



Mark Hogan is the Director of the Santa Fe County Projects Division. He is responsible for the management of a staff of 9 who intern manage between 75 and 100 design and construction projects with an rolling cumulative total value approximating \$82 million dollars. Project types include buildings, roads, utility infrastructure, parks, trails and open space projects.

The Division manages property acquisition for Open Space Projects such as protecting cultural sites in Santa Fe County as well as the efforts currently underway on the Santa Fe River Greenway, a joint effort between the City of Santa Fe and Santa Fe County. The County portion of the project has included Planning, Design, Property Acquisition and Construction of river restoration and trail development from Frenchy's Field to the Waste Water Treatment plant south of highway 599.

Hogan has been active in the practice of Architecture and Planning for over twenty-five years and has worked on a wide range of projects throughout New Mexico and other parts of the country. The diversity of project types include Municipal Buildings, Commercial projects, Retail spaces, Spas and Hotels, Schools, Medical Facilities, Historic Renovation/Restoration work and Custom homes. He also has significant experience in entitlement work related to development projects including planning for neighborhood coordination and public presentations.

Hogan led the design team in developing the City of Santa Fe's 1,260 acre Municipal Recreation Complex, a regional park that includes a twenty seven hole golf course, soccer, softball and baseball fields, equestrian facilities and running trails. He also participated in establishing a working relationship between the City of Santa Fe and the Santa Fe Public Schools to develop park sites and soccer fields on school grounds throughout the city. He has extensive experience in directing public participation programs and the implementation of facility funding strategies.

Hogan is a former 5 year member of Business Capitol District Design Review Committee (BCD-DRC) for the City of Santa Fe. He also served on the City's Business and Quality of Life committee focusing on Economic Development issues and chaired the City of Santa Fe Parks Advisory Committee. During his tenure as chairman of this committee, he coordinated the development of a comprehensive Master Plan for the development and expansion of Santa Fe's parks, recreational and open space.

Hogan served for four years on the Trust for Public Land Regional Advisory Committee. He was appointed to the Santa Fe City/County Highway Corridor Task Force, a 14 month regional planning efforts carried out by the combined interest of the City and the County. The

joint committee established land use patterns and setback standards in the 599/I-25 Highway Corridors. In 1999, Hogan was recognized by the local chapter of the American Institute of Architects for his outstanding service to the City of Santa Fe.

Prior experience includes design and project management at the New York firm of Philip Johnson and John Burgee where he was responsible for design coordination of high rise projects in Atlanta, Cleveland, and the planning development of Port of America, a New Town Project in Prince George County, Maryland.

**A Narrative:**

In August of 1995, while working as an airline stewardess I suffered pesticide poisoning to the extent that I was completely incapacitated. A single large chemical exposure to a pesticide inside an airplane triggered my decline in health and subsequent multiple chemical sensitivities (MCS).

My new reality was one of unrelenting challenges. In the depth of my disability, I could not get out of bed and to converse with anyone was both difficult and frustrating. Words and concepts would escape me as if spoken in an alien language. Tracking what was being said to me was often impossible. My condition continues to be extremely difficult if my immediate environment is in any way chemically compromised.

Alas, I am not alone. The results of a national prevalence study for multiple chemical sensitivity published in *The Journal of Environmental Health* suggests that over ten million Americans are suffering from MCS. My hope is by working with other advocates that discoveries will be made that will make it possible for people like me to live a more normal life.
