MINUTES OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE OCCUPANCY TAX ADVISORY BOARD July 26, 2012

I. PROCEDURES

a) CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

A regular meeting of the Occupancy Tax Advisory Board was called to order on July 26, 2012, at approximately 8:30 a.m. by Miguel Castillo, Chair in the City Council Chambers, City Hall, Santa Fe, New Mexico.

Roll indicated the presence of a quorum for conducting official business as follows:

b) APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Ms. Catanach noted that Earthmind Media would not be presenting today.

The final reports were moved up on the agenda.

Ms. Bonney moved to approve the agenda as amended. Mr. White seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

c) APPROVAL OF MINUTES -May 31, 2012

Ms. Bonney moved to approve the Minutes of the May 31, 2012 meetings as submitted. Mr. White seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

II. LODGERS' TAX UPDATE (DAVID TAPIA)

Mr. Tapia was absent.

Mr. Bradbury said the lodgers' tax that was collected at the end of the fiscal year came in close to \$8 million, including the payments received (\$250,000-\$300,000) from the properties that were delinquent. The occupancy revenue remained flat last year.

III. CVB ACTIVITY REPORTS:

a) Jim Bradbury (Interim SFCVB EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR)

Mr. Bradbury asked Cynthia Delgado to give an update on the marketing plan.

Ms. Delgado noted that Santa Fe competed in a national contest called "Best of the Road" afforded by *USA Today* and *Rand McNally*. The competition focused on social media – FaceBook, Twitter, as well as websites. Santa Fe was one of the finalists with five other communities. The judges of the competition visited Santa Fe at the beginning of July and stayed about three days. They were shown the richness of our culinary experience. Crew from the Travel Channel accompanied the judges.

Ms. Delgado reported that Santa Fe was named in the "Best of the Road" category and has received great coverage from this.

Ms. Delgado said the CVB has been working on a Marketing Plan for the next 18 months. This will be ready for the new CVB Executive Director to review when he arrives. It will also be presented to the hospitality groups, the business associations and to OTAB.

Mr. Margetson noted that OTAB has asked in the past to be invited to participate in the Marketing Plan but this hasn't happened. OTAB is supposed to advice or participate in the marketing efforts for the city.

In response, Ms. Delgado said the way the draft is written, they have the next 30 days to go through the plan and she would be happy to bring the Plan to OTAB for their comments.

Mr. Margetson said this does not involve the Board.

Ms. Delgado said it will take a significant amount of time to go through the Marketing Plan and this would not be fair to OTAB to do at a meeting. She would rather set up a community work session where OTAB and key business leaders would be invited to attend.

Mr. Margetson asked about the process for the Marketing Plan and who participates.

Ms. Delgado said herself, Jim Bradbury (CVB Executive Director), the PR firm LOCAS, TKO Advertising and Studio X. She explained that they have been doing the plan in pieces and components. They have begun some of the creative - taking it out to some of the key hotels to get input and feedback.

Mr. Margetson asked if Chris Madden was involved. Ms. Delgado said no, from a sales and marketing perspective, they have not gone to the point where they are working together or brainstorming. She said this would be appropriate to do and she would like to do it during a work session.

Ms. Delgado reported that the CVB participated in the FAM with the Department of Tourism. Albuquerque and Taos also participated.

Ms. Delgado mentioned that she did a media trip in the Dallas market.

b) CHRISTINE MADDEN - SFCVB SALES

[Copies of Santa Fe Convention and Visitors Bureau Sales Activities for period: July 1, 2011-June 30, 2012 - {Exhibit A} were distributed.

Ms. Madden reviewed the information in Exhibit "B". Please see Exhibit "B" for the specifics of this presentation.

