City of Santa Fe has three vacancies on the Santa Fe River Commission

The City of Santa Fe is now accepting applications for three positions (one with voting privileges, two as alternates who participate in discussions and can vote if a voting member is absent) on it's Santa Fe River Commission. The Commission is an advisory group for the City on topics that relate to the management of the river, it's riparian corridor, and the watershed.

The Commission was reconstituted in 2006 to provide advice on various subjects such as the downtown river corridor and River Park (district master plan-financing and implementation), Santa Fe River Fund, repairs and improvements to the river and the arroyos (CIP and GO Bonds), urban watershed health and function, vegetation management, target flow program, treated effluent management plan, and art along the river.

If you have interest and/or professional expertise in water issues and are willing to contribute to the health and well-being of the Santa Fe River, please submit your application. Be expected to dedicate a few hours per month on Commission agenda items and attending the monthly meeting from 6 to 8pm on the second Thursday of each month.
