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15	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE:		
16	Section 1. Section 11-2.1 SFCC 1987 (being Code 1953, §2-65) is amended to		
17	read:		
18	11-2.1 Appropriation.		
19	Upon preparation and submission of an annual budget by the city manager, the governing body		
20	shall adopt the next fiscal year's budget by resolution. The final budget document shall include		
21	summaries of the following:		
22	A. Anticipated revenues by fund;		
23	B. Planned expenditures by fund, department and category;		
24	C. Planned cash transfers between funds;		
25	D. Estimated beginning and ending cash balances;		

1 E. Costs for [P]personnel [schedules showing] salaries and benefits by fund[3] and 2 department [and position]; 3 F. General obligation and revenue bonded debt service; and 4 G. Schedules of lease purchase agreements and capital outlay. 5 The annual budget includes all line-item detailed reports for all funds and detailed personnel 6 schedules, which must be prepared and be available upon request. 7 Section 2. Article 11-3 SFCC 1987 (being SFCC 1981, §9-3-5, as amended) is 8 amended to read: 9 11-3 CLAIMS OR PAYMENTS IN EXCESS OF APPROVED BUDGET; LIABILITY. 10 A. When the budget has been approved and received by the city, it shall be binding 11 upon all officials and the governing body. The governing body shall not allow or approve claims 12 in excess thereof, and no official shall make any payment in excess thereof; such allowances or 13 claims or payments so allowed or paid shall be a liability against the officials so allowing or 14 paying such claims or payments, and recovery for such excess amounts so allowed or paid may 15 be had against the bondsmen of such officials. 16 B. The determination of expenses or expenditures in excess of the approved budget 17 shall be by fund, [with the general fund by department] function, department and division. C. 18 In the event that operations for the public health, safety and welfare require a 19 service to be continued without interruption, the department director shall present the fund deficit 20 within thirty (30) days of discovery to the finance committee for recommendation of action to the 21 governing body. If the department director fails to take this action, the finance director shall bring 22. the deficit to the finance committee within the next thirty (30) days. 23 D. For enterprise fund operations supported by revenues, quarterly reports also shall 24 be made to the finance committee indicating the status of the revenues to date compared to the 25

expenses to date. If the revenues are not in excess of expenses, and are not anticipated to be by

1	the end of the fiscal year, the finance committee shall recommend action to the governing body o			
2	the proposed funding source to cover the deficit.			
3	Section 3. Article 11-4 SFCC 1987 (being Code 1953, Sec. 2-66, as amended) is			
4	amended to read:			
5	11-4 BUDGET ADJUSTMENTS.			
6	When adjustments are needed during the fiscal year the following procedures shall apply:			
7	A. [Budget increases or decreases in total revenue or transfers in or in total			
8	expenditures, expenses or transfers-out, that reflect increases or decreases from the budget			
9	previously approved by the governing body, must be authorized by resolution of the governing			
10	body;] The city manager has the authority to approve budget increases or decreases in revenue or			
11	transfers-in or in expenditures, expenses or transfers-out, that reflect increases or decreases from			
12	the budget that are thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) and under.			
13	B. [Budget transfers up to twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) between line items			
14	previously approved by the governing body may be approved by the city manager; and] The			
15	governing body shall approve increases or decreases in revenue or transfers-in or in expenditures.			
16	expenses or transfers-out, that reflect increases or decreases from the budget that are over thirty			
17	thousand dollars (\$30,000).			
18	C. Budget adjustments approved by the city manager and the governing body shall			
19	be included by fund in a quarterly budget resolution approved by the governing body.			
20	<u>D.</u> Budget adjustment requests will conform to the rules and regulations adopted by			
21	the local government division of the department of finance and administration.			
22	$[D]$ \underline{E} . For budgets associated with grants and grant agreements, the following shall			
23	apply:			
24	(1) The city manager may approve grant applications, awards, grant match			
25	requirements, and agreements under [five] thirty thousand dollars (\$[5]30,000) [with no cash city			

1	match].				
2	(2) The cit	y manager may approve budget revenue and related expenditure/expense			
3	increases (including budget adjustments or decreases, as applicable) for grants provided that all of				
4	the following condition	the following conditions are met:			
5	(a) The go	verning body has already approved the grant application including the			
6	recommended match (if applicable); and				
7	(b) The fin	al grant award does not significantly differ from the grant application in			
8	the amount, match, requirements, or other requirements on the part of the city; and				
9	(3) Any cit	ty department receiving a grant shall submit a copy of the final award			
10	agreement and documentation for the grant to the finance department for financial tracking,				
11	reporting and auditing purposes.
