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18	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE:
19	Section 1. Section 24-1.1 SFCC 1987 (being Ord. #2006-34 as amended) is
20	amended to read:
21	24-1.1 Creation of City of Santa Fe Uniform Traffic Code.
22	A. Pursuant to Section 3-17-6 NMSA 1978, the New Mexico Uniform Traffic
23	Ordinance 2004 Compilation containing [all] revisions through [April 2008] July 2009, compiled
24	by the New Mexico municipal league is adopted by reference and incorporated as if fully set out
25	herein, except as amended by the governing body. The New Mexico Uniform Traffic Ordinance

1	2004 Compilation containing all revisions through [April 2008] July 2009 and as amended by the
2	governing body shall be known as the "city of Santa Fe uniform traffic code".
3	B. The city of Santa Fe uniform traffic code shall be maintained as a separate
4	compilation and be kept on file at the police department and the city clerk's office and shall be, at
5	all reasonable times, available and subject to inspection. A copy of the uniform traffic code is
6	available to any individual upon request and payment of a reasonable charge as set by the city.

8	Section 2. Section 24-1.2 SFCC 1987 (Ord. #2006-34, §5 as amended) is
9	amended to read:

12	the city of Santa Fe uniform traffic code, other than those related to parking, is adopted] The
13	traffic violation penalty assessment schedule is included in the city of Santa Fe uniform traffic

16	Section 3. Section 24-1.3 SFCC 1987 (Ord. #2006-34, §6 as amended) is

20	the city of Santa Fe uniform traffic code related to parking is adopted.] The parking violation
21	fines schedule is included in the city of Santa Fe uniform traffic code.

23	Section 4. Section 12-1-42.1 of the City of Santa Fe Uniform Traffic Code
24	(being Ord. #2006-34) is amended to read:
25	<u>12-1-42.1</u> <u>OFF-HIGHWAY MOTOR VEHICLE.</u> "Off-Highway Motor Vehicle" means
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1	a motor vehicle designed by the manufacturer for operation exclusively off the highway or road
2	and includes:
3	(1) "all-terrain vehicle", which means a motor vehicle fifty inches or less in width,
4	having an unladen dry weight of one thousand pounds or less, traveling on three or more low-
5	pressure tires and having a seat designed to be straddled by the operator and handlebar-type
6	steering control; or
7	(2) "off-highway motorcycle", which means a motor vehicle traveling on not more
8	than two tires and having a seat designed to be straddled by the operator and that has handlebar-
9	type steering control. (66-3-1001.1 NMSA 1978) (Ord. No. 2007-32)
10	(3) "recreational off-highway vehicle," which means a motor vehicle designed for
11	travel on four or more non-highway tires, for recreational use by one or more persons and having;
12	(a) a steering wheel for steering control;
13	(b) non-straddle seating;
14	(c) maximum speed capability greater than 35 miles per hour;
15	(d) gross vehicle weight rating no greater than 1,750 pounds;
16	(e) less than 80 inches in overall width, exclusive of accessories;
17	(f) engine displacement of less than 1,000 cubic centimeters; and
18	(g) identification by means of a 17-character vehicle identification number;

20	(4) by rule of the department, any other vehicles that may enter the market that fit the
21	general profile of vehicles operated off-highway for recreational purposes.

24	Section 5. Section 12-7-9.2 of the City of Santa Fe Uniform Traffic Code (being

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1 **OPERATION OF OFF-HIGHWAY MOTOR VEHICLES ON STREETS** 12-7-9.2 2 **OR HIGHWAYS**. 3 Α. No person shall operate an off-highway motor vehicle on any limited access 4 street at any time. 5 Β. Off-highway motor vehicles may cross streets or highways if the crossings are 6 made after coming to a complete stop prior to entering the street. These motor vehicles shall 7 yield the right of way to oncoming traffic and shall begin a crossing only when it can be executed 8 safely and then crossing in the most direct manner, as close to a perpendicular angle as possible. 9 Unless authorized, a person shall not: C. 10 remove, deface or destroy any official sign installed by a state, federal, (1) 11 local or private land management agency; or 12 install any off-highway motor vehicle-related sign. (66-3-1011 NMSA) (2)13 Editor's Note: This amendment shall be incorporated into the City of Santa Fe Uniform Traffic 14 Code, a separate compilation. 15 Section 6. Section 12-7-9.5 of the City of Santa Fe Uniform Traffic Code (being 16 Ord. #2006-34) is amended to read: 17 ACCIDENTS AND ACCIDENT REPORTS. [Any operator] The driver of an <u>12-7-9.5</u> 18 off-highway motor vehicle involved in an accident resulting in injuries to, or the death of, any 19 person, or resulting in damage to public or private property to the extent of [fifty dollars (\$50.00)] 20 five hundred dollars (\$500) or more, shall immediately notify a police officer or the police 21 department of the accident and the facts relating to the accident. If the driver is under the age of 22 eighteen, the driver's parent or legal guardian shall immediately notify a law enforcement agency 23 of the accident and the facts relating to the accident. 17	contributed to the cause of an accident resulting in injury or death to any person. When an alleged

