10 **A RESOLUTION**

11 **DIRECTING STAFF TO EXPLORE THE OPTIONS AND THE FEASIBILITY FOR**
12 **ACQUIRING SECURITY AT THE SANTA FE RAILYARD.**

14 **WHEREAS**, the City of Santa Fe owns the Santa Fe Railyard which is comprised of 50 acres
15 of parks, public spaces, and commercial development, and

16 **WHEREAS**, the Railyard is the new gathering place for all of Santa Fe's residents and
17 visitors alike; and

18 **WHEREAS**, the City of Santa Fe is responsible for security of the public spaces at the
19 Railyard, including the Park, Plaza and Alameda; and

20 **WHEREAS**, there have been increasing instances of police calls to the Railyard because of
21 criminal activity that is taking place, and

22 **WHEREAS**, such criminal activity includes vandalism, graffiti, assaults, robberies, and
23 public drunkenness; and

24 **WHEREAS**, the City has entered into security contracts at various City facilities to ensure
25 that criminal activity is deterred; and

1 **WHEREAS**, such facilities, include, the Santa Fe Community Convention Center, the
2 Genoveva Chavez Community Center, Municipal Court, water facilities, parking facilities and library
3 facilities; and

4 **WHEREAS**, in the interest of public health, safety and welfare for residents and visitors to
5 the Santa Fe Railyard, the Governing Body desires to take a proactive approach by exploring the
6 options and the feasibility for acquiring security at the Railyard that will aid in the reduction of crime.

7 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE**
8 **CITY OF SANTA FE** that staff is directed to explore the options and the feasibility for acquiring
9 security at the Santa Fe Railyard.


10 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that within 30 days of the adoption of this resolution, staff


