1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting of the Finance Committee was called to order by Councilor Roman Abeyta, Chair, at 5:00 pm on Monday, December 17, 2018, in the City Council Chambers, City Hall, Santa Fe, New Mexico.

2. ROLL CALL

3. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Ms. Keyes said we want the Committee to know that we included the procurement memo for sole source in the meeting packet.

Chair Abeyta informed the Committee that the Economic Development Committee recommended approval for item (AD) earlier today.

MOTION A motion was made by Councilor Lindell, seconded by Councilor Romero-

Wirth, to approve the agenda as amended.

VOTE The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

4. APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

Councilor Lindell pulled items B, E, F, K and U for discussion.

Councilor Romero-Wirth pulled item AA for discussion.

MOTION A motion was made by Councilor Lindell, seconded by Councilor Romero-

Wirth, to approve the consent agenda as amended.

VOTE The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

5. APPROVAL OF MINUTES NOVEMBER 19, 2018

MOTION A motion was made by Councilor Lindell, seconded by Councilor Romero-

Wirth, to approve the minutes as presented.

VOTE The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

6. PRESENTATIONS

A. DECEMBER FINANCE DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEE OF THE MONTH CLARENCE ROMERO

Chair Abeyta and the Finance Committee recognized Mr. Clarence Romero, Finance Department of the Month, with a plaque which was read into the record.

7. CONSENT AGENDA

A. REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF PROCUREMENT IN THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$263,758.45 USING STATE PRICE AGREEMENT #60-000-15-00015 FOR FIVE TRANSIT VANS FOR THE DIVISION OF SENIOR SERVICES; CREATIVE BUS SALES, INC.

Approved on consent.

B. REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF STATE PRICE AGREEMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$79,420.80 FOR THE PURCHASE OF LABOR COSTS TO BUILD POLICE DEPARTMENT VEHICLES; MHQ OF NEW MEXICO. Chief Andrew Padilla

Councilor Lindell asked have we advertised for the position that is vacant due to a retirement.

Chief Padilla said this is an IT position at the radio shop. That is not under our department so he is not privy to if they have advertised for that position.

Councilor Lindell asked did we put this out to bid.

Chief Padilla said no, MHQ is under State contract. The State contract gives us the ability to pick off the list. We have worked with this company before and thought it was best to go with them at this time.

Councilor Lindell said she would feel more comfortable if we got bids on things in the future.

Councilor Lindell said in the report it says we have been waiting for a pretty long time for some cars to get radios in them.

Chief Padilla said that is correct.

Councilor Lindell asked how many are we waiting on.

Chief Padilla said twenty eight to thirty.

Councilor Lindell asked how long did we wait on vehicles purchased in 2017.

Chief Padilla said they came in April or May so a six month turn around. These vehicles arrived last year. We waited nine to eleven months for all these vehicles to get issued out. We had to patiently wait for the radio shop or IT to build these vehicles for us. Fourteen of the vehicles have been there for over a year. They do not want to build these vehicles for us anymore because it delays City work. This is an unanticipated cost.

Councilor Lindell said three people work in the shop. Is anyone from IT here. (There was no one present from IT). We lost one person and we let twenty eight police cars sit for almost a year. Where have they been.

Chief Padilla said they have been stored at the Huey lot which is the main vehicle storage lot. It is by the airport. He appreciates her frustration. We felt it too.

Councilor Lindell asked why didn't this come to us before. Those cars are a year old now.

Chief Padilla said correct

Councilor Lindell said they have already depreciated significantly.

Chief Padilla said we work Department to Department doing the best we can.

Councilor Lindell said she wishes the City Manager was here. She thinks to have one person retire and have the result of that be we have fourteen brand new vehicles sit for a year, she is a little overwhelmed by this. She thinks it needs much more attention than us just approving this contract. We have a breakdown and failure that frankly she is surprised about. One person retires and we have an entire program come to a screeching halt and that is astounding to her. And to not know about it for almost a year is not acceptable.

Chair Abeyta asked does this still have to go to Council.

Ms. McCoy said yes.

Chair Abeyta said he would like a memo from the IT Department clarifying what happened and how are we are going to address this going forward. He agrees with Councilor Lindell. We need a plan moving forward and if that means contracting this service out so be it. He also thinks we need a mechanism and someone to keep us informed of problems like this and bring them to someone's attention so it does not happen again. That should be part of the City Council packet. He would like to have it as soon as possible.

