11	DIRECTING STAFF TO CONDUCT A FEASIBILITY STUDY FOR THE DEVELOPMENT
12	OF A SUSTAINABILITY DEMONSTRATION CENTER, INCLUDING A SITE ANALYSIS,
13	TO DETERMINE WHERE ON CITY AND/OR COUNTY OWNED LAND, INCLUDING
14	THE AREA OF GENOVEVA CHAVEZ COMMUNITY CENTER AND THE COUNTY FAIR
15	GROUNDS OR ADJACENT TO THE CHILDREN'S MUSEUM, A SUSTAINABILITY
16	DEMONSTRATION CENTER COULD BE ACCOMMODATED.
17	
18	WHEREAS, the Governing Body endorsed the U.S. Mayors Climate Protection
19	Agreement through the adoption of Resolution No. 2006-54; and
20	WHEREAS, by adopting Resolution No. 2006-55 the Governing Body
21	encourages more aggressive green building development through incentives and rewards
22	to work toward the goals of the 2030 challenge; and
23	WHEREAS, the Sustainable Santa Fe Plan ("Plan") includes a strong education and
24	outreach program as the key to implementation of all aspects of the Plan; and

1 WHEREAS, the Plan includes the development of ecological intensive greenhouses such 2 as the urban model "Growing Power"; and 3 WHEREAS, Frank Oppenheimer, physicist and founder of the Exploratorium in Santa 4 Francisco said "The hands-on science movement has been - and remains - the single most potent 5 force for change in museums of science...enabling people to feel at home with scientific insights 6 into the natural world, by giving them the opportunity to develop these insights for themselves 7 through first-hand experience"; and 8 WHEREAS, much of the information needed to fully understand the components of 9 sustainability are technical and lend themselves to hands-on learning; and 10 WHEREAS, the Santa Fe City and County have been working together to further the 11 benefits of sustainable technologies for both community well-being and green job creation; and 12 WHEREAS, several local non-profit organizations have expressed the desire to partner 13 with the City and County to develop a Center that would demonstrate and teach concepts of 14 sustainable technologies to the general public; and 15 WHEREAS, the Santa Fe Community College has recently broken ground on the new 16 Sustainable Technologies Center; and 17 WHEREAS, the Santa Fe Community College has expressed its support of a 18 Sustainability Demonstration Center as an introduction to sustainability technologies to the 19 community; and 20 WHEREAS, the Genoveva Chavez Community Center and the Santa Fe County Fair 21 Grounds are places where the Santa Fe community goes for a wide range of community activities. 22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY 23 OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE that staff is directed to study the feasibility of 24 developing a Sustainability Demonstration Center, including a site analysis, to determine 25 where on city and/or county owned land, including the area of Genoveva Chavez

Community Center and the County Fair Grounds or adjacent to the Children's Museum, a
Sustainability Demonstration Center could be accommodated.

3	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body encourages Santa Fe County
4	to pass a similar resolution and that both entities convene a group of City and County staff along
5	with appropriate local non-profits to develop a detailed vision and program for a Sustainability
6	Demonstration Center including a budget and plan for on-going funding after such a Center is
7	established.
