## LEGISLATIVE SUMMARY

**BILL NO. 2015-5**

### **Youth League – Keep Santa Fe Beautiful Events**

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**SPONSOR(S):** Councilors Dominguez and Dimas

**SUMMARY:** The attached substitute bill relates to youth league fees for use of City sports fields and proposes to amend Subsections 23-4.13 and 23-7.5 SFCC 1987 to require youth league representatives to participate in the Keep Santa Fe Beautiful (KSFB) cleanup events in exchange for the reduced youth league fees the city offers.

At the January 12, 2015 Public Works Committee, the Committee had concerns about the language regarding “league representatives” attending the events and what that meant. In an effort to clarify the language, staff is recommending the following amendments:

- Require “adult” representatives from each league to attend the KSFB events; and
- Require the leagues to encourage youth participants to attend the KSFB events.

An additional amendment to the bill includes the same amendment to Subsection 23-7.5 which regulates the use of sports fields at the Municipal Recreation Complex. Legislative staff inadvertently left this out of the original bill.

Staff has prepared the attached substitute bill which reflects the above.

AN ORDINANCE

RELATING TO YOUTH LEAGUE FEES FOR USE OF CITY SPORTS FIELDS;  
AMENDING SUBSECTIONS 23-4.13 AND 23-7.5 SFCC 1987 TO REQUIRE YOUTH  
LEAGUE REPRESENTATIVES TO PARTICIPATE IN THE KEEP SANTA FE  
BEAUTIFUL CLEANUP EVENTS IN EXCHANGE FOR THE REDUCED YOUTH LEAGUE  
FEES THE CITY OFFERS AND MAKING SUCH OTHER GRAMMATICAL AND  
TYPOGRAPHICAL CHANGES AS ARE NECESSARY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE:

Section 1. Subsection 23-4.13 SFCC 1987 (being Ord. #2013-26 §6) is amended to  
read:

**23-4.13 City Sports Fields; League and School Fees; Requirements.**

A. *Applicability.* This section shall apply to the following City of Santa Fe sports fields:

- (1) Alto Park;
- (2) Ashbaugh Park;
- (3) Fort Marcy Park (ball field);

- (4) Franklin Miles Park;
- (5) Herb Martinez Park;
- (6) Larragoite Park;
- (7) Magers Field;
- (8) Monica Lucero Park;
- (9) Patrick Smith Park;
- (10) Ragle Park;
- (11) Salvador Perez Park;
- (12) Sweeney School (soccer field);
- (13) Villa Linda Park; and
- (14) Wood Gormley School (soccer field).

B. *League Fees.* For use of the city of Santa Fe sports fields identified in paragraph A.,  
above:

(1) Youth league, including a school, means a non-profit entity that organizes and runs programs for youth, up to the age of eighteen (18), for any sport or recreation activity.

(a) Each youth league and school shall be assessed a one hundred dollar (\$100.00) permit fee per season, per sport or recreation activity.

(b) Each youth league and school shall provide adult representatives from their respective league and school to participate in ~~[an annual sports field clean-up day(s) organized by the City of Santa Fe. The details of the sports field clean-up day(s), including the dates, location and manner of tracking participation by the leagues and schools shall be adopted by separate resolution of the governing body]~~ the Great American Spring Cleanup and the Toss No Mas Fall Cleanup events hosted by Keep Santa Fe Beautiful. Each league shall encourage youth participants to attend

1           the Keep Santa Fe Beautiful events.

2           (2)     Adult league means a non-profit entity that organizes and runs programs for  
3 adults, over the age of eighteen (18), for a season, for any sport or recreation activity. Each  
4 adult league shall be assessed the following fees, per season, and such fees are inclusive of  
5 one end of season tournament:

6                   (a)     Twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) fee per player, necessary to field a team  
7 according to each individual league; and

8                   (b)     Twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) fee for one (1) alternate player per team.

9           (3)     League fees collected pursuant to this section shall be deposited into a  
10 dedicated sports field maintenance fund to be used in conjunction with annual budgeted  
11 sports field maintenance amounts from the general fund.

12           C.     *Tournament Fees.* The city shall assess a tournament fee of twenty-five dollars  
13 (\$25.00) per team, per tournament, for the use of city of Santa Fe sports fields. This paragraph does  
14 not apply to season adult league tournaments specified in paragraph B., above.

15           D.     *Requirements.*

16                   (1)     On an annual basis, beginning in January, each league and school shall  
17 submit a letter of request to the city that specifies the:

18                           (a)     Type of sport;

19                           (b)     Number of participants and age groups being served;

20                           (c)     Estimated number of days and hours needed for field use for the  
21 season;

22                           (d)     Mission and goals of the league or school; and

23                           ([f]e)    General yearly budget that includes a general statement of financial  
24 condition of the league.

25                           ([g]f)    If applicable, the number of scholarships distributed for sports

1 registration fees for the year before, and the estimated number of scholarships for  
2 sports registration fees available for the current year.

