10	A RESOLUTION
11	SUPPORTING STATEWIDE LEGISLATION THAT WOULD PROTECT KIDS,
12	WORKERS, AND PEOPLE WITH BREATHING PROBLEMS BY ELIMINATING
13	SMOKING IN WORKPLACES – INCLUDING RESTAURANTS, BARS, OFFICES AND
14	OTHER INDOOR PUBLIC PLACES.
15	
16	WHEREAS, the United States Surgeon General has declared that there is NO safe level
17	of exposure to secondhand smoke, which remains a leading cause of preventable death in the
18	United States; and
19	WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has warned that all
20	patients at increased risk of coronary heart disease or with known coronary artery disease should
21	avoid any indoor environments in which smoking occurs; and
22	WHEREAS, nonsmokers who are exposed to secondhand smoke increase their risk of
23	developing heart disease by 25-30%; and
24	WHEREAS, children who breathe secondhand smoke are more likely to suffer from
25	serious and costly illnesses including pneumonia, bronchitis, asthma, and middle-ear infections;

2	WHEREAS, employees such as waiters, waitresses, and bartenders who have exposure
3	to secondhand smoke on a daily basis are twice as likely to fall victim to a heart attack and are
4	nearly twice as likely to develop lung cancer due to involuntary exposure to secondhand smoke;
5	and
6	WHEREAS, the United States Surgeon General has declared the only effective way to
7	prevent secondhand smoke exposure for workers indoors is to provide completely smoke-free
8	workplace environments; and
9	WHEREAS, secondhand smoke can trigger serious adult breathing problems including
10	asthma and allergies and make it dangerous for persons with breathing problems to access indoor
11	places where smoking is permitted.
12	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE GOVERNING BODY OF
13	THE CITY OF SANTA FE that the Governing Body supports the New Mexicans Concerned
14	About Tobacco (NMCAT), the American Cancer Society, the American Heart Association, and
15	the American Lung Association in supporting a strong statewide law that protects kids, workers,
16	and people with breathing problems from secondhand smoke in public places and workplaces,
17	including restaurants and bars.
18	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such statewide law would not preempt local
19	communities from adopting local policies expanding statewide secondhand smoke protections.
20	PASSED, APPROVED, AND ADOPTED this 10th day of January, 2007.