Councilor Romero-Wirth said she agrees with needing this information for the City Council packet. She does not feel that we should hold this up. It has already been held up and we need to get these vehicles in operation. Holding this up is just adding to the problem.

Councilor Lindell said she thinks Councilor Romero-Wirth is correct, but she is just astounded. We had fourteen cars sit in a lot waiting to get radios in them for a year. We definitely need the City Manager to look into this. Should we even hava a radio shop. Should all this be subbed out. Should it go out to bid. She would like for it to never happen again.

MOTION A motion was made by Councilor Lindell, seconded by Councilor Romero-Wirth, to approve this request with direction to staff to prepare a memo and plan for the future for this work and, if possible, a cost analysis of eliminating the radio shop.

VOTE The motion was approved unanimously by voice vote.

C. E. REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF GSA CONTRACT IN THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$158,409 FOR THE FARO LASER SCANNER SYSTEM. Chief Andrew Padilla

Councilor Lindell asked have we used this system before.

Chief Padilla said this is the new system. We do have one scanner in place at this time, however; this has new technology. We have identified the funding and that is why we are moving forward. We have tested it and evaluated it. This is what the District Attorney's Office likes to use in the prosecution of it's cases.

Councilor Lindell said so other Departments are using this same system.

Chief Padilla said yes.

Councilor Lindell asked who will be trained for this technology.

Chief Padilla said our Crime Scene Technicians.

Councilor Lindell asked have we talked to other departments about how this particular system works.

Chief Padilla said yes, we have.

Councilor Lindell asked we have one scanner system already.

Chief Padilla introduced Officer Ricky Yxqyuerdi. Officer Yxqyuerdi explained the traffic team uses the total system. This is a closed scanner station that measures in 3D. We will use that one on every fatal or great bodily injury crash.

Councilor Lindell asked does it get used every week.

Chief Padilla said on average it is used twenty to twenty five times a year.

Councilor Lindell said when she goes through this invoicing from FARO it looks like it has a lot of add ons to the actual costs. We don't have one of these now. Why do we need to start out with two of them. Why not one.

Chief Padilla said the traffic team uses it heavily

Councilor Lindell said this is not inexpensive, why start with two if it will be used only twenty to twenty five times a year.

Chief Padilla said they use it twenty to twenty five times a year. The one we have is not compatible with what crime scene uses. This new one can do both. The crime scene unit would use it twenty to twenty five times a year in addition to the traffic team. They have to be maintained and sent out for a month each year. The second system would serve as a back up.

Councilor Lindell asked what is the source of the funding

Chief Padilla said traffic calming funds.

Councilor Lindell asked so both are in traffic calming.

Chief Padilla said correct.

Councilor Lindell said we are trying to figure out how to do these things. She is not clear that we need two instead of one.

Chair Abeyta asked was this something contemplated when you put your budget together.

Chief Padilla said no, we were doing planning to purchase the system and examining options.

Chair Abeyta asked when you did your planning did you know you needed two of these.

Chief Padilla said yes. We have been working on this for two and a half years while the technology was tested. When funding became available we identified this year would be the time to purchase these items.

Chair Abeyta asked are we talking about three machines.

Chief Padilla said a total of two. We don't have one like this now. The one we have is 2D.

Chair Abeyta asked so one for crime scene and one for traffic.

Chief Padilla said that is correct.

Councilor Lindell asked these two new ones are not the same.

Chief Padilla said they are identical. One will be used for crime scene and one for traffic. They are interchangeable.

Chair Abeyta asked do you feel confident you have enough budget to accommodate both and everything else you need for year.

Chief Padilla said yes.

Chair Abeyta asked you won't come in for a BAR.

Chief Padilla said no sir.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked the one that is 2D, what happens to that one.

Chief Padilla said it would be stored and kept as a last resort. After six months to a year we may auction it.

Councilor Romero-Wirth said you said funding became available. Where did it come from.

Chief Padilla said it is coming from the fees that get routed to traffic calming. They increased and this company is less expensive than we anticipated so we had the funds.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked so the cost came down and you had more revenue in a fund than you anticipated.

Chief Padilla said yes.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked traffic calming funds, what other things do we use those funds for.

Chief Padilla said traffic safety and improvement of the quality of life in Santa Fe. It is a business unit line item in the Police Department.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked so what fees feed the traffic calming fund.

Nancy Jiminez said a portion of every speeding ticket issued by the Police Department goes into the fund. We don't normally tap into it until it has quite a bit of cash balance. Right now there is over \$300,000 in the fund.

