## 1 CITY OF SANTA FE, NEW MEXICO 2 **RESOLUTION NO. 2011-28** 3 **INTRODUCED BY:** 4 **Mayor Coss** 5 Councilor Trujillo 6 Councilor Romero 7 8 9 10 A RESOLUTION 11 AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF SANTA FE TO SUPPORT A LIVING SANTA FE 12 RIVER BY ALLOWING WATER TO BYPASS McCLURE AND NICHOLS 13 **RESERVOIRS IN 2011.** 14 WHEREAS, the origin of the City of Santa Fe was due to the existence of the Santa Fe 15 River, and the subsequent history of Santa Fe, the development of the City's unique culture, and 16 the development of tourism in Santa Fe depended on the River; and 17 18 WHEREAS, there is widespread community support to revive the Santa Fe River for 19 recreation, wildlife habitat; and WHEREAS, in order to provide for the water supply needs of the Santa Fe community, 20 the majority of the water from Santa Fe River upper watershed has recently been captured in the 21 22 McClure and Nichols Reservoirs; and WHEREAS, the community has many events planned in 2011 that would benefit from a 23 24 flowing river, such as commUNITY days, the Santa Fe River Festival and Fishing Derby on June 25 4th, 2011, the numerous blessings of the River such as San Isidro feast day celebrations in Agua

1	Fria Village and at Cristo Rey Church, Spanish Market, Indian Market, and Fiestas; and
2	WHEREAS, a flowing river supports an ecosystem for aquatic organisms and riparian
3	habitat for wildlife; and
4	WHEREAS, a flowing river supports plant communities that protect the river channel,
5	stabilize the banks, inhibit erosion, and help reduce potential property damage from floods; and
6	WHEREAS, a flowing river makes possible riparian systems that provide a natural
7	cleansing system to remove toxins and other pollutants from storm water that flows into the Santa
8	Fe River; and
9	WHEREAS, a flowing river contributes to aquifer recharge; and
10	WHEREAS, a flowing river creates a peaceful retreat from the hurried pace of city life
11	and environmental education opportunities for people of all ages; and
12	WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe and Santa Fe County are developing a continuous
13	system of trails, parks, and open space along the river corridor from its upper reaches to NM 599
14	to provide new recreational opportunities and transportation alternatives for residents and visitors
15	and
16	WHEREAS, the river water bypassed in 2011 will provide the Santa Fe River
17	Commission the opportunity to collect necessary physical, biological, chemical, and ecological
18	data and measurements on and along the river to assist in understanding the river system; and
19	WHEREAS, the City desires to protect the Santa Fe River as the northernmost segment
20	of the historic, international route of El Camino Real del Tierra Adentro between Ciudad Mexico
21	and Santa Fe; and
22	WHEREAS, the conservation efforts of the Santa Fe community have resulted in
23	significantly less water use every year since 2001, with the gallon per capita per day (gpcpd)
24	demand going from 168 gpcpd in 1995 to below 100 gpcpd in 2010; and
25	WHEREAS, the Santa Fe River currently provides up to 50% of the City's potable wate

supply needs; and

WHEREAS, allowing surface water to bypass the City's reservoir so that it flows in the river may require additional groundwater pumping to supplement surface water for the City's water supply; and

WHEREAS, the Buckman Direct Diversion Project, has begun to provide additional water supply that can support the City of Santa Fe's vision for a living river as well as a safe, reliable, and sustainable drinking water supply; and

WHEREAS, the City has perfected its Santa Fe River surface water right under License 1677 (as issued by the State Engineer) and fully intends to continue to put that water to beneficial use, and the enactment of this resolution will not adversely affect the City's water right under License 1677; and

WHEREAS, the City finds that actions resolved in this resolution are beneficial to the City and consistent with its municipal purposes; and

WHEREAS, nothing under this resolution will cause the City to operate the municipal water utility in a way that is inconsistent with any local, state or federal rules, regulations, or laws; and

WHEREAS, releases will be made as necessary by the municipal water utility for reservoir flood management; and

WHEREAS, information regarding reservoir releases, quantity of water bypassing the reservoirs, reservoir levels, water use, and stream flow will be made available to the public via the City's web page as it becomes available.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE that:

1. Based on the April 15, 2011 forecasted yield of the Santa Fe River watershed at the 'above McClure' stream gage, the City shall allow water to bypass Nichols Reservoir, in an

1	amount not to exceed 300 acre feet per year, in a manner consistent with the terms of the
2	document "Summary Report of Recommendations, 1000 Acre Feet Per Year Bypass Flows,
3	2/2/2011" developed through extensive public consideration and subsequently approved by the
4	Santa Fe River Commission.
5	2. City staff shall provide monthly updates to the River Commission and monthly
6	updates to the Public Utilities Committee on the rates and volume of water bypassed, reservoir
7	status, and water supply projections.
8	3. The Water Division shall regulate the bypass flows, which regulation may
9	include reducing or eliminating, the bypass flows as necessary for operational or emergency
10	reasons.
11	4. The Water Division shall report to the Public Utilities Committee and the Public
12	Works Committee on how to manage bypass flows on expected peak days during the summer of
13	2011.
14	5. In the event of a declared emergency, bypass flows shall be adjusted to ensure
15	that no pumping of groundwater is required to support bypass flows.
