10	A RESOLUTION
11	PETITIONING THE PRESIDENT AND CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO
12	SAY <u>NO</u> TO ATTACK ON IRAN, <u>NO</u> TO ANY PRE-EMPTIVE STRIKE ON IRAN AND
13	<u>NO</u> TO U.S. WEAPONS USED IN AN ATTACK ON IRAN.
14	
15	WHEREAS, the citizens of Santa Fe and their local elected officials have the
16	constitutional right to petition the federal government on matters of grave concern to our
17	community; and
18	WHEREAS, Santa Fe is the City of Holy Faith, whose residents hold high the sanctity of
19	human life; and
20	WHEREAS, war is not a humane nor effective means of resolving international
21	conflicts; it dehumanizes all people; it causes destruction and waste on an unprecedented scale; it
22	creates ecological devastation that takes decades if not centuries to correct; and
23	WHEREAS, the citizens of Santa Fe fear that the United States is coming ever closer to
24	starting or being drawn into an attack on Iran; and
25	WHEREAS, the purported justification for attacking Iran is its possible future

1	WHEREAS, the purported justification for attacking Iran is its possible future
2	development of a nuclear weapon; and when U.S. intelligence officials have recently declared
3	there is no evidence that Iran has made the decision to build a nuclear weapon; and that even if it
4	does it is perhaps years away from being able to do so; and
5	WHEREAS, Iran has repeatedly stated that it is open to negotiations; and open to
6	diplomatic opportunities; and
7	WHEREAS, General Martin Dempsey (Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff), has
8	acknowledged that Iran is a rational player and should be treated as such, and many high ranking
9	State Department and high ranking Pentagon officials took out an ad in the Washington Post (6
10	March 2012) declaring Iran not to be a nuclear threat; and
11	WHEREAS, the people and country of Iran do not pose any threat to the United States
12	(in fact, Iran is surrounded by more than 40 U.S. bases); and
13	WHEREAS, the present circumstances are alarmingly similar to the false claims of
14	threats of WMDs and nuclear threats that were put forth to induce the public to support the U.S.
15	attack on Iraq; and
16	WHEREAS, an attack on Iran threatens to bring the U.S. into another disastrous war in
17	the Middle East just as we are extricating U.S. troops from the deadly and costly Iraq and
18	Afghanistan wars; and
19	WHEREAS, an attack on Iran is likely to kill thousands of innocent Iranian civilians and
20	likely to lead to retaliation, endangering thousands more around the world; and
21	WHEREAS, General James Mattis, Commander, U.S. Forces Middle East, said: "An
22	Israeli first strike would be likely to have dire consequences across the region, and for U.S. forces
23	there" (New York Times, 3/20/2012); and
24	WHEREAS, the U.S. will be held responsible for any attack on Iran, top U.S. military
25	officials have told Congress that any attack is premature and would be imprudent and

1	destabilizing; and any pre-emptive attack on Iran violates international law and commitments
2	under the U.N. Charter; and

5	WHEREAS, in June 2011, the United States Conference of Mayors adopted a resolution
4	stating: "The United States Conference of Mayors calls on the President and U.S. Congress to
5	end the wars as soon as strategically possible and bring these war dollars home to meet vital
6	human needs, promote job creation, rebuild our infrastructure, aid municipal and state
7	governments, develop a new economy based upon renewable energy and reduce the federal debt";
8	and
9	WHEREAS, according to the nonpartisan National Priorities Project the cost of the Iraq
10	and Afghanistan wars has been over \$186,000,000 for the City of Santa Fe alone; and
11	WHEREAS, any conflict with Iran is likely to incur far greater costs and divert more
12	precious national resources away from critical human needs in Santa Fe; and
13	WHEREAS, we need our tax dollars at home to rebuild and preserve our communities,
14	our land, air, water, our schools, our healthcare system, our infrastructure, and not to engage in
15	another unnecessary, deadly, and costly war; and
16	WHEREAS, this resolution is supported by the following Santa Fe organizations:
17	Another Jewish Voice Santa Fe, Veterans for Peace, Occupy Santa Fe, Code Pink, Women in
18	Black, Social Justice Team of the Unitarian Church, We Are People Here, Green Party of Santa
19	Fe County, People for Peace, Los Alamos Study Group, Youth Allies, Amnesty International
20	Group 122, Communication Workers of America, Local 7076.
21	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE
22	CITY OF SANTA FE that the governing body, on behalf of the citizens of Santa Fe, petitions
23	the President and the Congress of the United States to: say <u>NO</u> to any attack on Iran; say <u>NO</u> to
24	any pre-emptive strike on Iran; say NO to U.S. weapons used in an attack on Iran; use diplomacy

and NOT threats in negotiations with Iran; and to NOT allow U.S. planes, weaponry, intelligence or technology be used in a pre-emptive attack on Iran. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk shall forward a copy of this resolution to the President of the United States and to all members of the New Mexico Congressional Delegation.
