MINUTES OF THE

CITY OF SANTA FÉ

PUBLIC WORKS/CIP & LAND USE COMMITTEE

MONDAY, JANUARY 7, 2013

1. CALL TO ORDER

A regular meeting of the Public Works/CIP & Land Use Committee was called to order on the above date by Chair Rebecca Wurzburger at approximately 4:45 p.m. in City Council Chambers, City Hall, 200 Lincoln, Santa Fé, New Mexico.

2. ROLL CALL

Roll Call indicated the presence of a quorum as follows:

MEMBERS PRESENT:

MEMBERS ABSENT:

STAFF PRESENT:

NOTE: All items in the Committee packet for all agenda items were incorporated herewith by reference. The original Committee packet is on file in the Public Works Department.

3. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Mr. Pino asked for an amendment of the agenda to allow the informational item, a 2-3 minute presentation, right after the minutes.

Councilor Calvert moved to approve the agenda as amended. Councilor Trujillo seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote. Councilor Rivera was not present for the vote.

4. APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

Councilor Calvert requested discussion for items #11a and #13.

Mr. Pino noted that #8 in the memo has a wrong total on the cover page that later had been corrected

Chair Wurzburger asked for #8 to be pulled for discussion.

Councilor Calvert moved to approve the consent agenda as amended with 8, 11-A and 13 pulled for discussion. Councilor Trujillo seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote. Councilor Rivera was not present for the vote.

5. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM NOVEMBER 26, 2012 PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE MEETING

Councilor Trujillo moved to approve the minutes of November 26, 2012 as presented. Councilor Calvert seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote. Councilor Rivera was not present for the vote.

INFORMATIONAL AGENDA

18. UPDATE ON UPCOMING PUBLIC WORKS BIDS (ROBERT RODARTE)

Mr. Rodarte said the City Manager sent him the project list [attached as Exhibit 1]. The handout identified the projects that were not affected by the CWA process. The Photovoltaic project at GCCC would be piggy-backed off the federally funded one at Buckman Direct Diversion rather than to rebid the whole thing again.

The next one was from Nick Schiavo for insulation of high speed broad band for small businesses and was part of CIP last year. He could research this to see if it could go under the CWA program. It would be a summer project.

Councilor Rivera arrived at this time.

The third project was under \$400,000 so it wouldn't fall under CWA. Airport runway 220 was a federally funded project so it was not eligible for CWA. The Buckman pipeline extension would fall under CWA and they were looking at late spring for this contract. It was the same with the hospital tank which was the result of a settlement under the water fund at \$600,000 so it was CWA eligible. The St. Francis Drive main extension would also be in the spring and was eligible for CWA.

Chair Wurzburger clarified these were eligible not only because of the time line but also the budget amount and had no federal or state grants. Mr. Rodarte agreed.

Councilor Trujillo asked if the Santa Fé Trails bus shelters would be as elaborate as the one at

Sandoval. Mr. Rodarte agreed.

Councilor Rivera asked if the Herrera Drive project would be part of CWA.

Mr. Rodarte agreed. It was not on this list but should be. He didn't know the budget amount.

Mr. Pino said it was over a million.

Chair Wurzburger thanked Mr. Rodarte for the report.

PUBLIC HEARING

6. REQUEST FOR DIRECTION REGARDING MONTAÑO STREET PURSUANT TO RESOLUTION NO. 2012-76 (LEANNE VALDEZ)

Mr. Eric Martinez presented this request.

Chair Wurzburger clarified for the public that the Committee was considering three options - limited emergency access from fire station #3 through Ashbaugh Park, limited emergency access connection of Montaño Street from Velarde Street to Barela Lane or no further action. The option discussed previously and around which there were pages and pages of testimony related to extension of Montaño Street was not the subject of this discussion.

Councilor Calvert added that they also we're not discussing an emergency access from Palomino Street either. The Committee already heard loud and clear from the original resolution and the original meeting at Frenchy's that the public didn't want Montaño Street connected. That was resolved. Part of the resolution was to determine any desire for emergency access.

At the meeting he attended 16 people (41%) spoke in favor of emergency access and 38% of written responses were in favor. One person mentioned a real example where a woman had to be carried across the field to an ambulance and another ambulance had to park on Agua Fria for access.

Councilor Trujillo noted that agenda item #17 would deal with taking no action on the extension as a discussion item.

