16 WHEREAS, Subsection 7-4.2 SFCC 1987 created the City of Santa Fe Residential Green  
17 Building Code (“RGBC”); and

18 WHEREAS, included in the RGBC is the Home Energy Rating Systems (“HERS”) which  
19 calculates a number whose main reference point is 100 – the lower the number, the more energy  
20 efficient the home; and

21 WHEREAS, the Water Efficiency Rating Score (“WERS”), created by the Green Building  
22 Coalition in cooperation with Build Green New Mexico, Santa Fe Home Builders Association and  
23 members of the City of Santa Fe Water Conservation Commission is a software-based program that  
24 measures how efficiently a home uses water in a similar manner as the HERS measures energy use;

1           **WHEREAS**, the City of Santa Fe recognizes that the changing climate will result in  
2 increasing pressures on our water supply due to extended droughts and increased risk of wildfire in  
3 the watersheds where our surface water comes from; and

4           **WHEREAS**, the City's Water Division is preparing a long range water supply plan that  
5 anticipates increased pressures on our future water supplies; and

6           **WHEREAS**, water conservation is a strategy to relieve anticipated pressures on our water  
7 systems; and

8           **WHEREAS**, the Governing Body desires to amend the RGBC administrative procedures to  
9 include the WERS for new and existing homes in an effort to conserve water resources.

10           **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE**  
11 **CITY OF SANTA FE** that staff is directed to work with the Santa Fe Area Home Builders  
12 Association to incorporate the water efficiency rating system ("WERS") into the residential green  
13 building code and related administrative procedures.

**Section B. Summary**

Briefly explain the purpose and major provisions of the bill/resolution.

To work with the affected industry group to develop amendments the city's green building code to incorporate water efficiency factors, and to develop administrative procedures to implement the new provisions. This FIR addresses likely impacts of adopting and implementing the new regulations, as well as the full implementation of previously adopted Residential Green Code provisions.

WERS is a rating system for water efficiency that could become a component of the Residential Green Building Code . WERS mostly follows the existing WaterSense program for indoor water use, however, it may be better for quantifying outdoor water use than either BGNM or LEED-H, without requiring significant calculations by a landscape architect. It also gives more weight to graywater and rainwater harvest than most rating.

It may be possible to coordinate development of Water Efficiency Rating System regulations utilizing existing staff. However, implementation of WERS regulations will likely require specialized training and certification for plan review and inspection functions, so an additional FTE will be needed in addition to the ongoing 2 FTE's previously identified for implementation of Green Code provisions that have already been adopted.

The Land Use Department identified the need for 2 new FTE's to fully implement the Residential Green Code in 2009 and remodel amendments approved in 2014: one FTE for a building plans examiner and one FTE for a construction inspector, plus additional first year non-recurring expenses for training, texts, equipment and one vehicle.

However, when the number of building permits declined during the economic downturn, a decision was made to use existing staff rather than expand. Since the number and valuation of residential building permits – and especially residential new construction permits – have returned to pre-recession levels in calendar year 2014, the staffing needs identified in the original FIR's are again applicable.

The proposed amendment would add water efficiency provisions to the city's Residential Green Building Code, which applies to new residential construction and certain residential remodel projects. It would slightly expand the scope of the existing regulations, but would not conflict with other city regulations. It is possible that existing regulations for xeriscaping and irrigation water management would be duplicated.

If WERS regulations are not developed and adopted, the existing residential green code would remain in place without provisions to address efficient residential water use.

The WERS regulations, if adopted, would likely add some cost to addition and remodel projects. Water savings would likely offset some of the initial costs, however, and water savings would provide various benefits to the community. WERS would likely result in much more water-efficient home building standards, thereby improving water conservation.
