Resolution No. 2008-5 was approved by the City Council on January 9, 2008 and was sent to the County for execution. The Resolution that was returned from the County was different from the City's approved resolution therefore a City approved amendment was required prior to signing the new version.

Resolution 2008-25 rescinded Resolution 2008-5 and Resolution 2008-26 containing the County's amendment was then approved by the City entitled: "A Joint Resolution Establishing a Food Policy for the City of Santa Fe and Santa Fe County; and Creating the City of Santa Fe and County Advisory Council on Food Policy".

20	D. <u>MEMBERSHIP; OFFICERS.</u>	
21	1. The Council shall consist of thirteen members. Nine shall be from the	
22	private sector, two employees of the City of Santa Fe and two employees of the County	
23	of Santa Fe. Of the nine from the private sector, five members shall be appointed by the	
24	mayor with approval of the City Council and four members shall be appointed by the	

Board of County Commissioners.

- 2. Members shall reside in the state of New Mexico and shall have expertise in relevant fields, and to the extent possible, represent the diversity of the community in aspects such as culture, gender, age, and geography.
 - 3. The City and County employee members shall be:
 - a. The City Manager and County Manager or his/her designee; and
 - b. One member from the department with the largest involvement in food-related issues and services or as otherwise appointed.
- 4. Of the nine private sector members, all shall be actively engaged in at least one program, service, or business related to hunger and food insecurity, the production, processing and distribution of food, including representatives from the food industry, consumers, educators and dieticians. From among these nine, at least one shall represent emergency food programs, one shall represent agriculture, one shall represent food or nutrition education, and one shall represent the for-profit food industry.

 Representation from related state, federal and local governments shall be encouraged including: (but not limited to) the women, infants and children (WIC) Program administered by the New Mexico Department of Health, the food stamp program administered by the Income Support Division of the New Mexico Human Services

 Department, the county extension office administered by the New Mexico Department of Agriculture and the Santa Fe School District.
- 5. The Council shall elect a chairperson and vice chairperson. The chairperson shall appoint sub-committees and sub-committee chairpersons as needed. Subcommittees may also include non-Council members from the public or private sectors. The Council may request representatives from those government agencies listed in paragraph 4. above as appropriate for subcommittees.
- E. TERMS. Of the initial appointments, six of the members shall be

	appointed for two year terms and seven shall be appointed for three year terms. Subsequent term					
	shall be for three years to maintain staggering of terms. There shall be no limitation to the numb					
	of consecutive terms a member may serve. The chairperson shall serve for a two year term. After					
	three consecutive unexcused absences a Council member shall be automatically removed and					
	notified thereof by the chairperson. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as initial					
	appointments and shall be for the remainder of the unexpired term. Members may be removed by					
	the Mayor with the approval of the City Council or by the Board of County Commissioners as					
	originally appointed, with or without cause.					
	F. MEETINGS. A quorum shall be at least seven members. The Council shall					
	meet at least once per month and shall conduct all meetings in accordance with the New Mexico					
	Open Meetings Act and adopted City and County policies and procedures.					
	G. <u>STAFF</u> . The County health and human services department shall serve as					
	the primary liaison to the Council and the City shall provide stenographic services; however, the					
	City and County Managers may agree to rotate, on an annual basis, the primary liaison and					
	stenographic services responsibilities. Depending upon the issue, other City or County staff may					
	also be required to assist the Council. The Council may also use donated assistance from the state					
	or federal governments or the private sector. The Council shall have the cooperation of all					
	departments in the City and County in the performance of its duties. All departments shall supply					
	the Council with all information and reports requested in order that the established food policies					
	of the City and the County may be realized.
