# ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING August 21, 2014

# 1. CALL TO ORDER

A regular meeting of the Marty Sanchez Links de Santa Fe Advisory Committee was called to order by Maurice Bonal, Chair at 3:03 p.m. on this date at the Marty Sanchez Links de Santa Fe, Administration Building, Santa Fe.

# 2. ROLL CALL

Roll call indicated a quorum was present for conducting official business as follows:

# 3. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

The Agenda was amended: Item#6: (Staff Reports) *Presentation of "Muchas Gracias" Certificate to Gail Bavis* was deleted from the agenda.

Item #6: The Links Bar & Grill-Restaurant Update was deleted from the agenda.

Item #5: Comments from the Chairman were moved down on the agenda.

Item #9: (New Business) Noel Camborde, Nomination of the Friends of the Links Memorial was moved up on the agenda.

Ms. Zingle moved to approve the Agenda as amended. Mr. Lopez seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

# \*9. NEW BUSINESS

# a. Noel Camborde, Nomination for Friends of the Links Memorial

John Shaffer, Ralph Milnes and Tom Zupanc nominated the late Noel Camborde for the Friends of the Links Memorial. Mr. Zupanc noted that Mr. Camborde loved golf and loved playing at the Marty Sanchez Golf Course. He played golf every Monday and Friday for 12 to 15 years.

Mr. Camborde passed away in May 2014 while camping in Yosemite, CA. After his passing, his family donated his left handed clubs to the Marty Sanchez Youth Program. Mr. Camborde was an active instructor at the Santa Fe Ski Basin with the Adaptive Ski Program and volunteered to help anyone in need.

Mr. Zupanc mentioned that Mr. Camborde also worked with the disabled and was also a veteran who served in the US Army (Airborne, Special Forces).

Mr. Lopez said he would like to see a Veterans program here at Marty Sanchez.

In response, Ms. Romero said they are starting a disabled veterans' clinic sometime in September and they are happy to hear any ideas that the Committee may have.

Chair Bonal informed Mr. Zupanc that the nomination will go through the process and will be assigned to the subcommittee and they will get back with Mr. Zupanc.

Ms. Romero noted that they can have two nominations and/or approvals for the Friends of the Links Memorial per year.

# Nomination for Michael Rice for Friends of the Links Memorial

Ms. Romero was asked about the status of the nomination for Michael Rice that was made at the last Committee meeting (in June) and assigned to the subcommittee. Ms. Romero said it was approved by the subcommittee.

Chair Bonal asked why this did not come back to the Committee.

Ms. Romero explained that the Committee did not meet in the month of July due to the lack of a quorum.

Ms. Boggio-Montgomery moved to approve the nomination of Michael Rice for the Friends of the Links Memorial. Mr. Lopez seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Ms. Boggio-Montgomery read a letter from Michael Rice's family thanking the Committee for the nomination.

# 4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

• Meeting of June 19, 2014

Mr. Siegel moved to approve the Minutes of the June 19, 2014 meeting as submitted. Ms. Zingle seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

# \*6. STAFF REPORTS

Marketing - (Advertising updates)

Mr. Lucero reported as follows:

- Staff has been busy working hard on all the new marketing updates for the golf course.

- They have also been updating the website, as well as social media. People can now sign up to get email blasts.
- Staff has been pushing the "Nine and Dine" promotion/special, as well as the volume discount cards they are advertising.
- There is also a new special in effect all government employees can receive a 10% discount on Mondays. This has been approved by the City Manager. This will run through October 31<sup>st</sup>. It also includes a discount of \$1.00 off on the golf balls for the range and 10% off at the Links Bar & Grill.

Chair Bonal suggested that staff consider including veterans with this special.

- Mr. Lucero is working with Jennifer Romero on confirming the advertising vendors for 2014-2015.
- There has been some interest expressed in the possibility of participating with the 2015 Golf Expo in Albuquerque. This will give Marty Sanchez an opportunity to showcase and market Santa Fe and will be good exposure for the golf course.

Ms. Zingle asked when the Golf Expo is.

Mr. Lucero said in February 2015.

- Many radio and TV advertisements have been done on the golf course on Que Suave and the City's radio show, as well as City Hall Live.
- They are also running a commercial on Comcast that is running on all of the major news networks and it will run until October.