Ms. Madden reported as follows:

- The CVB ended the year as predicted. They accomplished more site visits and did the ground work for future large bookings. They will continue the FAM trips in town: 1 on September 10th-14th; 1 on October 29th and the final one in November.
- The "Experience Santa Fe On Us" promotion went good; however, they only booked three groups as a result of the promotion. They have met with the Director of Sales about the next promotion. They would like to go out with a

fresh look and package for next fiscal year and they will lower the room nights from 500 room nights to 300 room nights. They think this is more attainable. They hope to have a video in the next couple of weeks. They intent to use social media and e-mail blasts and print ads for the promotion.

- The CVB will focus on the Chicago and Washington DC as major target markets. They are going to also try to reach out to some secondary markets, such as Kansas City and St. Louis.
- The CVB has 50,000 room nights booked for this coming fiscal year and are off to a good start.
 - Ms. Bonney asked if SOFA paid the \$68,000 that they owed.
 - Mr. Bradbury said this is presently with the attorneys.
- Mr. Margetson said OTAB would like to know how much business the CVB has on the books for the next 12 months.
 - Mr. Bradbury said they could provide a report on the booking pace.
- Mr. Bradbury referred to the e-mail that he sent to the Board Members with regards to LTAB and what OTAB would recommend that the CVB do about the county properties/hotels, such as Bishop's Lodge and Encantado, who do not give the City any lodgers' tax. He asked the Board if they would like for him to take the County properties off of the City's websites (for group leads or marketing purposes). Should they eliminate any advertising that is done for County properties?
- Mr. Margetson said this would be a shame and he thought that the City and County Managers were going to discuss this further after the meeting that was held. He noted that the County has contributed funding for public relations.
- Mr. Bradbury said they have contributed \$5,000 for this fiscal year. They also contributed funding to do a video in the past.

Chair Castillo suggested that the City ask the County properties to contribute to the public relations and marketing efforts.

- Ms. Bonney said they could send a letter to the County informing them that a suggestion has been made to eliminate the county properties.
- Mr. Margetson said the letter could indicate that they are considering doing this in the absence of any further discussion or collaboration- and the City feels that they need to take the appropriate action.

Mr. Bradbury said a point was made to include the properties as well.

Ms. Delgado said a proposal could be done that shows how much it costs the businesses to stay on the City's website, possibly the County and/or properties could provide this amount to the City on an annual basis.

Chair Castillo said, in fairness, the City could simply ask for participation from the County to contribute in the advertising of County properties.

Mr. White moved that OTAB recommends that the City formulizes a negotiation with the County to get their support to advertise the County properties. Ms. Bonney seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

OTAB would like to see a draft of the letter before it is sent.

Mr. Margetson said he appreciates the labors of Jim Bradbury and what he has accomplished in the last 15 months. He also acknowledged Mr. Bradbury for the tremendous team he has put together. The other Board Members thanked for Mr. Bradbury for everything he has done.

c) STEVE LEWIS- SFCVB PUBLIC RELATIONS

Mr. Lewis reported as follows:

- The "Clip Book" for period January-July 2012 was available for the Board to review.
- Six press writers came into Santa Fe for the New Mexico Tourism FAM.
- A writer from five different Kansas City magazines was in town in July. She mainly focused on art.
- A writer from Odyssey Travel Guide came into town in July also.
- The editor of American Lifestyle Magazine was in town last week.
- The deputy editor of Coast Magazine was here in early June.
- Cynthia Delgado met with editors from *Dallas Morning News, Private Clubs* and *Modern Luxury*.
- A freelancer on assignment for the *Wall Street Journal* will be coming to Santa Fe.
- Mr. Lewis is working on visit arrangements for a writer team from the *Chicago Sun Times*.

