## 1 CITY OF SANTA FE, NEW MEXICO 2 **RESOLUTION NO. 2014-84** 3 INTRODUCED BY: 4 Councilor Patti Bushee 5 Councilor Signe Lindell 6 Councilor Peter Ives 7 8 9 A RESOLUTION 10 CALLING ON THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND OUR CONGRESSIONAL 11 DELEGATION TO SUPPORT LOCAL EFFORTS TO KEEP THE OLD SANTA FE TRAIL 12 13 NATIONAL PARK SERVICE BUILDING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC AS A CULTURAL RESOURCE AND ULTIMATELY DESIGNATED AS EITHER A NATIONAL HISTORIC 14 15 SITE OR A NATIONAL MONUMENT. 16 17 WHEREAS, the Old Santa Fe Trail Building was constructed in 1937-1939 through the efforts of the Civilian Conservation Corps (the "CCC") and the Works Progress Administration (the 18 19 "WPA"), two federal government organizations that offered meaningful employment and cultural 20 uplift to millions during the Great Depression; and 21 WHEREAS, New Mexico and its multi-cultural populations received a greater benefit from those programs than other states, enabling the survival and eventual thriving of today's ethnic 22 23 diversity; and WHEREAS, from 1939 until 1995, this building served as the regional headquarters for the 24

National Park Service, playing an important role in the development of the National Park System that

has been called "America's Best Idea;" and

WHEREAS, there are currently 70 National Park Service employees who are housed in the building; and

WHEREAS, this building is an outstanding example of institutional adobe architecture, reflecting the natural vernacular architecture of New Mexico and the Southwest; and

WHEREAS, the exterior of this building has been preserved by the National Park Service since 1939, and is virtually unchanged since its original design and construction; and

WHEREAS, the interior of this building has been designed to reflect that same vernacular architecture and contains furniture and artwork emblematic of New Mexico and the Southwest; and

WHEREAS, much of that furniture and artwork was also produced by the artisans of the CCC and the WPA, and the National Park Service has protected and preserved these artifacts as part of their mission to preserve this building; and

WHEREAS, until recent limitations on public access exhibits and interpretive programs, public activities in the building have become an important living part of Santa Fe's community life and development, and

WHEREAS, the area around the building, commonly known as Museum Hill, has evolved into a unique array of educational institutions that are highly compatible with public use of the Old Santa Fe Trail Building, presenting extraordinary potential for mutually beneficial federal, state, local, tribal, and private sector cooperation; and

WHEREAS, in recognition that the Old Santa Fe Trail Building is historically significant to the nation as a whole, the building was designated as a National Historic Landmark in 1989 by the Secretary of the Interior; and

WHEREAS, Congress is now being asked to designate the Old Santa Fe Trail Building as a National Historic Site to honor the work of all of those throughout the nation who lent their talents and labor to the CCC and the WPA; and

WHEREAS, the story of this era of our nation's history needs to be documented and celebrated before those who worked in the CCC and the WPA pass from the scene; and

WHEREAS, there is no more fitting site to educate the nation about the deeds of these important groups, and to honor their memory, than in the magnificent building which they created.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE that the Governing Body of the city of Santa Fe urges the Congress of the United States to designate the Old Santa Fe Trail Building as the "CCC and WPA Historic Site" or alternately the President of the United States to proclaim it the CCC and WPA National Monument to tell the story of all of those who participated in these government programs in the wonderful building and among the wonderful artifacts that they helped create.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body hereby supports keeping the 70 employees housed in the building.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk shall forward copies of this resolution to the President of the United States, the New Mexico Congressional Delegation, the Governor of the State of New Mexico, the Santa Fe Legislative Delegation and the Santa Fe County Commission.
