INSTITUTING "CAVERNOUS ANGIOMA AWARENESS WEEK"

WHEREAS, Cavernous Angiomas (also known as "CCM") are clusters of abnormal blood cells found in the brain and spinal cord that may result in seizures, hemorrhage, or even death; and

WHEREAS, CCM can occur spontaneously or as the result of an inheritable genetic defect; and

WHEREAS, because of a genetic mutation present in early Spanish settlers, northern New Mexico and southern Colorado have the highest incidence of CCM anywhere in the world; and

WHEREAS, over 1000 families in northern New Mexico are at risk for CCM; and WHEREAS, even members of the City Hall family have been stricken by CCM; and WHEREAS, genetic testing is now available to determine if individuals are susceptible to CCM; and

WHEREAS, knowledge of this susceptibility can help individuals who are susceptible
