Councilor Wurzburger said the contract has been let as part of a larger contract, and she has asked City legal to see if there s a possibility of revisiting that decision.

Councilor Trujillo told mr. Romero he would like to be a part of any of the Pecos League discussions.

Councilor Bushee

Councilor Bushee introduced a Resolution adopting, as City policy, the La Tierra Trails Master Plan for use by the City as a guide for development of City wilderness trails and open space in the Northwest Quadrant. A copy of the Resolution is incorporated herewith to these minutes as Exhibit "3."