Mr. Martínez said since the resolution was adopted in September the City had 2 public meetings - one in November and one on January 3 where they heard loud and clear not to make the street connection but to have emergency access.

He asked Fire Marshal Reynaldo Gonzales how long it took now for an emergency vehicle to get there.

Mr. Gonzales said it now took 4-5 minutes and with emergency access could decrease the time to 1½ minutes if they used Ashbaugh Park. Velarde-Barela would not reduce the time.

Councilor Calvert asked what road width was needed for that access.

Mr. Gonzales said they needed a minimum of 20'.

Mr. O'Reilly said the property manager determined how much land the City would have to acquire and the approximate cost. He estimated \$4-\$7 per square foot for the ROW and the amount depended on how the connection was made. It could cost about \$60,000.

Mr. Martínez said in their initial presentation in December they looked at a variable width between 32' and 50' for an actual road. At 32' ROW the lower end would be \$300,000 for ROW costs.

Chair Wurzburger thought one option had a much higher cost estimate.

Councilor Calvert said that cost estimate was from Palomino which was no longer being considered. Mostly likely it would cost \$50-60,000 but he didn't know specifically what it would be through Ashbaugh Park.

Mr. O'Reilly agreed with Councilor Calvert's estimate but that didn't include construction.

Councilor Rivera assumed access through Ashbaugh Park would require a bridge. He asked if they looked at changes at the fire station.

Mr. Martínez said they didn't look at that and clarified that they would need more than a pedestrian bridge.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Chair Wurzburger set a time limit of 3 minutes each.

Mr. Bertram Quintana, 1708 Montaño Street, said he was at the first meeting and it seemed about 95% didn't want to open Montaño either to the west or to the east. The only entrance he had was Velarde Street. Palomino had two access points. Barela had three exits. Nobody wanted to connect the roads because of privacy but there was a fire at the entrance to Velarde Street and they had to carry out a little girl. Summer before last a house blew up in the neighborhood. He had 3 issues with emergency access. Some people were landlocked now. The easiest way to access was now blocked because last summer a house was built where the Barela access would go. Going through the park was the best access and it shouldn't need a bridge but just a culvert.

Councilor Bushee said they had a meeting last Thursday and 40 people attended. Only one person on Sandoval wanted emergency access but Velarde was only 18' wide. It would be an inordinate cost to widen it and it would bring more traffic on Velarde. Almost every comment except Ms. Sandoval didn't want any access. [Comment sheets from that meeting are attached as Exhibit 2].

Mr. David Brooks, President of the Homeowners' Association on Nicole Place said the Association met and decided they wanted no action at all. They had 3 emergencies in the last 15 years and all were met

satisfactorily.

Ms. Gail Rocker, 909 Nicole Place, said she went to both meetings and at the first they said no further action should be taken but at the last meeting only 1 of the 40 wanted emergency access. They were all aware of the narrow streets that were dead end. The cost didn't warrant the emergency access. She wanted no further action please.

Mr. George Ortíz lived at 306 Palomino Street for 40 years. They had hashed and rehashed this. Nobody really wanted this. He favored no further action.

Ms. Barbara Ortiz had a letter with a petition in favor of the Montaño access. She read the letter from a family that was landlocked and had no access to their land. That land had been ignored by the City. The only access was Velarde with cars parked on both sides. There were incidents where emergency vehicles couldn't get through. The city asked us for ROW for trail and we were cooperating. But it would give up the most beautiful part of our land at the Acequia Madre. They didn't want to give up their land. People were overwhelmingly in favor of the trail and that would prevent them from access to the remaining portion of their land. The Sandovals were also historic landowners along the Acequia Madre and have also been asked to give up land for the trail. Her family had been left with few options to use their land. She asked the City to grant a connection to Montaño Street. [The petition is attached to these minutes as Exhibit 3]

Ms. Elizabeth Dunn had notes from their last meeting from which she read. It was a response to the Ortíz family. She said she would be heartbroken if the Ortíz family was allowed to develop with lots of houses and cars. The owners on Nicole Place could create a fund to buy the land and keep it open. So many people used it and loved it. She didn't see emergency access needed. It would cost so much to build a bridge. She promised to email her comment.

