Dear City Councilors, Mayor Gonzales and City Manager:

The 2015 New Mexico Legislative Session has adjourned. Your Lobbying team was very successful in attaining most goals set prior to the Legislative Session. The following report highlights important action taken on our various initiatives. The various descriptive text which references bills will have a blue highlight and be underlined as a link so that you can easily see the legislation and the verbal report is followed by all bills tracked with link access to the legislation. The Governor has until April 10, 2015 to sign, veto or pocket veto any legislation. I look forward to giving you and the Council a verbal report on April 1<sup>st</sup>.

**Please Note: The New Mexico State Senate Failed to Adopt the House Amendments to the Capital Outlay Bill and thus, SB 159 has failed to pass the Legislature.**

**City Capital Outlay Priorities [\(SB 159\)](#)**

The City of Santa Fe did extremely well on capital outlay. The City Lobbying team had direct impact on the \$880k received towards our Number One priority (Citywide Health and Safety Infrastructure) and the \$670,450 received towards Citywide Senior Center Projects for a Total of \$1,653,450 received connected to direct priorities. Please see chart on following pages. While these are confirmed appropriations for the City, legislation ([HB 578](#)) also passed which “authorizes” various Water projects to potentially be funded by the Water Trust Board in April including three for the City of Santa Fe. The City Lobbying team took advantage of the Authorization Phase of the Water Trust Board Funding Cycle to lobby the City’s interests regarding these three projects. This Lobbying Process will continue through the Water Trust Board Funding Cycle that gets completed in April. The amounts and project descriptions are listed on the following page.

The City of Santa Fe Lobbying team also worked to capture \$250,000 of general fund monies in [House Bill 2](#) for the City’s Resolution supporting an appropriation for the NM Grown Fresh Fruits and Vegetables for School Meals initiative.

**Hold Harmless Legislation**

All Hold Harmless Legislation failed during the Session including reinstatement of the Food Tax ([SB 274](#)). The Governor was never going to sign the legislation which doomed it amongst other items. [SB 101](#) seemingly received the most consideration but in the end, no legislation was diverse enough to encompass all the unique issues and needs of 108 municipalities and 33 counties. The other Hold Harmless legislation that failed is [\(SB 266\)](#), which excluded certain counties from Hold Harmless distribution reduction if the county’s GRT did not increase.

**Water**

[SB 550](#) Regional Water Authority died in Committee.  
[SB 665](#) State Engineer Water Rights’ Authority Never received a Committee Hearing.  
[HB 578](#) Water Project Authorizations Passed and will now await action by the WTB.

**Film Bills**

[HB 216](#) Film Credit Assignment Passed and is awaiting Governor’s signature  
[SB 565](#) Film Production Tax Credits that would expand availability of SF facilities to be used for tax credit purposes passed and is awaiting Governor’s signature.

**Pay Day Loans**

Related to City Resolutions, several bills introduced: all died.

**Renewable Energy Bills**

Several Bills introduced. The particular bill favorably related to City Resolution, [HB 111](#), was tabled early in the session. Senator Wirth’s

**Santa Fe Prevention Alliance**

The City Lobbying team worked on several bills with the Alliance this session.

**Uber Transportation Legislation**

The City reviewed [HB 272](#) and [SB 385](#) which are Companion Bills to ensure that the City still had business licensure and taxation authority. Both bills died in Committee.

### HB272 - TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANY SERVICES ACT

**Sponsor:** [Rep. Youngblood R-Dist. 68](#) (Bernalillo County)

**Summary:** Proposes the Transportation Network Company Services Act, whose stated purpose is to ensure the safety, reliability and cost-effectiveness of transportation network company services and to preserve and enhance access to transportation options. The act is to be administered and governed exclusively by the PRC. Sets forth a thoroughgoing framework for the regulation of transportation network companies.

### HB442 - TELECOMMUNICATIONS SAFEGUARDS ACT

**Sponsor:** [Rep. Baldonado R-Dist. 8](#) (Valencia County)

**Summary:** Prohibits municipalities from directly or indirectly offering telecommunications, broadband or cable or satellite video services to customers, except in unserved areas that are defined as one or more contiguous census blocks within a municipality where at least nine out of ten households lack access to minimum broadband service or video service.

### SB101 - GROSS RECEIPTS & HOLD HARMLESS TAX CHANGES

**Sponsor:** [Sen. Steven P. Neville R-Dist. 2](#) (San Juan County)

**Summary:** SCORC substitute for SB101, like the original bill, reduces the gross receipts tax from five and one-eighth percent to four and seven-eighths percent.

### **SB159 - SEVERANCE TAX BOND PROJECTS**

**Summary:** Authorizes the issuance of severance tax bonds and fund balances to support funding for 172 capital outlay projects by state agencies, colleges and universities, court projects, scenic railroad, and for building renovations, land acquisition, state parks, forest thinning, water rights settlement, river and stream restoration, and to purchase various types of equipment, school busses and vehicles.

### **SB266 - EXCLUDE CERTAIN COUNTIES FROM HOLD HARMLESS**

**Sponsor:** [Sen. Munoz D-Dist. 4](#) (McKinley & San Juan Counties)

**Summary:** Allows the hold harmless distribution to a county to continue undiminished if the county's gross receipts tax base grows on average less than 11.7% annually from July 1, 2014.

### **SB274 - HOLD HARMLESS & FOOD DEDUCTION CHANGES**

**Sponsor:** [Sen. J.A. Smith D-Dist. 35](#) (Dona Ana, Hidalgo & Luna Counties)

**Summary:** Proposes a complex bill to eliminate the food hold harmless distribution to municipalities and counties, allow municipalities and counties to impose local option taxes on retail food sales, increase the working family personal income tax credit, cut the state gross receipts tax from 5.125% to 5% and repeal currently authorized municipal and county local option hold harmless gross receipts taxes.

**Summary:** Allows the film production company eligible to receive a film production tax credit to assign it to a financial institution. Taxation and Revenue Department would direct the tax credit amount to the financial institution instead of the film production company.

# Appendix

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## **City Statutory Legislation**

All of these resolutions were identical to NMML resolutions. Typically, the NMML would introduce legislation but they have not. Their reasoning is that the legislation would interfere with their number one priority (re-instate food tax). The City has been in a difficult position in that if we were to directly introduce the legislation, all the pressure for such legislation would fall to our SF delegation putting them in the tax increase position but also nearly dooming the legislation from the outset because of lack of geographic diversity in sponsorship. In negotiations with the NMML, we were initially told that if by mid-way in the session, the Food Tax bill had not adequately advanced, that our secondary strategy of at least introducing a Memorial for Municipal Comprehensive Tax Reform (2014-45) would be addressed so that we could address the “big picture” in the interim. As it turns out, the Memorial Strategy for Interim Comprehensive Tax Reform would have been a good one as all Hold Harmless Bills failed to make any headway during the session.