Chair Bonal asked if they still have the digital billboards.

Mr. Lucero said no, because it is very expensive, however, maybe in the future.

Chair Bonal asked if the golf price wars that are presently going on are affecting the volume at Marty Sanchez. Mr. Brodsky said no, he did not think so.

# **6. STAFF REPORTS** (continued)

• Administration – (Revenue and golf rounds summary for June and July; Admin. updates)

Copies of the *Marty Sanchez Links de Santa Fe Golf Summary* for July and August were distributed. Copies of the Summaries are incorporated herewith to these Minutes as Exhibit "A".

Ms. Romero reviewed the information from Exhibit "A" as follows:

- Total rounds in golf for the month of July were 5,477, which is down by 171 rounds (3%) when compared to the prior year.
- The total green fees revenue to July was \$93,821; up \$3,933, when compared to the month of July of the prior year. A total of \$605,505 in total green fees revenue, which is up 4% when compared to the prior year.
  - Ms. Romero noted that the green fees revenue includes the punch pass purchases of \$2,147.62.
- Golf cart revenue for the month of July was \$55,457 which is an increase of \$3,304 (6% increase), when compared to the prior year.
- The Pro-Shop revenue for the month of July was \$31,608, which is an increase of \$7,132 when compared to the month of July of the prior year. Overall, the Pro-Shop revenue is up 29% when compared to the prior year.
- The driving range revenue for the month of July was \$10,286, which is an increase of \$53 (a 1% increase), when compared to the prior year.
- The golf tournament revenue for the month of July was \$3,635.

Mr. Lopez said he would like to meet with Jennifer Romero, possibly the Wednesday before the meeting to go over the numbers because he has some questions.

Ms. Romero said she would be happy to do that. She said they would like to continue the Committee meetings while she is on maternity leave. She will be out from September to December 2014. She introduced Vangie Olivas, who will continue the operations of the facility and staff the Committee meetings while Ms. Romero is out on maternity leave.

Ms. Romero distributed copies of the approved FY 2014-2015 Mid-Year Budget. Please see Exhibit "C" for the specifics.

Ms. Zingle asked if there was a finance subcommittee.

Mr. Lopez said he and Jennifer Romero meet but it is not a finance subcommittee. He said Ms. Zingle or any Committee Members could attend the meetings with Ms. Romero. The meetings should not last more than one hour.

Ms. Romero was asked to send out an e-mail to Committee Members about meeting with her before the Committee meeting.

# • Superintendent – (Golf course conditions update)

Mr. Brian Hodges reported as follows:

- Ms. Romero asked Mr. Hodges to come up with a strategy in terms of maintenance and the overall needs of the golf course. At the last Committee meeting, Ms. Zingle asked Mr. Hodges if he could provide a date when he can provide a report to the Committee. Mr. Hodges said he sent Ms. Zingle an email about this and he will share this with the Committee today.
- The entire irrigation system has been programmed and they are now watering every other night and they are going to start adding some fertilization.

Mr. Hodges asked if there were any questions.

Ms. Boggio-Montgomery noted that she has received many complaints that the cart signs are too far back and it slows down the play. She asked if there was any way that they could put these closer.

Mr. Hodges said absolutely.

Mr. Lopez acknowledged Mr. Hodges and his staff for the great job they are doing on the golf course.

Mr. Brodsky mentioned that he has received a lot of feedback that the fairways have shrunk. He asked if it would be possible to widen the fairways over the off-season, when the grass goes dormant.

Mr. Hodges said yes.

Ms. Zingle said the transition from one hole to another can be a bit challenging and possibly they can address this in the future.

Mr. Hodges said his biggest focus for the fall will be bunker drainage but he can definitely address this.

Chair Bonal said maybe we can shorten the bunkers too, possibly eliminating fairway #5. Also, look at getting sand.

- Mr. Hodges reported that they fertilized the Great-28 last Friday and finished fertilizing the golf course. He said he has received a variance from the City to spray herbicide on the ponds and they sprayed these Thursday.
- They are now mowing on Mondays and Fridays.
   Ms. Zingle noted that she has received many compliments on the condition of the golf course, particularly from people who come from out of town.