3 (2) Each league and school shall include with the letter of request, the following  
4 documents:

5 (a) Statement that reflects the general financial standing of the league or  
6 school that is applicable to the sports league from:

7 (i) A certified public accountant; or

8 (ii) The national organization which the league or school  
9 belongs to; or

10 (iii) The tax returns of the league or school;

11 (b) Code of conduct; and

12 (c) Bylaws or other document demonstrating how the league or school  
13 was organized and operates.

14 (3) Each youth league shall provide the parent(s) or guardian(s) of the participant  
15 the following documents:

16 (a) Copy of the league or school's letter of request to the city, with  
17 supporting documents;

18 (b) Summary of the city's costs to maintain each sports field, which  
19 shall be provided by the city to each league and school; and

20 (c) Copy of educational material provided by the city related to the  
21 disposal of solid waste and recycling which outlines the leagues and schools  
22 responsibility to dispose of solid waste and promote recycling.

23 (4) All leagues and schools shall be responsible, on an as-used basis, for clean-  
24 up of trash and litter directly related to their use of a sports field. The clean-up shall include  
25 proper separation of recyclables from trash.

1           E.       *Noncompliance.* A league or school that does not comply with the requirements of  
2 Section ~~[23-4.12]~~ 23-4.13 SFCC 1987 shall not be granted a permit to use city sports fields or the  
3 league or school permit may be suspended.

4           F.       *Priority of Use of City Sports Fields, Other Than the MRC Sports Fields.* City sports  
5 fields shall be prioritized for youth league and school use.

6           **Section 2.       Subsection 23-7.5 SFCC 1987 (being Ord. #2013-26, as amended) is**  
7 **amended to read:**

8           **23-7.5           MRC Sports Fields; Fees; Requirements; Priority for Use.**

9           A.       *Youth League Fees.* Youth league, including a school, means a non-profit entity that  
10 organizes and runs programs for youth, up to the age of eighteen (18), for any sport or recreation  
11 activity.

12                   (1)       Each youth league and school shall be assessed a one hundred dollar  
13 (\$100.00) permit fee per season, per sport or recreation activity.

14                   (2)       Each youth league and school shall provide adult representatives from their  
15 respective league and school to participate in ~~[an annual sports field clean up day(s)~~  
16 ~~organized by the City of Santa Fe. The details of the sports field clean up day(s), including~~  
17 ~~the dates, location and manner of tracking participation by the leagues and schools shall be~~  
18 ~~adopted by separate resolution of the governing body]~~ the Great American Spring Cleanup  
19 and the Toss No Mas Fall Cleanup events hosted by Keep Santa Fe Beautiful. Each league  
20 shall encourage youth participants to attend the Keep Santa Fe Beautiful events.

21           B.       *Adult League Fees.* Adult league means a non-profit entity that organizes and runs  
22 programs for adults over the age of eighteen (18) years old for a season, for any sport or recreation  
23 activity. Each adult league shall be assessed the following fees, per season, and such fees are  
24 inclusive of one end of season tournament:

25                   (1)       Twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) fee per player, necessary to field a team

1 according to each individual league; and

2 (2) Twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) fee for one (1) alternate player per team.

3 C. *Tournament Fees.* The city shall assess a tournament fee of twenty-five dollars  
4 (\$25.00) per team, per tournament, for the use of City of Santa Fe sports fields at the MRC. This  
5 paragraph does not apply to season adult league tournaments specified in paragraph B., above.

6 D. *League Requirements.*

7 (1) On an annual basis, beginning in January, each league and school shall  
8 submit a letter of request to the city that specifies the:

9 (a) Type of sport;

10 (b) Number of participants and age groups being served;

11 (c) Estimated number of days and hours needed for field use for the  
12 season;

13 (d) Mission and goals of the league or school; and

14 (f) General yearly budget that includes a general statement of financial  
15 condition of the league.

16 (g) If applicable, the number of scholarships distributed for sports  
17 registration fees for the year before, and the estimated number of scholarships for  
18 sports registration fees available for the current year.

14 (4) All leagues and schools shall be responsible, on an as-used basis, for clean-  
15 up of trash and litter directly related to their use of a sports field. The clean-up shall include  
16 proper separation of recyclables from trash.

17 E. *Priority of Use of MRC Sports Fields.*


18 (1) MRC sports fields shall be prioritized for adult leagues with youth league use  
19 scheduled pursuant to paragraph (2) below.

20 (2) When other city sports fields are unavailable to accommodate youth leagues  
21 or youth tournaments, on a particular day, weekend or week, and the MRC fields are not  
22 scheduled for use for that particular day, weekend or week, then the MRC fields may be  
23 made available to provide a field for such event at a pro-rated MRC fee.

24 F. *Noncompliance.* A league or school that does not comply with the requirements of  
25 Section 23-7 SFCC 1987 shall not be granted a permit to use sports fields at the MRC or the league or

1 school permit may be suspended.

Councilor Bushee asked how much of a space increase this is.

Mr. O'Reilly explained that this upper deck does not exist yet. It is only the part of the building that overhangs.

