Biography

Clara Padilla Andrews, Owner/Publisher

El Hispanic News

El Hispanic News, founded in 1981 by Juan Prats, is the oldest Hispanic publication in the Pacific Northwest, and continues to be a leading source of information for the Latino community. Padilla and Associates, LLC purchased the publication in 1995. *El Hispanic News* is Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) and Women Business Enterprise (WBE) certified. *El Hispanic News* has assisted many partners in reaching a community that is not reached through mainstream media outlets and continues to be the primary source for corporate America and local and state government agencies to effectively advertise to the Hispanic market. *El Hispanic News* is dedicated to accountability, both to our readers and our advertisers. To that end, we are regularly audited by the Circulation Verification Council (CVC), an independent, third-party Audit Company that specializes in community newspapers, shoppers, magazines, and niche publications.

Más New Mexico

After careful consideration, the New Mexico Hispanic population, with its long history and continued growth and after much research, Clara was convinced of the need for a quality bilingual media source to keep the Hispanic community informed on local, state, national and international news. *Más New Mexico* will be utilized to educate and inform the multi-generational community on issues as they relate to health, education, housing, arts & entertainment, immigration, politics, the economy, business, opinion, community leaders and organization. The inaugural for *Más New Mexico* was January 7, 2009 and celebrated by a reception at the National Hispanic Cultural Center. *Más New Mexico* is a weekly bilingual publication Newspaper distributed in Albuquerque and Santa Fe.

Business Skills

- The Padilla Family raised their children in Los Padillas Community where Ms. Andrews's parents established a small grocery store and Clara being one of the eldest established her business skills. Ms. Andrews credits her father Julian Padilla Sr., for teaching her sales and business skills.
- For the period, 1965 to 1971 Ms. Andrews was the Cosmetics Department Manager and Buyer for major department stores in Los Angeles, California and finally in Albuquerque New Mexico with the responsibility for the overall operation of the Cosmetics Department, including the wholesale purchase of products, analyzing purchase agreements, supervising personnel, conducting product promotions, preparing budgets, preparation and placement of advertising.
- For the period, 1972 to 1981 Ms. Andrews and her brother, Julian Padilla Jr., owned and operated a Real Estate Agency with approximately 25 sales agents. Ms. Andrews is a licensed New Mexico Real Estate broker. As a family owned business I over saw the day to day activities of the company, including branding, motivational workshops for the agents, and including strategic development.
- In 1981, Ms Andrews was elected to the office of New Mexico Secretary of New Mexico serving her 4-year term during 1982 to 1986. She was responsible for the overall operation of the Secretary of State's office. Administered state laws pertaining to the State Election Code, the Uniform Commercial Code, Notaries Public, Tradename/Trademark registrations, the Executive Record, lobbyist registration and expenditure report filing, campaign reports and conflict of interest filings; formulated legislation for introduction and sought passage of legislation related to the operation of the Secretary of State's office; monitored legislation and lobbying for or against any legislation affecting the Secretary of State's office. As Secretary of State Clara was a member of the Public Employment Retirement Service (PERS) and served on the Board of Directors of the National Association of Secretary of States.

- From 1991 to 1996, Clara served as a Community and Family Services Integration of Services Supervisor and the Hispanic Services Coordinator for Multnomah County in Portland, Oregon. Duties included, but were not limited to, the following: liaison between the County and the Hispanic Community within Multnomah County. Monitor and evaluate programs, which have a direct impact on Hispanics in order to assure full compliance and access (i.e., Housing, Employment, Health, Judicial, Correction, and Law Enforcement). Building partnerships between public and private sector where appropriate in order to support Hispanic needs or concerns, promoting a strong community police program with Portland's Chief of Police, fundraising, and recruiting sponsors to fund the programs.

One of the needs within the Hispanic community in the state of Oregon was affordable housing. Clara brought together a small group of business people and formed a not for profit community development organization, Hacienda Community Development. The first project included 187 housing unit which needed renovation. Hacienda CDC bought the apartment and developed them and brought on site social service, community policing and a community health clinic. Fundraising was a major role in the development of this project. The 187 housing units were named after Clara for her efforts and are called Villa de Clara Vista (Clara's Vision).

National Board of Directors:

Ms. Andrews is serving on the Board of Directors for five national Hispanic organizations. These organizations are MANA, A National Latina Organization, National Hispanic Leadership Agenda (NHLA), and Secretary of Hispanic Association Corporate Responsibility (HACR), immediate past President of the National Association of Hispanic Publications (NAHP), International Hispanic Meeting Planners and President National Hispanic Press Foundation. She is also former board member of the National Marrow Donor Foundation and the National Kidney Foundation.

