Resume

The Rev. Dr. Holly Beaumont has a BA in Pre-law and Secondary Education, and a Masters of Divinity (M. Div.) and Doctor of Ministry (D. Min.) in Social Ethics and Theology. She has also completed her Clinical Pastoral Education (Chaplaincy) Training at the University of Kentucky Regional Center, which serves most of Appalachia. Her Supervised Professional Practices was as a labor coach for the Florence Crittenton Home, and on-call to the labor hall at UK Medical Center where she assisted untrained women with La Maze childbirth techniques.

Rev. Beaumont has lived in New Mexico for almost 30 years. She came to Santa Fe in 1986 to revitalize a small blue collar congregation located two blocks from the Roundhouse. She is co-founder of the Santa Fe Jewish and Christian Dialogue. She advocated for the Anti-Hate Crimes Law and the Human Rights Act passed in 2003, and served on the Coordinating Committee of the Santa Fe Living Wage Network. Her congregation voted to become an Open and Affirming Congregation during her service there. (recognizes full participation regardless of sexual orientation). Her congregation was one of only 35 recognized nationally for Mission and Outreach by the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

After 13 years, she resigned as pastor of First Christian Church to pursue social justice advocacy full-time as a project director for the New Mexico Conference of Churches and served for five years as the first Legislative Advocate for the Conference of Churches.

During that time she worked to pass landmark legislation including in-state tuition for immigrant students, raising the state minimum wage, the anti-police profiling law, the anti-human trafficking bill, repeal of the death penalty, and the anti-wage theft law in 2009. She also worked on national issues including health care reform, ending government sanctioned use of torture, and non-proliferation of nuclear weapons.

In the fall of 2010 she became the Organizing Director of Interfaith Worker Justice - New Mexico which is an affiliate of the national network Interfaith Worker Justice with headquarters on the fourth floor of the Edgewater Presbyterian Church in Chicago. IWJ has a long history of working with hospitals to achieve equitable contracts and benefits for staff, including Ascension Health in Michigan, and Resurrection Health in Illinois, both including leadership from the Catholic Church. (More upon request.)

IWJ-NM played a key role in the successful effort to protect the 2003 law that requires all resident drivers in NM to obtain a license and insurance regardless of their immigration status, and organizing the campaign to end wage theft in New Mexico by educating workers, faith communities, business, law enforcement, labor, civil rights and social service organizations to enforce the 2009 anti-wage theft law. IWJ-NM is working with Attorney General Gary King and the statewide task force to end wage theft in New Mexico.

IWJ-NM brought the Fair Pay for Women Act and the Wage Theft Prevention Act to the 2013 legislative session. The Fair Pay for Women Act passed and was signed into law by Governor Martinez.

Awards and recognition include the Santa Fe Human Rights Alliance Advocate Award, and the Somos Un Pueblo Unido, NAACP-NM, Unitarian Universalist Westside .