19	notice of penalty assessment, the fine imposed upon later conviction shall not exceed the penalty	
20	assessment established for the particular penalty assessment misdemeanor and probation imposed

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SECTION 4. TRAFFIC CALMING FEES

A. Persons violating speed limits within the city have created a need for traffic
calming. The governing body has determined that those persons violating the speed limits should
pay additional fees. The purpose of the additional fees is to discourage speeding within the city
and to provide funds for the city's traffic calming program.

B. The city hereby imposes a traffic calming fee equal to the maximum fine
(excluding court fees) to be paid by any person convicted of a speeding violation as set forth in
the Uniform Traffic Ordinance as adopted by the city, the total of which shall not exceed the
jurisdictional limits of the court. The traffic calming fee applies to all violations of Section 12-61.2, but the traffic calming fee is not doubled.

14C.The traffic calming fee shall be collected by the municipal court for funding the15city's traffic calming program. The amount of fees collected shall not decrease the amount of16money allocated to the traffic calming program through the current fiscal year Capital

17 Improvement Program bonding process.

D. The governing body shall review the results of this subsection including the
amount of fees which have been collected and the amount of police overtime because of this
subsection. The municipal court shall provide the governing body with the appropriate statistics
to review this subsection.

22 SECTION 5. MUNICIPAL COURT FEES

In addition to the penalty assessment established pursuant to this Exhibit, there shall be assessed
the municipal court fees for each penalty assessment misdemeanor as set forth in Section 1-3.2
SFCC 1987.

1 SECTION 6. PENALTY ASSESSMENT MISDEMEANORS; OPTION; EFFECT 2 Α. Unless a warning notice is given, at the time of making an arrest for any penalty 3 assessment misdemeanor, the arresting officer shall offer the alleged violator the option of 4 accepting a penalty assessment. The violator's signature on the penalty assessment notice 5 constitutes an acknowledgement of guilt of the offense stated in the notice, and payment of the 6 prescribed penalty assessment is a complete satisfaction of the violation. 7 Β. Payment of any penalty assessment shall be made by mail to the Municipal 8 Court, City of Santa Fe, P.O. Box 909, Santa Fe, New Mexico, 87504-0909 within 30 days from 9 the date of arrest. Payments of penalty assessments are timely if postmarked within the time 10 limits set from the date of arrest. The Municipal Court shall issue a receipt when a penalty 11 assessment is paid by currency, but a check or money order tendered by the violator upon which 12 payment is received is sufficient receipt. 13 С. No record of any penalty assessment payment is admissible as evidence in any 14 court in any civil action. 15 SECTION 7. FAILURE TO PAY PENALTY ASSESSMENT 16 Α. If a penalty assessment is not paid within 30 days from the date of arrest, the 17 violator shall be prosecuted for the violation charged on the penalty assessment notice in a 18 manner as if the penalty assessment notice had not been issued. Upon conviction in such 19 prosecution, the court shall impose penalties as provided for by the New Mexico Uniform Traffic 20 Ordinance (Section 12-12-1.1), or other law relating to motor vehicles for the particular offense

- 21 charge, and the scheduled penalty assessment shall not apply.
- B. In addition to the prosecution provided for in Section A above, it is a
 misdemeanor for any person who has elected to pay a penalty assessment to fail to do so within
 30 days from the date of arrest.
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C. The municipal court shall notify the motor vehicle division of the state of New

1	Mexico when a person fails to pay a penalty assessment within the required period of time. The
2	motor vehicle division shall report the notice upon the driver's record and shall not renew the
3	person's license to drive until the municipal court notifies the motor vehicle division that the
4	penalty assessment, or its equivalent, as well as any additional penalties imposed are properly
5	disposed of.
6	SECTION 8 VIOLATIONS NOT LISTED ON PENALTY ASSESSMENT SCHEDULE.
7	This traffic violation penalty assessment schedule does not apply to traffic violations not listed
8	above which are petty misdemeanors. Such violations mandate a court appearance with a fine of
9	up to three hundred dollars (\$300) and up to 90 days in jail.
