11	AMENDING SECTION 2-3.3 SFCC 1987 REGARDING THE SALARY OF THE

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14	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE:
15	Section 1. Section 2-3.3 SFCC 1987 (being SFCC 1981, §1-1-13 as amended) is
16	amended to read:
17	2-3.3 Qualifications and Salary of the Municipal Judge.
18	The municipal judge shall:
19	A. Be a qualified elector who shall be:
20	(1) A United States citizen;
21	(2) Eighteen (18) years of age or older, who has resided in the city for thirty
22	(30) days prior to the election; and
23	(3) Registered to vote in a general election precinct which is within or partly
24	within the city;
25	B. Be a resident of the city;
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C. Take the oath prescribed by subsection 2-7.1, SFCC 1987, and furnish a surety
bond in the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.). Such bond shall be conditioned on
the faithful performance of the judge's duties. The premium of the bond shall be paid by the city;
and

5 D. Receive [an amended annual sixty five thousand dollars (\$65,000.) conditioned 6 on the judge's additional duties effective July 1, 2001. Said increased compensation is paid in 7 exchange for the performance of additional duties not contemplated when the office was created 8 and the salary was specified. Said amended salary is to be made consistent with the home rule 9 charter Article VII. Section 7.07.] an annual salary of eighty-five thousand dollars (\$85,000). 10 The salary shall be reviewed as set forth in Section 7.07 of the Santa Fe Municipal Charter. 11 E. Have [, as additional duties from July 1, 2001 forward,] the following program 12 or such other alternative and equivalent programs as the municipal judge may deem appropriate:

(1) Design, implementation, revision and enhancement of a drug court program including but not limited to grant writing, additional training, public speaking, educational and promotional efforts necessary to implement said program. [Continued enforcement of this program constitutes an additional duty from the effective date of this subsection forward.]

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(2) Design, implementation, revision and enhancement of a home detention program intended to economize on municipal expenditures for incarceration. [Continued enforcement of this program constitutes an additional duty from the effective date of this subsection forward.]

(3) Design, implementation, revision and enhancement of a personal values alternative sentencing program for offenders between the ages of 18 and 25 who plead guilty to any act of violence. [Continued enforcement of this program constitutes an additional duty from the effective date of this subsection forward.]

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1	(4) Design, implementation, revision and enhancement of other alternative
2	sentencing programs including but not limited to:
3	(a) Puentas course conducted in Spanish designed to instruct non-
4	English speaking motorists of the laws of the state of New Mexico for operating
5	motor vehicles.
6	(b) Options for those who have revoked drivers licenses instructing
7	said persons in alternative means of facilitating mobility while the license is in
8	revoked status.
9	(c) Spanish drivers under the influence program for Spanish
10	speaking offenders convicted of driving under the influence.
11	(5) Implement and oversee screening programs for jailable offenses in order
12	to minimize incarceration and maximize alternative treatment modalities. This includes
13	on-site visits to referral agencies to determine curriculums and treatment by providers.
14	(6) Oversee tracking of and compliance with the community service work
15	program and shall access the needs of recipient non-profit agencies and the community.