Councilor Romero-Wirth said she is interested in educating herself about the fund. What other things do you pay for out of this fund. Why is there more money in the fund than you anticipated.

Ms. Jiminez said it has been building for several years. We have not tapped into it for four or five eyars. It rolled over every year. For big ticket items we push them off and if we can we use this fund.

Ms. McCoy said we can provide a multiple year history of this fund if you would like and what purchases have been made.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked why is it called traffic calming. Is this in our statutes that a portion of speeding tickets goes into this fund. Maybe we should be budgeting for these things. She is curious about the fund itself.

Councilor Lindell asked is anyone here from FARO.

Chief Padilla said no, just from the Department.

Councilor Lindell said in terms of traffic calming she thinks Councilor Romero-Wirth is thinking along the lines she is. She has made requests for traffic calming in terms of solar powered speed limit signs that flash when people are speeding. Is that something we could do with this money.

Chief Padilla said those are maintained by the Streets Department.

Councilor Lindell asked would not that be a resonable use of traffic calming funds.

Chief Padilla said that is something we can explore.

Councilor Lindell said she has put many requests in for those and it went nowhere. She did not realize we had a traffic calming fund. It is important to find out if those monies are to be directed toward traffic calming. This should be in the regular budget, not traffic calming. She will talk with Ms. Wheeler.

Chair Abeyta asked Ms. McCoy to get the Committee more information on this fund. It makes sense to him that we would purchase these machines out of that fund. Maybe traffic calming is the wrong term to name the fund. The question in his mind is

do we need two of them right now.

Councilor Romero-Wirth said one of these is for traffic and the other one is for crime scenes not traffic related.

Chief Padilla said correct.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked is there another fund for the other one to come out of.

Chief Padilla said that is a decision of the Committee. We could buy one and put the other one in our budget.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked which one is needed more.

Chief Padilla said they are both needed.

Councilor Romero-Wirth said it would be interesting to know how many fatal crashes we have where we would deploy this and how many crime scenes we have where we would deploy this. If they happen simultaneously are we putting a burden on you to share a machine.

Chief Padilla said when one is down the other one will be readily available to use.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked how often does that happen that there is a bad traffic accident and a homicide at the same time. You have great arguments.

Chief Padilla asked by the time this hits City Council we can provide those stats.

Chair Abeyta asked has this gone to Public Safety.

Chief Padilla said it goes tomorrow. If you want to move forward we will provide stats for Council and will move forward with your direction about two machines.

MOTION A motion was made by Councilor Lindell, seconded by Chair Abeyta, to move this request forward without recommendation.

DISCUSSION Councilor Romero-Wirth said she is in favor of going forward, but with the suggestion that the Police Department purchase one machine and see if a second one is warranted.

Chair Abeyta asked what if Finance goes with that and Public Safety says to go forward with two. Do we debate that at Council.

Ms. McCoy said if it is approved at Public Safety it would be debated at City Council.

Councilor Romero-Wirth said what goes to them tomorrow will be different because we changed it. That goes to Committee tomorrow, but they could change it back and then send it to Council.

Ms. McCoy said correct. The Department would have twenty four hours to answer any questions this Committee brings forward and a few weeks for the Governing Body.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked Councilor Lindell if she would withdraw her motion and we can do a new motion with the idea to purchase one and see if a second one is warranted and if it is we build it into the budget.

Councilor Lindell withdrew her motion and Chair Abeyta withdrew his second.

MOTION A motion was made by Councilor Romero-Wirth, seconded by Councilor Lindell, to approve the purchase of one machine, try using it and see if a second one is warranted. If it is then build it into the budget for next year.

VOTE The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

F. REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$115,331.96. INCLUSIVE OF NMGRT FOR THE DESIGN SERVICES SCOPE REQUIRED FOR PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS TO THE SALVADOR PEREZ RECREATION BUILDING USING COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES (CES), WHPACIFIC. Jason Kluck

Councilor Lindell asked did we get multiple bids on this.

Mr. Kluck said no. This is through CES pricing. Cooperative Educational Services. We have worked with them for eight years.

Chair Abeyta asked what are they.

Mr. Kluck said they were a procurement agency for schools to start out and now they allow municipalities or government bodies to work through them as a procurement agent. They put out RFPs for all kinds of work and municipalities can piggy back off of those.

Councilor Lindell said she thinks the CES bidding process is unclear. We don't know if this is the best price. It is essential that they are approved by an agency to do

this type of work.

Ms. McCoy said yes that is correct. It is similar to the Statewide Price Agreement. There may be multiple vendors approved by the State.

