1 CITY OF SANTA FE, NEW MEXICO RESOLUTION NO. 2008-20 2 3 INTRODUCED BY: Miguel Chary 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 A RESOLUTION 11 AUTHORIZING STAFF TO SEEK SECTION 595 ENVIRONMENTAL INFRASTRUCTURE 12 AND RESOURCE PROTECTION ASSISTANCE FUNDING FROM THE U.S. ARMY 13 CORPS OF ENGINEERS FOR THE CITY'S CANYON ROAD WATER TREATMENT 14 PLANT PHASE III RESIDUALS HANDLING IMPROVEMENT PROJECT. 15 16 WHEREAS, Section 595 of the Water Resources Development Act 1999, as amended, 17 provides authority for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to enter into cost sharing agreements 18 with non-federal sponsors on publicly owned environmental projects; and 19 WHEREAS, under Section 595 authority, assistance may be in the form of design and 20 construction for water related environmental infrastructure and resource protection and 21 development projects including projects for wastewater treatment and related facilities, water 22 supply, environmental restoration, and surface water resource protection and development; and 23 WHEREAS, project costs are shared on a 75% federal, 25% non-federal basis; and 24 WHEREAS, the city's Canyon Road water treatment plant phase III residuals handling 25 improvement project is a qualified project to receive Section 595 assistance; and

WHEREAS, because of the age of the Canyon Road water treatment plant, modifications to the facility's unit processes have been required in order to maintain effective treatment capabilities conforming to the Safe Drinking Water Act provisions;

WHEREAS, the phase III residuals handling improvement project at the Canyon Road water treatment plant is required to meet upcoming regulations for the handling, processing and disposal of water treatment plant residuals as well as to meet the current needs of a reliable surface water facility; and

WHEREAS, currently there is no redundancy in the residuals process which could easily lead to a complete shutdown of the facility and create the inability to meet peak flow conditions to city water customers; and

WHEREAS, the phase III residuals handling improvement project at the Canyon Road water treatment plant is estimated to cost \$12M of which the city anticipates a total of \$4.025M in state grants; and

WHEREAS, the city desires to seek approximately \$900,000 from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for Section 595 environmental infrastructure and resource protection assistance funding; and

WHEREAS, the balance of the project not funded by state or federal appropriations will be funded by the city's water division's capital improvement project funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE that:

- 1. City staff is authorized to seek the assistance of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers under Section 595 of the Water Resources Development Act of 1999, as amended, for the city's Canyon Road water treatment plant phase III residuals handling improvement project.
- 2. Once a project cooperation agreement (PCA) is completed, the city will pay no less 25% of the cost for the project.

1	3. The city understands that the city will receive credit toward the city's share of
2	project costs, not to exceed 25% of the total project costs, for designs completed prior to the PCA
3	and for land, easements, rights-of-way and relocations.
4	4. Once the project is constructed, the city will be responsible for 100% of the
5	operation and maintenance costs of the project.