- A writer/editor from Traveling Boy & Life After 50 publications will be coming to Santa Fe for Spanish Market.
- An editor with Association News was here as part of a Meeting Planner/Press trip. There will be four stories forthcoming from her.
- A writer from Forbes.com was in town. The piece has already been posted on Forbes.com.
- In terms of press outreach, the CVB worked with a contributor for David Magazine who picked put a GLBT release and included Santa Fe as an emerging gay travel destination and this has been picked up by many websites.
- CNN Monday and Fortune Magazine ran a story on the best places to retire, which placed Santa Fe as number one place to retire.
- The CVB is doing a savings package with La Posada and *Travel and Leisure.com* featured this in the LHA weekly value blast that is done every week.
- Dallas Morning News featured the new exhibit at the O'Keeffe Museum.
- Lou Hammonds herself visited Santa Fe for the Folk Art Market and a business meeting/presentation was set up with her.
- A great piece was done by a local writer on the Latino culture at the Santa Fe International Folk Art Market.
- Mr. Lewis met with a women's travel blogger who was in town and talked about future projects.
- LTAB gave final approval for \$5,000 to go towards the fall press trip. Tentative dates are October 18-22. An itinerary is being done now that will include both the City and the County.

Mr. White mentioned that El Rey Hotel was named as one of the 10 best Values in Lodging.

IV. REQUEST FOR FUNDING:

a. Dual Language Education of NM -David Rogers, Executive Director

Mr. Rogers presented the information from their application. Please see Exhibit "B" for the specifics of this presentation.

Dual Language Education of New Mexico is requesting \$7,500 in OTAB funding for the La Cosecha 2012 Dual Language Conference that will be held on November 7 to November 12, 2012 at the Santa Fe Convention Center and La Fonda Hotel. Mr. Rogers said the conference happens in November, which is history a slow time of the year for tourism.

Mr. Rogers said Dual Language Education of New Mexico will return to Santa Fe, to host its 17th annual *La Consecha* conference. The conference brings together educators, parents, researchers and practitioners who support dual language education across the U.S. and the world. For La Cosecha 2011, the 1400+ participants represented 30 different states in the U.S. plus educators from Canada, Spain, Mexico, Peru, Qatar and Argentina.

The purpose of the *La Cosecha* conference is to provide theory, practices and discussion to enhance and expand the knowledge base and experience of educators' development, implementation, and cultivation of dual language programs.

- Mr. Rogers said they are estimating that they will see an increase in room nights by 6%, approximately 1400 room nights. It is estimated that *La Cosecha* 2012 will bring 1500+ visitors to the city, which will positively impact revenue for the Santa Fe tourism industry.
 - Mr. Margetson asked Ms. Catanach if OTAB had any money left.
- Ms. Catanach said they have started a new fiscal year and OTAB has \$70,000 for FY12.
- Mr. Rogers noted that the budget is included in their application. He said their budget is approximately \$1.3 million and this conference is their major money-maker. They have a budget of approximately \$345,000 for this conference. The marketing budget is around \$26,000.
- Mr. Rogers said they are asking for \$7,500 from OTAB mostly for advertisements that will be done in late summer and early fall.
- Ms. Bonney noted that the advertising budget for Native Treasures is \$6,500 but they are asking for \$7,500. She asked Mr. Rogers to clarify this.
- In response, Mr. Rogers said this is for two things: advertisement as well as the conference guides.
 - Mr. Margetson asked what "Cosecha" meant.
 - Mr. Rogers said it means harvest.

Chair Castillo noted that OTAB has discussed the issue of not funding conferences; however, this particular conference entices people to come to the Convention Center and this conference has been successful. He said the Board has to consider this case by case and the Board should also think about putting together a policy regarding this.

Mr. Margetson moved to fund Native Treasures at \$5,000. Ms. Bonney seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

V. FINAL REPORT:

a. Santa Fe Film Festival-Diane Schneier Perrin

There was no representative for the Santa Fe Film Festival present; therefore no report was given.

b. Native Treasures-Ardith Eicher

Ms. Eicher presented the information from their Final Report. A written report was distributed in the Members' packets. Please see Exhibit "C" for the specifics of this report.

Ms. Eicher said Native Treasures Indian Arts Festival is a high quality Native American art show and sale, which takes place every Memorial Day weekend at the Santa Fe Community Convention Center. In addition to attracting Native art collectors and tourists from around the country, proceeds from the Festival provide the majority of exhibit funding for the Museum of Indian Arts and Culture, which in turn draws visitors to Santa Fe.

