1.1 CITY OF SANTA FE, NEW MEXICO 2 **RESOLUTION NO. 2011 - 8** 3 INTRODUCED BY: 4 **Mayor Coss** 5 Councilor Wurzburger 6 Councilor Romero 7 8 9 10 A RESOLUTION 11 DIRECTING STAFF TO REQUEST AND NEGOTIATE A LEASE WITH THE SANTA FE RAILYARD COMMUNITY CORPORATION FOR THE ATCHISON, TOPEKA AND 12 13 SANTA FE DEPOT LOCATED ON THE RAILYARD TO BE USED BY THE 14 CONVENTION AND VISITORS' BUREAU AS A VISITORS' CENTER; AND TO 15 NEGOTIATE OPERATING AGREEMENTS WITH THE SANTA FE SOUTHERN 16 RAILWAY AND THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR USE OF THE 17 RAILROAD CORRIDOR. 18 19 WHEREAS, there is a need for the Santa Fe Convention and Visitors' Bureau to have a 20 presence on the Railyard in order to provide information and services to passengers traveling on 21 the Rail Runner as well as to visitors to the Railyard; and 22 WHEREAS, the historic Atchison, Topeka, and Santa Fe Depot has been identified in 23 the Railyard Master Plan as best suited to provide neighborhood scale connections between the 24 rail, city bus, bicycle and pedestrian systems and would be an ideal location for the visitors'

WHEREAS, creating a visitors' center and preserving the Depot are both concepts reflected in the Railyard Master Plan; and

WHEREAS, on September 8, 2004, the Governing Body approved a memorandum of understanding among and by the City of Santa Fe, the City of Santa Fe Archaeological Review Committee, the New Mexico State Historic Preservation Officer, the New Mexico Cultural Properties Review Committee, the Santa Fe Railyard Community Corporation, and the Trust for Public Land regarding redevelopment of the Santa Fe Railyard; and

WHEREAS, previously, the city initiated plans to use the nearby state archive building for a regional scale multi-modal transfer center to provide services for the Rail Runner passengers (Resolution No. 2009-48); however, the project is not anticipated to be designed and completed in the near future; and

WHEREAS, the Depot site and the state archive building site in the long term are contemplated by the Railyard Master Plan for activities accommodating connections between the Rail Runner, city buses, bikes, pedestrians, taxis and hotel shuttles and could serve as phase one of the previously planned multi-modal center at the state archives building providing services including, but not limited to, a welcome kiosk with promotional materials and bus, shuttle and train schedules; taxi cab and pedicab stands; counters for bicycle, moped, electric car, scooter, and traditional car rental agencies; newspaper sales/sundries shop and/or café/pastry shop; Santa Fe Southern Railway ticket and merchandise sales; waiting area; and restrooms; and

WHEREAS, although the city owns the Depot, it is within the city's overall lease of the Railyard to the Santa Fe Railyard Community Corporation and thus, the Corporation would need to lease the Depot back to the city; and

WHEREAS, currently, the Depot is occupied by the Santa Fe Southern Railway for its excursion railroad ticket and related merchandise sales office; and

WHEREAS, the Santa Fe Southern Railway lease of the Santa Fe Depot from the Santa

Fe Railyard Community Corporation has expired and is currently leased on a month-to-month basis; and

WHEREAS, the Depot has adequate space, as determined by staff from the Public Works Department and the Convention and Visitors' Bureau, to accommodate both the needed Convention and Visitors' Bureau functions as well other possible tenants including, but not limited to, the Santa Fe Southern Railway if the Santa Fe Southern Railway is unable to locate another space on the Railyard; and

WHEREAS, although the city owns the railroad corridor (tracks and adjacent rights-of-way) used by the Santa Fe Southern Railway and the Rail Runner, there is no comprehensive agreement between the city and Santa Fe Southern Railway or the New Mexico Department of Transportation governing operational issues such as usage, safety, maintenance and environmental concerns related to the Santa Fe Southern Railway and the Rail Runner; and

WHEREAS, there is a desire to formalize the terms under which the Santa Fe Southern Railway and the Rail Runner operate at the Railyard in order to best address functional, safety, environmental and aesthetic concerns that have arisen; and

WHEREAS, currently, Track 1 located in the Railyard is reserved by Santa Fe Southern Railway for its use, except for scheduled Rail Runner service; however, if Track 1 were made available to the Rail Runner and additional electrical service installed, the Rail Runner could silently "recharge" thus avoiding its current practice of idling between scheduled trips behind residential neighborhoods and significantly minimizing noise and visual impacts in the city; and

WHEREAS, the Santa Fe Metropolitan Transportation Plan 2010-2035, approved by the Metropolitan Planning Organization's Transportation Policy Board on October 20th, 2010, includes a policy that "The City and the State should optimize the use of rail infrastructure on site (Railyard) to avoid running empty trains through the City"; and

WHEREAS, in order for the Santa Fe Depot to serve as a visitors' center and multi-

modal facility it is first necessary to conclude Santa Fe Southern Railway's lease of the Santa Fe Depot.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE that the Santa Fe Railyard Community Corporation is requested to conclude its lease with the Santa Fe Southern Railway for the Santa Fe Depot in accordance with the terms of said lease.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the city manager is directed to:

- 1. Develop a phased plan for the Santa Fe Depot, in consideration of the future multi-modal center planned for the state archive building site, for the purpose of operating a visitors' information center and related services in the Depot including necessary building improvements, operational requirements (including, but not limited to, staffing, custodial services and building maintenance), and related budgets;
- 2. Request and negotiate a lease with the Santa Fe Railyard Community

 Corporation so that the Convention and Visitors' Bureau may operate a visitors' information

 center in the Depot;
 - 3. Negotiate appropriate subleases for the provision of related visitor services;
- 4. Negotiate operating agreements with the Santa Fe Southern Railway and the New Mexico Department of Transportation to address use of the railroad corridor as well as safety, maintenance, environmental and aesthetic concerns related to the operation of the Santa Fe Southern Railway and the Rail Runner including details regarding the impacts on adjacent residential neighborhoods along the entire railroad corridor in the city.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that staff is directed to complete the above tasks and the minimal necessary improvement to the Depot, consistent with the memorandum of understanding regarding redevelopment of the Railyard entered into on September 8, 2004, in order for the Convention and Visitors' Bureau to occupy the Depot no later than May 1, 2011.
