 **Project Description:** To construct renovations to City Hall.

15 **Section 2. Funding is requested, in the total amount of \$1,420,000, for the following**

16 **City Council District 2, ICIP projects, as identified in the City's 2016-2020 ICIP.**

17 **A. Project:** Water History Park & Museum

18 **Amount Requested:** \$1,000,000

19 **Project Description:** Construction of park.

20 **B. Project:** Canyon Road Street Lighting

21 **Amount Requested:** \$350,000

22 **Project Description:** Placement of street lights and all related infrastructure
23 on Canyon Road from Paseo de Peralta to Palace Avenue.

24 **Project:** Salvador Perez Pool

25 **Amount Requested:** \$70,000

1 **Project Description:** To renovate, repair, replace and make improvements
2 such as: replace floor in community room, replace hand dryers in locker
3 room. Install new lockers in locker rooms. Purchase and install
4 compress/mechanical software alert and control system for pools.

5 **Section 3. Funding is requested, in the total amount of \$2,500,000, for the following**
6 **City Council District 3, ICIP projects, as identified in the City's 2016-2020 ICIP.**

7 **A. Project:** Calle Po Ae Pi Extension

8 **Amount Requested:** \$250,000

9 **Project Description:** Design, construct and acquire acquisition to include
10 archaeological and environmental clearance improvements to provide right
11 of way roadway connection of two major streets.

12 **B. Project:** Agua Fria/South Meadows Intersection Improvements

13 **Amount Requested:** \$100,000

14 **Project Description:** Design ROW and construction of improvements to
15 Agua Fria and South Meadows intersection which includes left turn lane.

16 **C. Project:** Zona Teen Center

17 **Amount Requested:** \$2,150,000

18 **Project Description:** A 5,000 sq. ft. building to include construction of
19 teen center, children's museum, YMCA, parking, park, equipment and
20 furnishings.

21 **Section 4. Funding is requested, in the total amount of \$650,000, for the following**
22 **City Council District 4, ICIP projects, as identified in the City's 2016-2020 ICIP.**

23 **A. Project:** La Farge Library Renovations

24 **Amount Requested:** \$350,000

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Project Description: To plan, design and construct improvements at the La Farge Library to include items such as: ADA improvements, new roof, new boiler system, various upgrades to tile, painting, interior/exterior renovations.

B. Project: Rodeo Arena

Amount Requested: \$200,000

Project Description: Planning, designing and construction for an enclosed rodeo arena and disaster relief facility.

C. Project: Traffic Calming Improvements

Amount Requested: \$100,000

Project Description: To plan, design and construct traffic calming for various streets within the city of Santa Fe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk is directed to forward a copy of this resolution to the City of Santa Fe lobbyist and the City of Santa Fe State Legislative Delegation.
