11	AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER NEGOTIATIONS
12	WITH THE COLLEGE OF SANTA FE, THE CREDITORS OF THE COLLEGE, AND THE
13	STATE OF NEW MEXICO TO DEVELOP A PLAN THAT WOULD PROVIDE FOR
14	CONTINUED OPERATION OF A HIGH QUALITY ARTS AND LIBERAL ARTS
15	PROGRAM AT THE COLLEGE OF SANTA FE.
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17	WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the City of Santa Fe recognizes the role of art and
18	culture in the economy of the City of Santa Fe and the State of New Mexico; and
19	WHEREAS, Santa Fe's arts and cultural economy is the strongest in the country for its
20	relative size; and
21	WHEREAS, Santa Fe is in need of a strong academic institution that will offer arts and
22	cultural education opportunities which would attract local youth as well as youth from around the
23	world to study in Santa Fe; and
24	WHEREAS, the College of Santa Fe has educated students in northern New Mexico for
25	150 years; and

WHEREAS, the College of Santa Fe has employed hundreds of creative and committed staff members during its years of operation; and

WHEREAS, changes in the national credit crisis has adversely affected the College of Santa Fe because of the structure of the debt issued with the intent to lower borrowing costs and provide for improvements to facilities; and

WHEREAS, on January 14, 2009, the Governing Body adopted Resolution No. 2009-6 (introduced by Councilor Bushee and cosponsored by Mayor Coss and Councilors Calvert, Trujillo, Romero, Wurzburger, and Dominguez) that recognized the importance of the College of Santa Fe to the Santa Fe community; supported efforts of the New Mexico Higher Education Department and New Mexico Highlands University to establish a four year public university; and extended assistance to the College in its efforts to continue providing quality education and other activities in Santa Fe; and

WHEREAS, the Governor has convened a task force to develop options and plans for the future of the College of Santa Fe consisting of participants from state, local, and community organizations; and

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe, the State of New Mexico, the Governor's Task Force and other organizations committed to strengthening the arts and improving New Mexico's future by working in collaboration can develop a financial plan to provide for ongoing operation of the College of Santa Fe; and

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe has other interests in and around the campus of the College of Santa Fe, including completion of a Boulevard Study for the St. Michael corridor and the ultimate disposition of its Siringo Road property when it consolidates facilities at its central site at Siler Road that is now the subject a master planning study; and

WHEREAS, there is interest in the use of the College of Santa Fe campus by the City of Santa Fe, the State of New Mexico, educational institutions and others; and

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe is facing severe budget constraints as a result of the economic downturn but has a high credit rating because of the strength of its economy and the Governing Body's conservative approach to financial issues; and

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe may be able to issue debt supported by a pledge of its tax revenues to finance acquisition of the College of Santa Fe campus and then sell or lease portions of the campus for appropriate uses such that no City resources would be needed to subsidize the debt or operating costs associated with acquisition of the Campus except for direct purchase costs such as legal fees and appraisal fees; and

WHEREAS, time is of the essence in preparing a plan that would assure that the College of Santa Fe can retain its accreditation and begin a new academic semester in the fall of 2009.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE that the City Manager is authorized and directed to enter negotiations with the College of Santa Fe, the creditors of the College, State of New Mexico, and other interested educational institutions to develop a plan that would provide for continued operation of a high quality four-year arts and liberal arts program at the College of Santa Fe while providing a prudent level of assurance acceptable to the Governing Body that direct contributions of resources by the City would not be required except for direct purchase costs such as legal fees and appraisal fees.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the financing plan shall include the amount of the College of Santa Fe's debt, administrative costs and deferred maintenance costs.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager will provide weekly briefings or updates to the Governing Body about the progress of the negotiations for the purchase of the campus property and related agreements.