Ms. Eicher noted that this was the eighth year for the Festival and 2012 was the first year that they applied for OTAB grant funding. The grant was for \$7,000. The funding was used to expand advertising to national publications that target Native American art collectors, Albuquerque publications and key drive markets, particularly in Texas. Native Treasures allocated the \$7,000 to advertise in the following publications: Native Peoples Magazine, May/June 2012; Albuquerque, the Magazine May 2012; Albuquerque Journal Venue Magazine May 2012 and Texas Monthly, May 2012.

Ms. Eicher said the results were sensational. This was the best Native Treasures Indian Arts Festival to date. Attendance increased an estimated 10% last year (from 5,000 to 5,500), setting a new attendance record.

Ms. Eicher said per OTAB's requirements, an exit survey was conducted by Southwest Planning and Marketing in 2011. This survey confirmed that Native Treasures attracts the majority of its attendees from outside of Santa Fe, with almost half of the attendees reporting that Native Treasures was the destination event that brought them to Santa Fe. 60% of the attendees visited from outside of Santa Fe and of those visitors, 46% said that Native Treasures was their primary reason for visiting and 44% stayed in a hotel/motel/B&B for an average number of 4.74 nights. The median age of the visitors was 61 years of age and the median income was \$121,296.

Ms. Eicher said they really think this was the perfect investment for OTAB funding and as they moved forward, they hope that OTAB will continue to fund this event. They feel that they have a great growth potential and the next objective is to build awareness for the show in other drive markets such as Colorado, Arizona, and California through additional advertising in local publications in these markets.

Mr. White asked Ms. Eicher if there is any talk about bringing the median age down from 61 to a younger group.

Ms. Eicher said this is a challenge for every arts organization across the country but this is something they can think about for next year.

Mr. Margetson asked if they are competing with Indian Market.

Ms. Eicher said no, mainly because the event is held at a different time of the year.

c. Earthmind Media-Sara Diaz

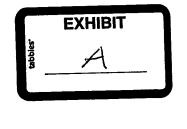

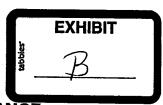

PROCEDURES FOR LODGERS TAX FUNDING ASSISTANCE FOR SPECIAL EVENTS

- To acquire the Lodgers Tax Funding Assistance application, contact the Santa Fe Convention & Visitors Bureau (SFCVB) at 505-955-6211. Our office hours are 8:00 a.m.— 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. The application is also available on our website www.santafe.org under contacts.
- 2. Enclosed are the statutes and policies of the Lodgers Tax for your review. Please read them carefully, BEFORE completing the Lodgers Tax Funding Assistance request form. This will ensure that you understand the guidelines by which the Occupancy Tax Advisory Board (OTAB) is governed. Failure to comply with any of these requests may result in your application being denied or revoked. If you have any questions about the application, you may contact the Santa Fe Convention and Visitors Bureau at 505-955-6211.
- 3. The organization applying must be for non-profit status (18-11,15, letter B, Santa Fe City Code) with a tax exempt status and tax identification number or umbrella under a fiscal agent on file. A letter from the fiscal agent under which the organization umbrellas must be submitted with the application along with the following qualifying documents:
 - a. City of Santa Fe Business Registration License
 - b. New Mexico State Gross Receipts-Withholding Certificate (CRS-1)
 - c. Internal Revenue Service form 501 (C) 3, proof of non-profit status (if applicable)
 - d. New Mexico State Non-Taxable Taxation Certificate (if applicable)
 - e. Insurance policy as indicated on number 13 of this application.
- 4. Please submit the Lodgers Tax Funding Assistance application, your current budget and supporting documents (including the pre-event budget breakdown), along with ten (10) copies (mailed or delivered) to the attention of the O.T.A.B. Administrator at SFCVB for review. The application is to be completed and all attachments for support must be supplied at this time. The application must be submitted thirty (30) days in advance of the next OTAB meeting. Application presentations are heard monthly. Events may be funded not more that (3) times with the exception of city sponsored events. Any applicant falling to submit their application by the scheduled time will be required to wait until the next month to submit a funding request.
- 5. Applicants are required to attend the next scheduled OTAB meeting and make a fifteen (15) minute presentation (maximum) at which their application is reviewed. Board members may ask questions and discuss the application and all aspects of the event. The OTAB meetings are conducted in compliance with the New Mexico Open Meetings Act.
- If the OTAB Board declines a request, the applicant is allowed to request that the SFCVB
 place that item on a subsequent meeting agenda if further clarification or discussion is
 required. The Chairman of OTAB approves all requested items for the agenda, before the
 meeting.
- 7. If the applicant's request is approved by the OTAB, the CVB O.T.A.B. Administrator will draft a contract of services. This may require the applicant and the SFCVB to work together on the contract. Due to the time needed for processing the contract, it is very important that the applicant cooperate with the CVB O.T.A.B. Administrator through this process.
- 8. Depending on the amount of the contract, it may need to be approved by the Finance Committee of the City Council. If the Finance Committee approves it, the request will then be

