1. CALL TO ORDER

Acting Chair Rhonda Faught called the Sister Cities Committee to order at 4:00 pm, roll call reflects a quorum.

6. Action Items

a. Request to approve \$600 in support of Fiesta Fela

Mr. Moore asked what the budget balance is. He does not question this award, but he would like to see a budget process created to have a systematic way to do awards. Mr. Moore feels that awards are being made on who we know vs. a systematic process.

Mr. Olivas recommended that the commission be informed on how we get the money, what are the parameters of the budget and what happens with money that isn't spent?

Dr. Case suggested that the Chair or her designee sit with Debra Garcia y Griego regarding the budget and ask the questions as stated above and report back to the Sister Cities Committee. Dr. Case said that part of the budget is spent for visiting guests, lodging, etc.

7. REPORTS AND UPDATES

a. EDUCATION COMMITTEE (Jeff Case-Sky Lopez)
SCI Journal Exchange on Sustainability has been sent to all members of the Sister Cities Committee. Dr. Case is very pleased with the end result. Nice introduction from Mayor Webber. The major faculty organizers, Lawrence Tembo from Lusaka, Zambia and Rubi Beyer from Parral, Mexico have responded and are very happy with the Journal. Please send it to any teachers, students, or any interested parties that would benefit and appreciate this work. Dr. Case and Ms. Carey will work on distribution.

Dr. Case – YAAS – Young Artists & Authors Showcase (Exhibit A) – 2019 Theme: Global Citizens: Resilient Communities. Winning entries are displayed at the Annual Conference and go on a year-long tour to various US Cities, Santa Fe is one. There are two finalists in the exhibit, One from Monte Del Sol and the other from the Icheon Ceramic High School. See attached. The theme was Diplomacy which is achieving that which is unachievable. The Korean entry shows a map of North and South Korean peninsula with the Olympic rings overlay. We hope to show the 12 paintings and 20 foam boards at Mandela, Monte Del Sol, ATC, NMSA, and Mayor Webber's office. Other places will be identified to show the art pieces. There are 32 pieces.

The Sister Cities committee members will brain storm to find locations for the term of the exhibit. Recommendations: Santa Fe Place Mall, Movie Theaters, Children's Museum, Social Media, Warehouse 21, Facebook, etc.

The Chair and Dr. Case have had very productive meetings with the new Mayor, Mayor Eam. The delivered a letter from Mayor of Icheon to Mayor Webber. Mayor Eam is hosting a high school Global Music Concerts and has invited Santa Fe students. Timeframe for the Global Music Concert is August, 2019. This is a great opportunity to do some world travel that is meaningful, purposeful, and culturally rewarding. It may be the beginning of a global adventure. The City of Icheon will take care of all in country expenses such as airport transportation, lodging, meals, transportation around the city, and possible tourist excursions. Dr. Case also sent this information to the committee members. Dr. Case asked Jackie to look at the bottom of the letter and asked if a Press Release could be sent out and, possibly do a video for inclusion.

This year's theme asks students to explore this question through the lens of citizen diplomacy.

About the Showcase

The Young Artists and Authors Showcase (YAAS) encourages youth worldwide to express our mission through original artwork, literature, and photography.

Students interpret an annual theme and send their work to Washington, D.C. where a panel of judges selects grand prize winners and finalists based on originality, composition, and theme interpretation.

Winning entries are displayed at the Annual Conference and go on a year-long tour to various U.S. cities.

Showcase Guidelines



Eligibility

- Art and Literature: students must be 13-18 years old to qualify.
- Photography students must be 13-22 years old to qualify.
- All work must be original.

Fees

- There is NO fee to submit an entry to YAAS.
- If the student or Sister City program wants their artwork returned, there is a \$25 fee per art piece.



Art

- Art must be 2-D, unframed, and no larger than 24 in x 36 in (61 cm x 91.5 cm).
- One (1) submission from member community and one (1) from each Sister City.
- One (1) international grand prize winner and one (1)
 U.S. grand prize winner.
- Five (5) U.S. finalists and five (5) international finalists.

Literature

- Essays: 500 words or less.
- Poems: 200 words or less.
- Multiple entries allowed; limit of five (5) entries per classroom.
- One (1) grand prize winner.
- Two (2) essay finalists and two (2) poetry finalists.

Photography

- Submit photos via Instagram (maximum 5 entries).
- Caption must include @SisterCitiesInt, #YAAS2019, and the student's city/state/country.
- One (1) grand prize winner.
- Five (5) U.S. finalists and five (5) international finalists.