Councilor Lindell said but does not mean that specific to this project who we select is the lowest price.

Ms. McCoy said in general that is correct.

Mr. Kluck said a point of clarification is it is approximately 8.5% of projected construction costs and that is in the middle of the design chart that has been in existence since the mid 80s. We follow that chart.

Councilor Lindell said she would like it to be the lowest qualified.

Mr. Kluck said he agrees it is possible.

Councilor Lindell asked is there any reason we don't ask other qualified people from the list to bid.

Mr. Kluck said no reason and we have done that in th past. We went with them because they did the structural analysis to start with and the need is critical. We did not want to spend any more time than we had to.

Chair Abeyta said so time and familiarity with the project effected the decision.

Mr. Kluck said correct.

Councilor Lindell said she is not always convinced that we are getting the best price. Her preference is to have more than one bid.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked Mary isn't CES trying to work with economies of scale.

Ms. McCoy said we will get back to you with information on that.

Councilor Romero-Wirth said that would be helpful.

MOTION A motion was made by Commissioner Lindell, seconded by Councilor Romero-Wirth, to approve the request.

Chair Abeyta said Councilor Lindell does raise a good point. Whenever possible we should go out to bid on large projects and now you know how this Committee feels on that.

VOTE The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Councilor Lindell asked why did this increase so dramatically.

Mr. Dolan said the demand has gone up. This past year we have been turning away about nine hundred requests a month from our patrons. There has been growth year by year. When we incorporated this collection into our catalogue, whose use has climbed, we were trying to get our patrons to go through our catalogue. We are finding our way forward to meeting the demand without spending an absurd amount of money.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked if he would explain how this works.

Mr. Dolan said with a library card it allows you to make a "Hoopla" account and with our catalogue to get ebooks, audio books music and videos. Digital audio books are the biggest use. You could access this anywhere.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked is it free to use

Mr. Dolan said yes.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked so we make these available to people who do not have subscriptions otherwise through other ways.

Mr. Dolan said yes.

Mr. Dolan said "Hoopla" is a pay per use subscription and we have a dollar amount limit every day.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked do we know that the people who are using this are the people who really need it.

Ms. Dolan said no. We don't track that.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked do other libraries regulate this.

Mr. Dolan said no. Libraries keep a minimal amount of information on patrons. That is part of library privacy.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked is this standard practice in other libraries.

Mr. Dolan said yes and a growing practice.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked are other libraries finding the need to do things to deal with the raising cost.

Mr. Dolan said he is sure they are all facing his issue. We don't think we should ignore the demand.

Councilor Romero-Wirth said she is curious if other libraries are looking at

limiting usage to those who really need this option.

Chair Abeyta said he has a Kindle himself. His sons get IPads through school so if they have library card and this service they can use the IPad to check out without going physically to the library.

Mr. Dolan said yes.

Chair Abeyta said as schools are issuing tablets as opposed to books this is one use the students could have.

Mr. Dolan said yes. "Hoopla" has an enormous collection so it expands our collection without us having to have the physical space to store all those physical books.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked what devices can you use.

Mr. Dolan said Amazon only works with Overdrive for Libraries. Any other one can be used. A Kindle Fire works.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked do the public schools also put money in to give students this access.

Mr. Dolan said he doubts they can afford it. Their library budgets are very small.

Councilor Romero-Wirth said it seems like this primary use is working with schools for kids access. It seems like a partnership we ought to pursue. She would like to see people who can afford other options not use this.

Mr. Dolan said he doesn't know that we could prohibit that. We could target our marketing to people who do not have the money to do this.

Councilor Romero-Wirth said she encourages him to be smart about this money and how you use it.

Mr. Dolan said he appreciate that. We will endeavor to be smart about that.

Ms. Ochoa, the City Community Services Director, said we are doing library planning and a study and this is a great question for the study to address. We will do that.

Councilor Romero-Wirth said it seems like a natural fit.

MOTION A motion was made by Councilor Lindell, seconded by Councilor Romero-Wirth, to approve the request.

Councilor Romero-Wirth said this is a Resolution for the Governing Body to support Legislation. She wants to make sure we are considering on this that the Bill is considered the scope of practice. She was a Bill drafter in the 80s for the Legislature. She would like to see the two sides on this get together. It is true that we don't have enough dental services available to all the people who need them and there is a real question about how we meet that need. Also there is a question of making sure the people doing those different things are well trained and that they have the education and training in our effort to meet this important need for dental care and that it is done appropriately and they are talking to all sides. The dentists and others. She wants to make sure that in what we are directing we get all the sides together to work out what is appropriate. She is not sure what dental therapy means. She is struggling with this. People go to school for a long time to be lawyers. It is the same thing here. We should not be taking sides. She wanted to draw attention to that.