forwarded to the City Council for final approval. The applicant will be provided with the dates for the Finance Committee and City Council meetings. The applicant is required to attend these meetings, in the event that any questions need to be answered.

- Once the Contract has been executed it shall not be altered, changed, or amended except by a written notice to the OTAB by the applicant. The OTAB will then hear the recommendation and vote for its acceptance. An amendment to the Contract will then be prepared and presented to the City Manager for approval and signatures.
- 10. After the City has approved the contract, and the contract is fully executed and dated, a purchase order will be entered. The SFCVB will need to be invoiced as the applicant completes services for the event. Prepare an Invoice on organization letterhead for the total amount of the approved expenses and attach it to the final report. Only those costs incurred after the contract is fully executed may be invoiced for payment from the funding. The applicant will submit invoices for payment to the CVB Special Projects Manager. Only those costs incurred after the contract is fully executed may be invoiced for payment from the funding. Payment will be submitted within fourteen (14) working days; however, the City has thirty (30) working days to complete the payment process.
- 11. All advertisement and promotional material for the event must state that "partial funding was granted by the City of Santa Fe Lodger's Tax".
- 12. The Intent of funding special events from Lodgers Tax proceeds is to bring overnight visitors into Santa Fe and thus increasing tourism for the City of Santa Fe. Events must use Lodgers Tax funds only for advertising, promotion, or marketing that targets an audience outside of a 50-mile radius of the City of Santa Fe. Thus, increasing the likelihood that those people drawn to the event by the marketing efforts will spend at least one night at a lodging establishment in Santa Fe. The City of License for broadcast media must be outside of a 50-mile radius of the City of Santa Fe. If an event needs to attract a significant amount of Santa Fe residents, the event is encouraged to utilize Santa Fe based (or targeted) media as part of their marketing efforts, using funds from sources other than OTAB for local media and the OTAB allotment for all "out of town" advertising.

Example: Your advertising budget is \$6,000. OTAB awards your organization \$2,500. You would spend the OTAB funding amount (\$2,500) on media outside of Santa Fe and your remaining advertising budget (\$3,500) on local media.

- 13. The Contractor must maintain adequate liability insurance in at least the amount stated in the New Mexico Tort Claims Act (one million fifty thousand dollars) (\$1,050,000). A certificate of insurance must be provided by the contractors insurance agency. It is the sole responsibility of the Contractor to comply with the law. Copy of the insurance policy must be presented with the application.
- 13. Contractor agrees to defend, indemnify and hold the City of Santa Fe, OTAB members, and the Convention & Visitors Bureau harmless for all losses, damages, claims or judgement, execution, actions or demands whatsoever resulting from the Contractor's actions or inactions as a result of the event.
- 14. After the event, a post-event written report must be submitted to the OTAB, within the next quarter (90 days). The report will be presented to the OTAB by a ten-minute (10) verbal presentation to explain the written follow-up report at the next regularly scheduled meeting (post-event). The report must include a post event budget of expenditures and revenues. Also a descriptive breakdown of how the event directly related to produce revenue for tourism i.e. number of attendees, participants, number of room nights used in local hotels/motels, estimate of direct revenue other than room nights, next year's plan.

