11 A RESOLUTION

12 SUPPORTING PROPOSED STATE LEGISLATION SPONSORED BY MEMBERS OF
13 SANTA FE'S LEGISLATIVE DELEGATION, 50TH LEGISLATURE - STATE OF NEW
14 MEXICO - SECOND SESSION, 2012 THAT RELATES TO REDUCING PERA
15 CONTRIBUTIONS FOR STATE EMPLOYEES; STABILIZING EDUCATION THROUGH
16 THE USE OF THE PERMANENT LAND GRANT FUND; ENCOURAGING NEW MEXICO
17 GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES TO USE LOCAL BANKS; REDUCING CORPORATE
18 INCOME TAX RATES; REQUIRING COMBINED REPORTING FOR CERTAIN
19 UNITARY CORPORATIONS AND AMENDING THE NEW MEXICO CONDOMINIUM
20 ACT.

21 WHEREAS, the 30 day session of the 2012 Legislative Session begins on January 17, 2012
22 and ends at noon on February 16, 2012; and

23 WHEREAS, during the 30 day session, the Santa Fe's Legislative Delegation is proposing to
24 push through various bills that the Governing Body supports; and

25 WHEREAS, proposed legislation would remove the 1.75% increase in PERA contributions

1 by state employees; and

2 **WHEREAS**, proposed legislation would allow the public to vote on whether to use funds
3 from the Permanent Land Grant Fund to help stabilize education; and

4 **WHEREAS**, proposed legislation would encourage governmental entities in New Mexico to
5 use local banks to deposit their funds; and

6 **WHEREAS**, proposed legislation would reduce corporate income tax rates and require
7 combined reporting for certain unitary corporations; and

8 **WHEREAS**, proposed legislation would amend the New Mexico Condominium Act to
9 require confirmation from the local zoning official that a condominium declaration complies with
10 local zoning ordinances and subdivision regulations as required in Section 47-7A-6 NMSA 1978.

11 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE**
12 **CITY OF SANTA FE** that the Governing Body supports Santa Fe's Legislative Delegation and their
13 efforts to push through the following legislation during the 50TH Legislature - State Of New Mexico -
14 Second Session, 2012:

15 1. Removing the 1.75% increase in PERA contributions by state employees; and

16 2. Allowing the public to vote on whether to use funding from the Permanent Land
17 Grant Fund to help stabilize education; and

18 3. Encouraging governmental entities in New Mexico to use local banks to deposit their
19 funds; and

20 4. Reducing corporate income tax rates and requiring combined reporting for certain
21 unitary corporations; and

22 5. Amending the New Mexico Condominium Act to require confirmation from the local
23 zoning official that a condominium declaration complies with local zoning ordinances and
24 subdivision regulations as required in Section 47-7A-6 NMSA 1978.

25 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the City Clerk is directed to forward a copy of this


1 resolution to the City's lobbyist and the City's State Legislative Delegation.

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

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