Council Lindell said in reading this she is not overly familiar with this. It says they have to work under a dentist. She is probably going to support this. She doesn't think the State of New Mexico has a dental school. We have a tremendous shortage of dentists here. Dental care for undeserved communities is scarce and necessary. This may expand the availability for some care. She is going to support it because of it being qualified by supervision by dentists.

MOTION A motion was made by Councilor Lindell, seconded by Chair Abeyta, to approve the request.

DISCUSSION Councilor Romero-Wirth said it would be helpful if we had someone here to help us figure this out. She doesn't think we have dental therapists now. They are more than hygienists, but less than a dentist. She would like more information on this.

Councilor Lindell said page 2 of the Bill, line 11 says they are mid level practitioners supervised by dentists.

Councilor Romero-Wirth said she thinks they do not exist right now. Legislation is being pushed to create dental therapists. What she supports is the different sides getting together to work this out. She is uncomfortable with this. She knows there is a problem. They do need to get together at the Roundhouse and figure out how to get services to people who cannot get them. This makes us take sides and she is not comfortable with that.

Mr. Guillen said this goes to Council on the 9th of January.

VOTE The motion passed on a voice vote of 2 yes and 1 no. The no vote was Councilor Romero-Wirth.

8. MATTERS FROM STAFF

A. PLANNING FOR FY 19 MID-YEAR BUDGET REVIEW

Ms. McCoy said the memo in your packet is intended to be a brief update on what you will be receiving in January. We will be doing this review at the January 22nd regular Finance Committee meeting. We will be giving you department level budget projections. As far as proposed adjustments we have outlined here what we are proposing for review at the meeting. They are competitive police pay, comp and class study and the Midtown Campus.

Chair Abeyta asked you will provide us with where we are relative to the project itself.

Ms. McCoy said correct. These are the items you will be taking action on. We will present a complete package.

Chair Abeyta asked is there anything else the Committee would like to see at this review.

Chair Abeyta said we have not done this before so this is a first run at it. He would like to see a prep or heads up on what we can expect moving into the budget itself. Maybe at the end provide us with looking forward such as this is what we think the next year budget will be.

Ms. McCoy said yes we can include that as well.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked are you going to be discussing any other things

besides these things that are the big things.

Ms. McCoy said these are the items we will be bringing for adjustments at midyear. They would regularly come to the Committee as budget adjustments. With this process we are packaging these together in a more compressive way.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked will we be looking at or given an overview of just the revenue side and how our revenue sources are doing. We need to understand and start positioning both sides of the budget so we can see where the struggle is and that we don't have all the money we would like to have and there will be limits to what the money can do and understand how that works.

Ms. McCoy said we are going to do an indepth review. We plan, at this meeting, to take you through Department by Department to show you the revenue and expense side to give some understanding to where we are at mid-year and where we stand. This will enable us to start to understand where we are overspending our budget and start proposing how to manage that. Everything is up for discussion with Department Directors in front of this Committee. These conversations will be happening on a monthly basis where we cover budgets with Department Directors so we can be more nimble and make adjustments throughout the year.

Councilor Romero-Wirth said based on tonight's conversation, do we have a sense of how many dedicated funds we have in City government and how they are used. Sometimes it is better for a fund to go to the General Fund for prioritization. Are we in a position to have this conversation.

Ms. McCoy said those are questions that we are asking as well. We can schedule regular updates in front of the Committee so we all have that information. Our Chart of Accounts has been raised in several audits saying it is overly complicated and overly cumbersome. We can make those decisions in this Body. It does warrant a complete review. Especially as we are looking at how to create a rainy day fund.

Councilor Romero-Wirth asked is that above and beyond Reserves.

Ms. McCoy said correct.

Chair Abeyta said so the mid-year review will be on Tuesday, January 22nd. The day after the Martin Luther King holiday at 5:00 pm.

9. MATTERS FROM THE COMMITTEE

Chair Abeyta asked Mary, can you start researching the Affordable Housing Trust Fund. What are the different types of revenue funds that can go in there. Also he does want to get back to looking at processes we have in place or changes we need to make to start disposing of City property. Is there a path forward for doing that. We want to sell property now when the economy is good.

Ms. McCoy said we would be happy to look into both those items and get back to the Body.
