10	A RESOLUTION
11	REQUESTING THAT THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND THE U.S.
12	DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES ADOPT IN FULL THE
13	SCIENTIFIC REPORT OF THE 2015 DIETARY GUIDELINES ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

15	WHEREAS, Resolution 2008-5 was a joint City/Council resolution that established the
16	Santa Fe City and County Advisory Council on Food Policy ("Council"); and
17	WHEREAS, the purpose of the Council is to integrate all City and County departments with
18	non-profit organizations and food and farming businesses in a common effort to improve the
19	availability of safe and nutritious food at reasonable prices for all residents, particularly those in need;
20	and
21	WHEREAS, the Council recommends food policies for the City government to adopt and
22	implement that are related to direct service of food; lobbying and advocacy before state and federal
23	legislatures and agencies; referral to social services; and economic development and education on
24	nutrition and health; and
25	WHEREAS, Resolution 2014-100 adopted the Council's Food Plan, Planning for Santa Fe's

Food Future: Querencia, A Story of Food, Farming, and Friends ("Plan"), which was developed by the Council as a guiding policy document to ensure that a safe, healthy, and affordable food supply will be available to all residents; and

WHEREAS, the Plan's recommendations are aligned with existing policy documents such as the Sustainable Growth Management Plan, the 2014 Santa Fe County Economic Development Plan, and the County Health Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Agricultures and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services review and amend the National Dietary Guidelines every five years, and have recently released the *Scientific Report of the 2015 Dietary Guidelines Advisory Committee* ("Guidelines"); and

WHEREAS, the new nutritional recommendations of the Guidelines have a multi-sector impact in the fields of health, nutrition, poverty, farming, the environment, and policy; and

WHEREAS, at least 14.9% of individuals living in Santa Fe County can be classified as "food insecure", meaning they live in a household in which access to food adequate to support a healthy lifestyle is limited or uncertain, and these individuals are therefore at a higher risk for diabetes and obesity because the only foods they can afford are high in calories and poor in nutrients; and

WHEREAS, obesity increases the risk of numerous diseases including cancer, heart disease, stroke, and type 2 diabetes, and the percentage of adults in Santa Fe County who are obese increased from 14.5% in 2004 to nearly 20% in 2010; and

WHEREAS, the Guidelines would have a positive impact by increasing access to healthy foods for food insecure families and would help decrease the prevalence of obesity and diet-related diseases such as heart disease, stroke, and type 2 diabetes; and

WHEREAS, the recommendations in the Guidelines – especially those pertaining to nutrition, increased access to healthy foods for low-income individuals, and environmental sustainability and food – align with the goals and recommendations laid out in the Plan.

1	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE
2	CITY OF SANTA FE that the Governing Body hereby requests that the Secretary of the U.S.
3	Department of Agricultures and the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services
4	adopt the guidelines and recommendations in full as listed in the Scientific Report of the 2015 Dietary
5	Guidelines Advisory Committee.
6	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that staff is directed to transmit a copy of this resolution to
7	the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Secretary of the U.S. Department of
8	Health and Human Services by the federal comment deadline of May 8, 2015, 11:59pm EST.