- 15. City of Santa Fe as per the guidelines of the City Finance Department:

 All reimbursement information must be categorized as per City of Santa Fe Professional Service Agreement approved budget.
 - a. Original invoices must be submitted for payment processing. (Copies of invoices will not be accepted.) Invoices must be dated and paid by the event after the signed agreement date.
 - b. Vendor statements will not be accepted instead of original invoices.
 - c. Copy of cancelled checks (front & back) or signed credit card receipts must accompany invoices as proof of payment.
 - d. Copies/clippings of flyers, banners, advertisements (radio, TV, newspaper, magazine, etc.) must accompany each vendor-related invoice.
 - e. Invoice for the O.T.A.B. funding amount.

Note: The processing of your payment will be completed in a timely manner by the SFCVB staff provided you submit your information during or immediately after the event. Keep in mind that your Professional Service Agreement with the City is a dated contract and invoices can not be paid if received after your contract is expired.

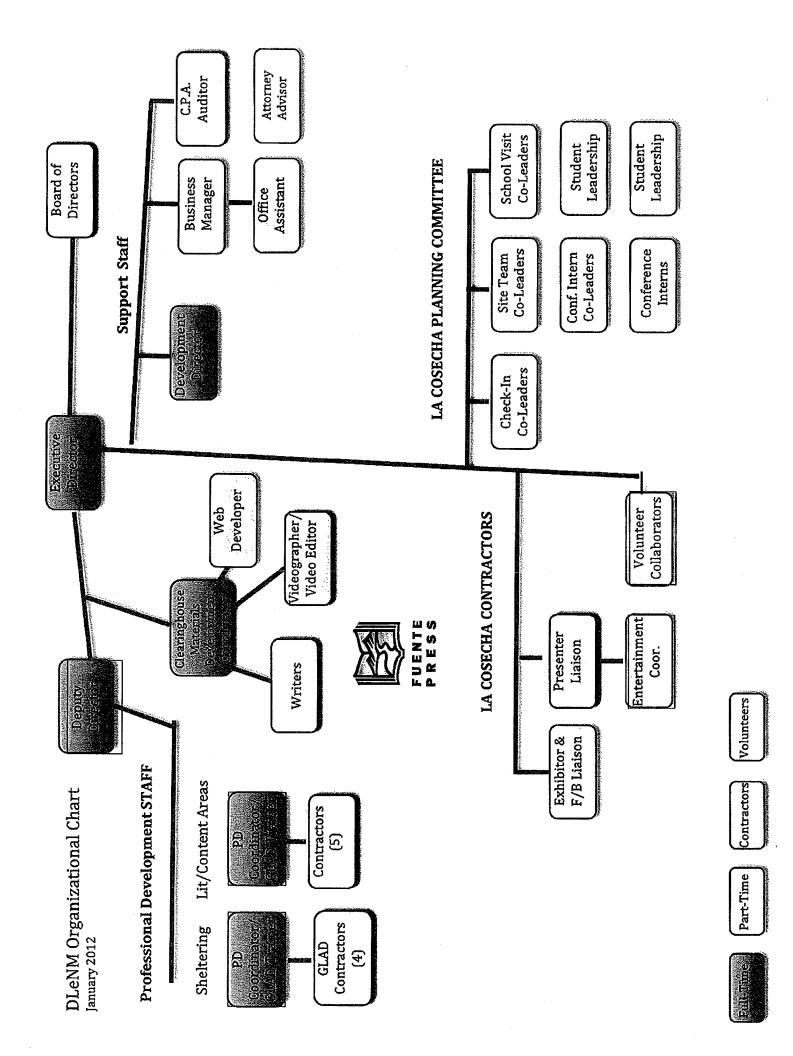

DLeNM will only pursue those foundation grants and fundraising opportunities that support (do not distract from), and align with the organization's mission, vision and strategic plan. DLeNM's final goal is to become self-sufficient, fully funding DLeNM operations with money generated through conference and other professional development offerings has been met. Grant writing campaign and funding will be used to develop new project initiatives including AIM4S³ Math Framework

(expenditures to "build" the organization and prepare for any additions of grant monies, will be reviewed and revised during May 2012 Strategic Planning Retreat)

For FY2011, DLeNM funded 95% of organizational activities with money generated through conference and other professional development offerings.

The new Development Director improved general communication and marketing of product, raised additional funds including \$41,000 - La Cosecha sponsorship, \$10,000 - Santa Fe Community Foundation, and \$5,000 - direct donations, including \$2,200 for scholarship applications = \$48,200. FY2012 financial goals for Development work include:

Grant awards (local) - \$80,000 La Cosecha related sponsorships - \$34,000 Donations (including monies raised for scholarships) - \$20,000

Financial Goal

To secure funding that supports all DLeNM Activities as well as provides 25% more for new project development.

The budget for FY2011 generated 12% less than operation costs and/or budget targets
The budget for FY 2012 is projected to generate 5% more funds then required to cover overhead costs.

