Councilor Bushee said she would like to cosponsor Councilor Trujillo's and Mayor Coss's Resolutions.

Councilor Bushee said she is concerned about the articles in the newspaper about raises, especially the raise for lieutenants. She thought these should have been discussed with the Governing Body before they were approved, noting this may have been done by the previous City Manager. She said this Governing Body had long discussions about the issues surrounding compaction, especially for public safety personnel, but she never thought the raises would not come before the Finance Committee and the City Council. She noted an article in the newspaper about two weeks ago where it was reported the City had approved raises of 51% and 60% for some employees. She understands promotions can be done administratively, but not for these kinds of raises in terms of amounts.

Councilor Bushee requested that staff provide a list of all raises that have happened in past two years, and would like a discussion about this on the agenda at the next meeting of the Finance Committee.

Councilor Bushee said she had conversations with AFSCME, which was requesting to get back some of the benefits they had to give up, which she forwarded to the City Attorney. She said the City Attorney said we can't just do this, because it has to be negotiated. In view of this, she wants to set parameters around these kinds of things.

### **Councilor Dominguez**

Councilor Dominguez thanked Brian Snyder and staff for their work with the Sidewalk Angels. He said they filled two big dumpsters from the cleanup. He asked Mr. Snyder to email him with a briefing on any feedback he got from staff.

Councilor Dominguez said this weekend he will be doing his 3<sup>rd</sup> "Walk and Talk" at Los Hermanos Park starting at 8:00 a.m. He said Jody will be putting out an announcement. He said everyone is welcome to join him.

Councilor Dominguez thanked Councilors, City staff and the public who walked this weekend for breast cancer.

Councilor Dominguez said he will work with staff to see what we can get on the agenda to address Councilor Bushee's concerns at next Finance Committee.

Councilor Bushee said she also would like staff to dredge up the Evergreen Study, the compaction study we never did anything with, and have that as an agenda item as well at the next Finance Committee. She would like the departments which dealt with those raises to attend to answer any questions.

### F. PETITIONS FROM THE FLOOR

David McQuarie said in 1993 there was an Appeals Court Decision with regard to installation of curb ramps on overlay projects, and part of the decision was that governments would be required to install the curb ramps at the time of the overlay. He said City staff is reluctant to do this at all. He said on Siringo Road there are overlays but no curb ramps. He said curb ramp plans were supposed to have been sent to the Mayor's Committee on Disability for review. He said some plans were sent, but they were bad and "they croaked on the vehicular traffic and presented the hazard for the pedestrian." He recommended that the City does not spend the money. He said staff tells us there is no money to do this, but that's not true, because there is a budget which was passed by the Council, but they're spending on other things. He asked if this is misuse of public funds. He asked if this is discrimination against all pedestrians not just handicapped. He said the

new City Manager, who is an engineer, should look closely at the practice of engineers that think traffic is only vehicular and not pedestrian. He said a letter was issued from the Federal Highway Administration that the City has to start complying with this practice, and must respond not later than October 18, 2013. He said nobody he knows of has seen a response from the City.



**UPDATE** to Include Boys and Girls Club Data

On September 5, 2013, the Kiwanis Club of Santa Fe partnered with the city for the first time in a parking and shuttle plan for the annual "Burning of Zozobra" event. This entailed providing a standard event parking fee of \$5.00 at all available downtown city parking lots from 4:00 p.m. to 12:00 a.m.; as well as a 'park and shuttle' service using available Santa Fe Pick-Up vehicles — on a modified Santa Fe Pick-Up route — operating from downtown city parking lots to/from a staging area near the event site.

The Boys and Girls Club of Santa Fe also participated by providing shuttle vehicles for the event; providing a total of 319 trips from the various downtown parking areas. And, as has occurred in years past, Santa Fe Trails provided extended/expanded bus service from the South Capitol Station to the Downtown Transit Center – and free fares system-wide – from 4:00 p.m. to the closing of the event on September 5.

The Kiwanis Club took the lead in promoting the service to a large and broad audience, to include clear communication about parking and shuttle options, prior to the scheduled events. This had the effect of providing attendees of the 2013 Zozobra event with a safer and better overall experience from start to finish.

Santa Fe Pick-Up operated six vehicles from 6:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. on the night of the event, carrying a total of 420 passengers to/from the various downtown city parking lots. Perhaps more telling is that each of the six parking lots that were advertised for the event was used in some capacity in 2013, whereas only three of them were used in 2012. Also, a total of \$5,078 in parking fees was collected at the designated parking locations in 2013 – a full 90 percent increase over 2012. This testifies to the benefits of the partnership between the Kiwanis and the city, and the outstanding promotional efforts of the Kiwanis Club.

2	deliver wrap around services such as support for social and emotional needs for students and their
3	families who participate in TEP; and

5	youth on the south side of Santa Fe and such youth will have the opportunity to meet their required
6	educational credits and ultimately graduate from high school, thus reducing the dropout rate in Santa
7	Fe; and
8	WHEREAS, there is a current need for the months of January to May 2014, to have available
9	funding in the amount of \$23,000 for space rental and coordination of the wrap around services tha
10	are to be provided for the TEP to function; and

12	during the 2013/2014 fiscal year have since dissolved, therefore, such funding can be allocated to the