Ms. Anna Hansen, 2008 Kiva Road, member of POSAC but not speaking on their behalf, lived in this neighborhood for over 30 years. It would be beneficial if Velarde connected to Barela as a "U" out to Agua Fria. There was open land near the Larragoite School so there would be a way to connect it and still create emergency access. She was opposed to access through Ashbaugh Park because once established, the fire trucks would use that continually. The POSAC just restored that park at great cost with a bike/pedestrian trail. They worked 14 years to get Pino connected to Casa Alegre. They wanted a bike trail because there was no traffic and it paralleled Cerrillos Road up to Baca Street and connect the neighborhood. She was opposed to the Ashbaugh connection option.

Mr. Ramon Sandoval owned property there. He was for access.

Ms. Nadine Ortiz Kennedy objected to scheduling public meetings during the holidays. They were not able to organize and others had been organized for years. They had gathered many signatures today that knew nothing about these meetings. She gathered many signatures in one week in favor of access.

Mr. Quintana spoke again and said if they didn't extend or do any emergency access his family should get back the 50x100 property they forfeited for an extension.

Chair Wurzburger said it was good that Mr. Quintana got that on the record and said the City would

follow up after the meeting.

There were no further speakers and Chair Wurzburger closed the public hearing.

Councilor Calvert said it was not his intent to force anything on anyone but to get options and opinions. He didn't know which was the best option. If he had to choose, he would choose the connection between Velarde and Barela would be limited and not create more traffic. It wouldn't create new traffic. The cost was not excessive. \$50,000 for the ROW and not a lot more for what the City did at Fire Station District 4 as an alternate way to get out of there. It was all public safety there. The City now requires emergency access on all new developments. This affects people on Velarde and Nicole Place. Any new project would require two points of access.

He recalled they hashed over the development on Rufina to make sure access was there. But if the City says no further action by vacating any dedication, then that option was closed forever and he hoped there would never be any emergency back there. Those were things they didn't anticipate.

Councilor Trujillo agreed that public safety was the most important thing they could give. He asked how long it would take to get an ambulance to these people. He asked what good the fixed up park would be to those people if they were not alive. He favored the Ashbaugh route with a gate. He wanted to see staff look at something as the best option there.

Councilor Rivera noted that access between Velarde and Barela would not decrease times but would give another U. Public Safety was at the forefront and the given emergencies in the past it would make sense to have limited access with gates on both sides of the road that only fire trucks and ambulances could access and only in time of emergency. He believed they should take the fire marshal's recommendation.

Councilor Rivera asked Mr. Gonzales if the second option (Velarde to Barela) was his recommendation.

Mr. Gonzales said Ashbaugh was their first recommendation and if not, then the second option.

Councilor Bushee countered that the people at the meeting heard Mr. Gonzales say the fire department would use the access at Ashbaugh for regular access and not just emergencies. At the meeting, nobody indicated the access was just for emergency purposes. No one could speak for Montaño Street.

Councilor Calvert said there was no Montaño Street there. As an emergency access only, it wouldn't even be called Montaño Street. He understood what they were saying about Ashbaugh Park. Access between Velarde and Barela would take care of those that happened in the past. He was just saying that was best option from what people had spoken about and would be the least disruptive.

Councilor Bushee asked for a true ENN with pictures of what the gates would look like. Frenchy's was put up in very short time frame.

Ms. Ortiz pointed out that this all happened during the holidays and wanted a no action option.

Councilor Calvert said he didn't' ask for meetings during the holidays. The first meeting was November 21.

Chair Wurzburger thought they had sufficient feedback.

- Mr. Gonzales said they had a similar access at Fire Station #3 that worked out quite well.
- Mr. Quintana spoke up a third time and agreed to be on a committee for clarification.

Councilor Trujillo asked Mr. Martínez what the time for an ENN meeting would be if the Council went with option 2.

Mr. Martínez said funding would be the real question. They could prepare for the ENN at a moment and have the ENN relatively soon.

Councilor Calvert moved to direct staff to pursue option two (Velarde to Barela) and schedule an ENN meeting as soon as possible. Councilor Trujillo seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.

Councilor Calvert sought a friendly amendment on the fourth page of the ordinance under Architecture - item 6-E about 60% clear windows. Lots of north facing windows meant it would not be energy efficient. He asked Kathryn Mortimer to look at it. So he asked for minimum dual pane windows.

Councilor Dominguez had no objection to that amendment and had asked staff to take some of those things into consideration. He thanked Chair Wurzburger and Councilor Rivera for signing on to it.

Councilor Calvert asked to be added as a sponsor.

Councilor Calvert moved approval with that amendment (dual pane windows). Councilor Rivera seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.
