1. CALL TO ORDER

A regular meeting of the Public Works/CIP & Land Use Committee was called to order on the above date by Chair Patti Bushee at approximately 5:15 p.m. in City Council Chambers, City Hall, 200 Lincoln, Santa Fe, New Mexico

2. ROLL CALL

Roll Call indicated the presence of a quorum as follows:

3. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Councilor Calvert moved to approve the agenda as presented. Councilor Romero seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.

4. APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

Councilor Calvert moved to approve the Consent Agenda as published. Councilor Trujillo seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.

5. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM FEBRUARY 23, 2009, PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE MEETING

Mr. Romero noted that Wendy Blackwell had brought some comments. He recommended they postpone so Mr. Boaz could review them.

Councilor Romero moved to postpone approval of the minutes of February 23, 2009. Councilor Calvert seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.

INFORMATIONAL AGENDA

6. OVERVIEW OF PLAZA IMPROVEMENT (ROBERT ROMERO)

Mr. Romero reminded them that in the minutes from last time the Committee agreed to look at several options for the electrical panel and transformer to see if a redesign could make it less obtrusive and to look at relocating them across the street or under or near the existing stage and what that might cost.

They looked at several other areas, evaluating base lines for landscaping and irrigation purposes and possibly moving some features underground or nearer to the street. They were also looking at how they might reduce the size and/or location of irrigation monitors. He reported that they repaint some of the equipment black and some green. He said when they concluded their study they would report back.

The Committee briefly discussed some of the mentioned alternatives regarding aesthetics and costs. To questions about the details of the equipment involved, Mr. Romero gave clarifications.

Ms. Manlyn Bane, 622½ B Canyon Road reminded Mr. Romero that he agreed he would look at the lighting fixtures around the plaza and the other thing was the national landmark plaque.

Mr. Romero agreed. He said they had installed some of the lighting fixtures on San Francisco and Cathedral Park and planned to use the same type lighting fixtures for the Plaza. They were now looking at the cost involved.

Chair Bushee described them.

Mr. Romero added that as part of the Cultural Resources Report, a brand new plaque would be placed in the Plaza to show it was a national landmark.

Ms. Bane commented that Chair Bushee was great at the meeting. She was grateful for the attention given to the landscaping. Mr. Romero was also great. She was thrilled that everyone could get behind the landscape report including NPS, SHPO and City Parks. It was a very thick report but would be great if they could use it.

Chair Bushee noted that Mr. Chavez was working on the irrigation.

Councilor Romero asked if he could get the report on CD.

Mr. Romero agreed. He said it was an excellent document and thought it was on the website.

Councilor Romero agreed to look there first.

Chair Bushee added that there would be a public hearing on it.

She suggested perhaps coyote fencing might be more appropriate for that area. She also hoped people would walk that trail. She said DOT did a good job on it.

Councilor Calvert noted when he took Rail Runner recently the walls along there looked terrible.

Mr. Romero replied that Warehouse 21 talked with him about doing murals all along there and felt that would be good to do.

Councilor Calvert commented that Gonzales Elementary did great with tile insets down to the river.

Councilor Trujillo asked if they could change the green paint to brown there.

Chair Bushee brought to Mr. Romero's attention a crosswalk with a parking space right in front of it.

Mr. Romero said he would take a look at it.

Chair Bushee noted that when BTAC had the public hearing on NWQ a woman spoke who said the work planned there would prevent access to her house.

Mr. Romero agreed to check on it.