Sponsorship and Fundraising

Clara's fundraising efforts began at a very young age, when she was helping local candidates running for public office. As a candidate herself she had to fundraise and was instrumental in sponsoring successful events. She has fundraised and brought in major sponsors for some of the special projects and organizations she is involved or founded. Corporations recruited as sponsors included State Farm Insurance, McDonalds, Coca Cola, Microsoft, General Motors, Ford, Goya, Sprint, AT&T, Wal-Mart, Anheuser-Busch, Miller Coors, United Health, Home Depot, Univision, Telemundo, AARP, US Army, Continental, Southwest Airlines, Kraft Foods, Walt Disney and Verizon. In Portland, Oregon worked closely with Portland Development Commission to help fund housing projects. Ms Andrews served as Vice President of the Portland Guadalajara Sister Cities; she was instrumental in recruiting funding for their programs, including one of the largest Cinco de Mayo events at Portland's Water Front.

Promotion of Status of Women and Diversity

As the sole owner and publisher of *El Hispanic News*, Ms. Andrews has served to promote women and minority-owned business and highlight issues at the forefront of their communities. When Ms. Andrews also served as New Mexico's Secretary of State she was the highest-ranking Latina public official in the nation at the time. She received much recognition for her accomplishments including the Congressional Hispanic Caucus Institute Distinguished Service Award in 1986 and has been recognized as one of the Top 100 Influential Hispanics in the United States. Ms Andrews has served in various boards and commissions including the National Marrow Donor Program, National Kidney foundation, Oregon State Housing Council, Advisory Board Member to the President at Oregon State University and elected as Region National Association of Hispanic Publications, National Hispanic Press Foundation, Hispanic Association for Corporate Responsibility, National Hispanic Leadership Agenda and has chaired or co-chaired the NAHP Hispanic Media Summit in Washington, D.C. for the last ten years.

Commitment to Equity and Diversity

Ms. Andrews has dedicated most of her life to achieving social justice and equity for the underserved communities in New Mexico and Oregon. She is committed to informing and educating the Latino community of the Northwest about important issues that affect their lives daily. She is instrumental in collaborating work with others to initiatives that benefit the Latino and other communities in the Portland Metropolitan region. The Villa de Clara Vista apartment complex with more 187 units has been named for Ms. Andrews' tireless advocacy for housing equity in Northeast Portland. She founded the Hacienda Community Development Corporation, which boasts on-site comprehensive social services, the first of its kind in the nation. The Villa de Clara Vista Apartments and community partnership plan has set a national standard for community comprehensive housing services. In 1997, Congresswoman Elizabeth Furse recognized Ms. Andrews for her numerous community contributions on the floor of the House of Representatives in honor of Hispanic Heritage Month.

Role Model for Women

Ms. Andrews serves as a role model for Latinas and all women. Her tenacity, self-determination, selflessness, and commitment to diversity and her community make her an exceptional role model for women. "For all Oregon women, she has pioneered through politics, business and community activism; no small feat for any Oregon Latina, said commissioner Cruz". She also serves as a mentor to several young Latinas in the Portland area and has received many other awards for her promotion of the status of women. In 2004, Clara recognized Latinas both in the State of Oregon and throughout the nation face many obstacles pertaining to leadership, education, economic development, health, and wellness due to linguistic and cultural differences, as well as race and sex-based stereotypes. Clara organized and founded El Poder de la Mujer in Oregon. The goal of El Poder de la Mujer's Latinas Conference is to empower Latinas with the knowledge and skills to deal with everyday issues. This is the only Latina conference in Oregon and the Pacific Northwest.

In 1984, Ms. Andrews founded Las Amigas de Nuevo Mexico, a women's organization to promote the State of New Mexico. Las Amigas membership is comprised of women throughout from State of New Mexico and they take an annual friendship flight to promote the State of New Mexico. She is also the founder of Más Mujer a Latina organization in the state of New Mexico to promote and advance the educational, economic, leadership and entrepreneurial well being of Latinas in the State of New Mexico.

Personal Data

The Padilla families are pioneers of the Southwest and date back hundreds of years. The Spanish colonists arrived in the North America Southwest before 1590 and Santa Fe, New Mexico was established in 1610 to settle that territory. During that century, seventy miles South of Santa Fe there were several Hispanic families settled in the agricultural land adjoining the Rio Grande River. This community was named "Los Padillas" and was annexed by the City of Albuquerque several years ago. Clara Padilla was born and raised in Los Padilla community, New Mexico. She is the second to the oldest of ten brothers and sisters, daughter of the late Julian and Susana Padilla. She is married to Frank Andrews. Clara has two daughters; Mary married to James Davis and Susannah Tafoya. She has two stepdaughters; Rachel Andrews married to Allan Hardy and Suzanne Andrews. She has seven grand children, Melanic Davis, Stephanie Davis, Daniel Powers, Leila Hope Hardy, Lucia Hardy, Avik Hardy and the late Susannah Maria Gurule.
