10	A RESOLUTION
11	PROCLAIMING SEVERE OR EXTREME DROUGHT CONDITIONS IN THE CITY OF
12	SANTA FE AND RESTRICTING THE SALE OR USE OF FIREWORKS WITHIN THE
13	CITY OF SANTA FE AND PROHIBITING OTHER FIRE HAZARD ACTIVITIES.
14	
15	WHEREAS, the danger of range fires, grass fires, forest fires and structure fires is very
16	high or extremely high in and around the city of Santa Fe; and
17	WHEREAS, the weather in Santa Fe has been dry and windy, contributing to the present
18	very high or extremely high fire risk, and it is predicted that the windy and dry weather will
19	continue into the coming weeks, causing progressively worsening fire conditions; and
20	WHEREAS, due to low winter precipitation, United States forest service data indicates
21	very high or extreme fire danger presently exists; and
22	WHEREAS, it is anticipated that drought conditions will be present for the foreseeable
23	future; and
24	WHEREAS, the probability of ignition of materials likely to serve as fuel for fire is
25	presently extremely high in the city of Santa Fe; and

1	WHEREAS, in recent months, the city of Santa Fe fire department has responded to					
2	wildland fires which have threatened structures and homes in the city of Santa Fe, and					
3	WHEREAS, if the city experiences a fire that burns out of control in the watershed, 40%					
4	of the city's water resources are at serious risk of complete loss or substantially reduced capacity;					
5	and					
6	WHEREAS, if the city experiences a fire that burns out of control in populated areas, it					
7	may be necessary to evacuate and relocate affected residents; and					
8	WHEREAS, pursuant to N.M. Stat. Ann. Section 60-2C-8.1, the governing body of a					
9	municipality is authorized to restrict the sale or use of fireworks within the boundaries of the					
10	municipality if severe or extreme drought conditions exist.					
11	NOW THEREFORE BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF					
12	THE CITY OF SANTA FE:					
13	Section 1. This resolution shall be deemed a proclamation within the meaning of					
14	Section 60-2C-8.1 NMSA 1978 and Section 12-3.9 SFCC 1987.					
15	Section 2. As per Section 60-2C-8.1 NMSA 1978, the governing body has					
16	determined and declares that severe or extreme drought conditions exist within the boundaries of					
17	the city of Santa Fe based upon current drought indices published by the national weather service					
18	and other relevant information supplied by the United States forest service.					
19	Section 3. The governing body restricts the sale or use of fireworks to the maximum					
20	extent possible permitted in Section 60-2C-8.1 NMSA 1978.					
21	A. The sale or use of the following fireworks is specifically prohibited					
22	within the city limits:					
23	(1) aerial devices:					
24	(a) aerial spinners;					
25	(b) helicopters;

1			(c)	mines;	
2			(d)	missile-type rockets;	
3			(e)	roman candles;	
4			(f)	shells; and	
5			(g)	stick-type rockets;	
6		(2)	ground	audible devices:	
7			(a)	chasers; and	
8			(b)	firecrackers.	
9	B.	All fire	eworks w	vithin any lands covered wholly or in part by timber, brush	
10	or native grass are prohibited.				
11	Section 4.	An exc	ception to	o the above restrictions are public displays of fireworks in	
12	strict conformance with the requirements and conditions set forth in Section 12-3.3 SFCC 1987				
13	and as approved by the city of Santa Fe fire chief.				
14	Section 5. Pursuant to Section 12-3.9 SFCC 1987:				
15	A. Any individual, firm, partnership or other entity found in violation of the				
16	above restrictions shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by				
17	imprisonment for up to ninety (90) days or a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars				
18	(\$500), or both.				
19	B. Each and every occasion on which this section is violated shall be				
20	considered a separate offense.				
21	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that:				
22	Section 1.	Due to	severe o	or extreme drought conditions and wildland fire	
23	conditions, the Governing Body hereby prohibits the following activities, in accordance with the				
24	International Fire Code® as adopted by §12-2.1 SFCC 1987:				
25	A. Open burning, including campfires, bonfires, pit barbecues;

1	B. Burning of weeds, trash, or other vegetation;					
2	C. Using charcoal barbecue grills in public parks and recreation areas;					
3	D. Smoking in public parks, recreation areas, or on any public trail; and					
4	E. Using any motorized all terrain vehicle or motorcycles on city owned					
5	open space, parks, trails, or other recreational areas.					
6	Charcoal barbecuing at a residential structure is permitted if the fire is closely monitored and fire-					
7	extinguishing equipment, such as a garden hose or fire extinguisher, is readily available.					
8	Section 2. Pursuant to Section 1-3.1 SFCC 1987:					
9	A. Any individual, firm, partnership or other entity found in violation of the					
10	above restrictions shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by					
11	imprisonment for up to ninety (90) days or a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars					
12	(\$500), or both.					
13	B. Each and every occasion on which this section is violated shall be					
14	considered a separate offense.					
15	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body recognizes that Section 60-					
16	2C-8.1 NMSA 1978 only allows municipalities to adopt fireworks restrictions for 30 days at a					
17	time and no less than 20 days prior to a holiday for which fireworks may be sold, therefore, to					
18	ensure that there will be no lapse in the fire restrictions imposed by this resolution. The					
19	Governing Body may impose these fire restrictions at any subsequent meeting date hereafter to					
20	ensure that such fire restrictions are in place during extreme or severe drought conditions and					
21	wildland fire conditions.
