MINUTES

I. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by the Acting Chair, Kerri Segell at 5:00 pm. A quorum was declared by roll call.

II. Roll Call

III. Approval of Agenda

Ms. Pratt added under the Report of Director: b. Advocacy Letter regarding National Endowment for the Arts.

Ms. Sakiestewa moved to approve the agenda as amended, second by Ms. Pedersen, motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

IV. Approval of Minutes of December 13, 2010

Corrections: Ms. Anne Pedersen (Name misspelled throughout minutes)

Ms. Sakiestewa moved to approve the minutes of December 13, 2010 as corrected, second by Ms. Springer, motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

V. Report of the Director - Sabrina Pratt

a. Financial Report:

The Financial Report was distributed to the commissioners for review. It was noted that at the end of January, 2011 we are down by -2.97% and up by 8.75% from last year at this time. Clarification offered was that January receipts are for December room sales.

b. March 12, 2011 - Retreat

Draft agenda was discussed. Meeting would be held on March 12, 2011 from 8:30 am ending at 2:30 pm. The Chair is interested in talking about the role that the Commission takes on advocacy. There may be a guest speaker to discuss opportunities in advocacy. This topic would be discussed from 8:30 am to 2:00 pm; the business portion of the meeting would take place between 2:00 pm and 2:30 pm. Ms. Sakiestewa supported the idea of bringing someone to speak on advocacy. She recommends that a clear understanding of what the Commission is seeking be communicated to the guest speaker. Meeting location to be determined and announced.

c. Advocacy letter regarding National Endowment for the Arts.

The Director shared with the commissioners a draft letter from the Chair to be sent to the New Mexico-US Congressional Delegation regarding the status and position of the Arts Commission of the National Endowment for the Arts. The letter will be co-signed by the members of the Arts Commission.

It was suggested that this letter be sent to the Albuquerque Journal, the New Mexican and the NEA.

Ms. Sakiestewa moved to approve the draft letter to the National Endowment for the Arts with noted spelling corrections, second by Mr. Chavez, motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

VI. Committee Reports

a. Art in Public Places Committee

i. Nominating Committee Recommendation
Ms. Garcia y Griego, on behalf of the Art in Public Places
Committee recommended the following individuals to fill two
current vacancies on the committee. Both individuals have
experience and expertise that fit the committee composition criteria
of the Art in Public Places Guidelines. Each would serve a 4-year

term. Ms. Eileen Wells and Mr. Geoffrey Gorman. (CV's were attached for review).

Mr. Chavez moved to approve Ms. Eileen Wells and Mr. Geoffrey Gorman to serve on the Art and Public Places Committee, second by Ms. Sakiestewa, motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

ii. Santa Fe Trails: Tinwork RFQ Selection Committee

The RFP selection committee for the Santa Fe Trails Bus Shelters - Spanish Colonial Designs was recommended to the Commissioners for approval. Those recommended are: Alexander Dzuree, Principal, Josef Diaz, Curator, New Mexico History Museum, Drew McDermott (non-voting), Jon Bulthuis, Director for Santa Fe Trails Transit, Destiny Allen, Artist and a Transit Advisory Board Member.

b. Funding Policy Committee

Ms. Singer moved to approve the Grant Review Panel recommendations, second by Ms. Pedersen, motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

c. Special Projects Committee: Poster Competition and Mayor's Awards Update – Julie Bystrom

The special projects committee met regarding the poster competition and the Mayor's Awards Update. They have announced that August 15, 2011 will be the entry deadline for the poster competition, August 26th will be

the date for judging and exhibition will follow in 2 weeks. The theme is still being discussed. This year they voted to attach an age eligibility to it as they have never had an age condition; it will be 18 years or older. It was also decided that they were not going to produce the poster; they would like to go electronic. They are still towing with the cost of producing cards. If they go electronic on the poster it can be used widely for marketing. The Committee felt that it was a better use of the budget and that this concept would work. Ms. Pedersen asked what the cost has been in past years. Ms. Bystrom said that the cost is about \$2700 for production and they continue to have posters in stock. In the past they have reduced the production amount from 1200 to 600 and they still have them in stock.

Mayor's Awards Dinner: The committee announced that they are looking at a Launch date of May 13, 2011 for the nomination date and the nomination form should be available on-line in a week. They will be bringing the Special Projects Committee and CRAM together to work in creative marketing plans for the nomination process for the dinner itself. They also would like to encourage the commission members to send possible names of individuals or organizations who would purchase a full table for the event. Last year was very successful as organizations came together and purchased a full table. The cost of the tickets will be reviewed and announced at a following meeting.