DLeNM's total assets as of January 1, 2012 will be 24.5% of the FY2012's total budget, approximately \$340,457.97. DLeNM's total assets on January 1, 2011 was 25% of the FY2011's total budget, approximately \$351,000.00.

This provides the final OTAB report for the *Native Treasures Indian Arts Festival*, which took place on May 26-27, 2012.

Background

Native Treasures Indian Arts Festival (NT) is a high quality Native American art show and sale, which takes place every Memorial Day weekend at the Santa Fe Community Convention Center. 2012 marked the eighth annual event. In addition to attracting Native art collectors and tourists from around the country, proceeds from NT provide the majority of exhibit funding for the Museum of Indian Arts & Culture, which in turn draws visitors to Santa Fe.

Attendance at NT has been steadily growing every year. In order to continue this growth, show organizers wanted to expand NT advertising to 1) national publications that target Native American art collectors, 2) Albuquerque publications, and 3) key drive markets, particularly in Texas. NT applied for OTAB funding to do just that and 2012 was the first year that OTAB money was utilized for NT. The grant was for \$7,000.

Results

Native Treasures was a resounding success in 2012. Attendance increased an estimated 10% vs. last year (from 5,000 to 5,500), setting a new attendance record. Per OTAB requirements, an exit survey was conducted by Southwest Planning and Marketing in 2011. This survey confirmed our own research that Native Treasures attracts the majority of its attendees from outside of Santa Fe, with almost half of these people reporting that NT was the destination event that brought them to SF. Attendees are an upscale audience who stay in hotels and spend almost five nights in Santa Fe. In addition to the money spent at Native Treasures, these visitors also buy meals in restaurants and art in galleries. Highlights of the NT visitor profile are:

*60% visiting from outside Santa Fe

*Of those visitors,

-46% said that NT was their primary reason for visiting

-44% stayed in a hotel/motel/B&B

-Average # of nights in Santa Fe = 4.74

*Median age = 61.5

*Median Income = \$121,296

As we move forward, we hope that OTAB will continue to fund this event. Our next objective is to build awareness for the show in other drive markets such as Colorado, Arizona, and California through additional advertising in local publications in these markets. We feel confident that the individuals who will be attracted to Native Treasures will be exactly the kind of visitors that Santa Fe wants—upscale art lovers with the time and money to enjoy our beautiful city and come back for repeat visits.