Councilor Bushee noted the lease term is 5 years with up to 3 additional 5-year terms. She asked how they would account for cost increases along the way.

Mr. O'Reilly said it was built into the lease for each 5-year term under the rent section, Section 4. It is an annual consideration at the beginning of the year based on CPIU with a minimum of 2.5%.

Councilor Bushee asked if they had put in a monetary valuation.

Mr. Richard Thompson apologized that he didn't know what the previous fee was and agreed that he would get the value of the waiver for her.

Councilor Bushee asked if a no-show fee was built in.

Mr. Thompson said he would not object to that. He explained that the amendment was the City's intent was not to interrupt the play of the youth leagues by denying them the permit and found a way to get additional support for Keep Santa Fé Beautiful.

Councilor Bushee said she wasn't opposed to the concept but wanted to figure out how they were going to make it happen.

Mr. Pino said Ms. Gilda Montaña could give the Committee a perspective from Santa Fé Beautiful. This all stems from letting the fee go. Their exchange was to participate in clean-up - once in the spring and once in the fall but they were all no-shows.

Councilor Bushee reasoned that the City was back to where we maybe need to change the ordinance to say they would be charged if they didn't participate.

Ms. Montaña said the ordinance does say if they don't show up they will be charged the fee. When they come they have to come and register the day of the event. She keeps track of it for the Parks Division of who does show up that way.

Councilor Bushee asked how many events had been held since this waiver was in place.

Ms. Montaña this will be the first. The way it was done before was that staff would be there to see who was showing up to participate and ended up doing all the work because nobody from the league showed up. Now Santa Fé Beautiful is managing the event and requires registration so if they didn't, they would be charged a fee.

Councilor Bushee asked if the City will be able to collect that fee. The waiver was established because the City was having a hard time collecting the fees.

Ms. Melissa Byers noted on page 4 the noncompliance clause that said if they do not comply with the requirements "shall not be granted a permit to use the field."

Councilor Bushee asked if that was something we could do.

Mr. Pino thought they should be able to do it. Any team that does not get a permit falls further down the priority list for field usage.

Chair Trujillo asked if there was a percentage of people that had to help.

Ms. Montaña said there was no percentage. It was up to the league president to get people out there.

Chair Trujillo asked if they could just send one person. If they did, then staff would end up cleaning up the whole park again.

Ms. Montaña said they would also be keeping track of what is cleaned up.

Chair Trujillo wanted to know how many showed up from each league.

Ms. Montaña said their forms asked how many participants were present.

Councilor Rivera pointed out the City has gone from a fee to having them clean up themselves and that has not worked. He asked how she would get in touch with the "out of season" leagues who were not active on those two clean-up days.

Ms. Montaño said there is a league meeting on January 27<sup>th</sup> for all league presidents. They will all be notified to be there and of the requirement to participate in clean-up. So they will be aware.

Councilor Rivera asked if they had one or two kids show up who play baseball and football and soccer whether those leagues would be exempt from paying any fee.

Ms. Montaño said each league has to participate.

Councilor Rivera asked about those that are in more than one league.

Ms. Montaño thought they could not register in multiple leagues for clean-up.

Ms. Melissa Byers page 2 of the ordinance line 17 says each league and school shall be assessed a \$100 fee. Each league has to participate.

Councilor Rivera if you send a couple of kids who play every sport does that cover each league.

Mr. Pino clarified that one kid shows up and could only declare for one league.

Ms. Brennan thought it seemed to be indistinct. She assumed each league had to contribute its share. The leagues are getting the benefit. Following the logic of the intention was not clear.

Councilor Rivera was not sure this would work but was willing to try. There were holes in it.

Ms. Brennan said each league has to make a contribution. One league per kid.

Chair Trujillo agreed that should happen. The person registering would have to ask what league are they were cleaning for and choose one.

Ms. Montaño said they should have a representative for each league.

Chair Trujillo saw where it states that and felt they were covered there.

Councilor Rivera asked which schools use the fields

Mr. Thompson was not sure which ones did but it was limited use. The schools have other fields. In the ordinance, the wording says all leagues. And it does say "representatives" which is plural. He could make minor changes in the wording. The intent is to keep the kids playing and the leagues to provide value to the City.

Councilor Rivera not sure a percentage would work. Based on last year

Chair Trujillo commented that the league officers need to know their responsibilities and what happens if they don't show up. It is part of enforcement.

Ms. Brennan said it seemed the ordinance needs to provide the equities for when this goes to Finance.

Councilor Dimas didn't think they could ever answer all the "what if" questions. But this is worth the chance we are taking because it is worthwhile. If it doesn't work, it doesn't work and we go back to the drawing board. The idea is a good one and good for our youth.

Councilor Bushee wondered what happened to the day when the leagues got together to raise funds for fees. She was uncertain about this.

Councilor Rivera said all the leagues give scholarships to those who could not afford fees. Maybe the City should get scholarship players to participate. It might be a way for them to earn the scholarship.

Chair Trujillo asked if they were talking about putting this facility facing Siler Road. He asked if Councilor Bushee was talking about the other area.