# • Pro-Shop – (2014 Tournament calendar updates)

[Copies of the Net Detail Sales by Item, Golf Shop reports from July 1, 2014 through July 31, 2014 were distributed. Copies of the 2014 Fall Marty Sanchez Tournament Calendar were included.]

A copy is incorporated herewith to these Minutes as Exhibit "B".

Mr. Brodsky reported as follows:

- The Santa Fe Boys and Girls Club Scramble Tournament will be held on October 5<sup>th</sup>. They usually have a great turnout.

- Unfortunately they lost the New Mexico Oil and Gas Golf Tournament, however, they may come back next season.
- The Santa Fe Realtors Association Benefit for ALS Tournament is scheduled for October 17<sup>th</sup>. They are expecting a great turnout for this tournament.
- Mr. Brodsky is working on a memo that he will be sending out to different organizations in town to let them know what the golf course can offer them and that they can accommodate them in holding tournaments here.
- Mr. Brodsky was in contact with Simon Brackley of the Chamber of Commerce who held their tournament at the Country Club this year. He hopes to get them to have their tournament here next year.
- The number of rounds seem to have gone up. They have had some good tournaments here and they hope to add more.
- Another big tournament that will be held is the Don Loper Tournament that is scheduled for September 5<sup>th</sup>. The first two days will be held at Towa Golf Course. This is a 3-day event and the last day of the tournament will be held here at Marty Sanchez.

Ms. Zingle informed Mr. Brodsky that the LLGA Club Championship is a two day event – September 13<sup>th</sup> and September 14<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Brodsky said he does have this as a two day event and he will correct this on the Calendar. Ms. Boggio-Montgomery said she has received good comments and compliments about the championship with the Country Club.

# 8. OLD BUSINESS

a. Consideration to Draft/Amend Resolution No. 1999-88, Creating a Marty Sanchez Links de Santa Fe Advisory Committee

Copies of Resolution No. 1999-88 Creating a Mary Sanchez Links de Santa Fe Advisory Committee were distributed. A copy is hereby incorporated to these Minutes as Exhibit "D".

Ms. Romero said it is up to the Committee if they want to form a subcommittee to go over the Resolution. She distributed copies of the revisions that the Legal Department made to the Resolution in 2010. She referred to Section 4 (*Duties and Responsibilities*), Item I. She noted that the Legal Department had concerns about the Committee reviewing contracts, budgets and financial reports.

Ms. Romero also referred to Section 8 (*Meetings*), item B that states that a quorum shall consist of fifty (50) percent plus one of the members. She noted that this is already happening.

Ms. Zingle suggested that the subcommittee who worked on this review this again and come up with an up-to-date (2014) draft of what the Committee thinks it should be and do. This way all the Committee Members have a clear understanding of the goals and objectives of this Committee.

Chair Bonal said the Committee has to keep in mind that this Committee is only an advisory committee, and not a policy-making committee.

Ms. Romero mentioned that there is discussion to create a Parks and Recreation Department and if this goes into effect, this facility will no longer be a part of the Public Works Department. It will go under the Parks and Recreation Department.

#### AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 1999-88, CREATING A MARTY SANCHEZ LINKS DE SANTA FE ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

WHEREAS, the Governing Body recognizes that the provision of adequate recreational opportunities for the community is a basic function of the City of Santa Fe; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body recognizes the need to include a broad spectrum of persons from within the Santa Fe community including City Councilors, City Staff, and members of the general public in the process of determining whether Marty Sanchez Links de Santa Fe, (the "Course") is being adequately planned, developed, maintained, used and operated; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body wishes to ensure that the health, safety and welfare concerns regarding the planning, development, maintenance, used and operation of the Course are addressed in a structured manner with direct communication between the Marty Sanchez Links de Santa Fe Advisory Committee and the staff charged with implementing the planning, development, maintenance, use and operation of the Course; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has adopted procedures for the formation of committees, task forces and ad hoc committees in Resolution 1984-56 containing 13 Articles which shall hereafter be referenced parenthetically; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 1984-56 (Articles 1 and 2) requires that all committees, task forces and ad hoc committees be created by resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body now wishes to form a Marty Sanchez Links de Santa Fe Advisory Committee to make recommendations on planning, development, maintenance, use and operation of the Course.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE THAT:

Section 1. The Marty Sanchez Links de Santa Fe Advisory Committee is hereby formed in accordance with Resolution 1984-56. shall revert back to the original Municipal Recreation Complex Advisory Committee (Jeanne, I do not know what the original name of the committee first was other than MSL...however, members want to change it)

Section 2. NAME: (Article 3 Section 1) The committee shall be called the Municipal Recreation Complex Advisory Committee

**Deleted:** Marty Sanchez Links de Santa Fe Section 3. PURPOSE: (Article 3 Section 2) the Municipal Recreation Complex Advisory Committee shall review and make recommendations to the governing body and city staf related to the Municipal Recreation Complex property, housing a golf course, softball, rugby and soccer fields and other recreational activities. be charged with: reviewing the quality of recreational opportunities provided at the Course; holding public meetings and public hearings regarding Course issues until such time as the task force's work is complete; develop documentary record of policy issues regarding the Course; address the Course's general operations; coordinate access and expansion issues; develop short and long term goals; coordinate activities with other entities having similar recreational activities; gather information on similar projects in the state; assess irrigation priorities; and review emergency repairs and such other matters as may be needed.

Section 4. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES: (Article 3 Section 3) The Municipal Recreation Complex Advisory Committee shall be responsible for making recommendations consistent with the purposes provided above and shall not be responsible for making recommendations on personnel matters and day to day operations at the Course.

- A. Review quality of recreational activities provided by the facility
- B. Provide ongoing advice regarding matters pertaining to Municipal Recreation Complex
- C. Shall consult with Public Works Department, Recreation Division,
  Planning and Land Use Department, Bicycle and Trails Advisory
  Committee and Genoveva Chavez Community Center advisory committee
- D. Hold public meetings and public hearings when necessary
- E. Develop a documentary record of policy issues regarding the Municipal Recreation Complex
- F. Coordinate access and expansion issues, develop short and long term goals, coordinate activities with other entities having similar recreational activities
- G. Gather information on similar golf courses in the state, assess irrigation priorities
  - I. Review emergency repairs and such other matters as needed

Section 5. MEMBERSHIP: (Article 7) The Marty Sand

Section 5. MEMBERSHIP: (Article 7) The Marty Sanchez Links de Santa Fe Advisory Committee shall consist of the City or County of Santa Fe. All task force members shall be appointed by the Mayor with the advise and consent of the City Council. The term of the members shall be for two years or until such time as a successor is appointed.

- A. Currently, the advisory committee is composed of thirteen (13) members.

  Through attrition, the advisory committee shall be composed of nine (9) members.
- B. Members shall represent a broad range of recreational activities and have the ability to exercise sound and practical judgments.

Section 6. OFFICERS: (Article 8) The Mayor, with the advise and consent of the City Council, shall appoint the chair and the vice chair shall be designated by the

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chair in accordance with Article 8 one City Councilor. The chairperson shall designate the vice-chair. The chair shall serve as chairperson for a period of one year. Following one year of service, the chairperson shall be elected or re-elected by members of the advisory committee. The chairperson shall appoint sub-committees and their chairpersons.

# Section 7. TERMS OF INITIAL APPOINTMENTS:

- A. Four (4) of the members shall be appointed for two (2) year terms and five (5) of the members shall be appointed for three (3) year terms. Subsequent terms shall be for two (2) year terms to maintain staggering of terms. There shall be no limitation to the number of consecutive terms a member may serve.
- B. Vacancies –shall be filled in the same manner as initial appointments and hsall be for the reminder of the unexpired term. Any member of the advisory committee may be removed by the Mayor with advise and consent of the City Council, with or without cause.

# Section 8. MEETINGS:

- A. The advisory committee shall meet monthly on the second Thursday of each month.
- Aguorum shall consist of fifty (50) percent plus one of the members
- X Line (4) unexeused absenses within a year shall result in automatic

Section 9. STAFF:

A. The Municipal Recreation Complex's Administrative Manager shall serve as the primary liaison to the advisory committee. Depending upon the issue, other city staff may also be required to assist the advisory committee.
