#### ADVISORY BOARD OF DIRECTORS

May 15, 2013

A meeting of the City of Santa Fe Division of Senior Services Advisory Board of Directors was called to order by Mary Louise Giron, Vice Chairperson at 9:30 a.m. on this date at the Mary Esther Gonzales Senior Center, 1121 Alto Street, Santa Fe, New Mexico.

Roll Call indicated the presence of a quorum for conducting official business as follows:

#### **INVOCATION**

Invocation was led by Gilbert Alarid.

#### PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Bernardo C de Baca and was recited by all present.

#### APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Ms. Lucero moved to approve the agenda as published. Ms. Gonzalez seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES: April 17 2013**

The following change was made to the Minutes of the April 17, 2013 meeting:

Page 3, under Committee Reports, RSVP Committee; the motion was seconded by Ms. Sanchez.

Ms. Sanchez moved to approve the Minutes of the April 17, 2013 meeting as amended. Ms. Trujillo seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

#### DSS DIRECTOR'S REPORT

#### a) Program Units of Services Update

[A spreadsheet on the Division of Senior Services Program Units of Services – Actual vs DPS Fiscal Year 2012-2013 - is hereby incorporated with these Minutes as Exhibit "A".]

Mr. Vialpando gave an update on the Program's Units of Services as follows:

- With two months left in the fiscal year, the DSS has closed the gap for units of services for congregate meals, and are over projections by 88 units.
- The units of services for home-delivered meals are over projections by 6,116 units.
- The units of services for transportation were short by 527 units; however, Mr. Vialpando met with staff and it looks like they closed this gap by 200 units from last month.
- The DSS has been able to close the gap for the units of services for respite and homemaker services. The units of services for respite are over projections by 23; and the units of services for homemaker services are also over projections by 51 units.

#### b) AAA (Aging and Long Term Care Services) Funding Allocations

Mr. Vialpando said the AAA Mock Hearing was held several months ago. This was an opportunity for the DSS to present their needs, in terms of operating dollars, to the Aging and Long Term Care Services Department.

Mr. Vialpando reported that the DSS received a notice from Non-Metro AAA that they received a total allocation of \$45,445, which is an increase in funding, when compared to the prior year. The DSS saw an increase of \$31,034 in the Title 3 Program. These dollars are earmarked for respite care services. The DSS also identified an increase in fuel costs, food costs, etc. As a result, the DSS received an additional \$14,411 for these costs.

Mr. Vialpando said the DSS received \$683,016 last year and the DSS will receive \$728,461 this year.

Mr. Vialpando mentioned that he and Mary Louise Giron will be attending the AAA meeting tomorrow where they will go over the policies and procedures. He offered to provide an update at the next meeting. Andres Romero is a member of the Non-Metro Aging and Long Term Care Advisory Council and will be representing the City of Santa Fe at the meeting.

Mr. Vialpando noted AAA recently conducted an audit of the senior program and there were no significant findings. The DSS should receive a report on the audit soon and Mr. Vialpando will provide an update at the next meeting. This will be an agenda item for the next meeting.

Mr. Vialpando concluded his report noting that the DSS is in the process of closing the budget for this fiscal year and they are waiting for the contracts for the capital outlay projects.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

The written Committee Reports were submitted, distributed and reviewed. {Please see Exhibit "A" for the details.}

#### RSVP Committee

Ms. Trujillo moved to accept the RSVP Committee monthly report as submitted, and include it as a part of the public record with the Minutes. Ms. Gonzalez seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

#### Foster Grandparent /Senior Companion Programs Committee

Mr. Alarid moved to accept the Foster Grandparent/Senior Companion Programs Committee monthly report as submitted, and include it as part of the record with the Minutes. Ms. Gonzalez seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

#### **Transportation and Nutrition Committee**

Ms. Sanchez moved to accept the Transportation and Nutrition Committee monthly report as submitted, and include it as a part of the public record with the Minutes. Ms. Trujillo seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

#### **In-Home Support Committee**

Ms. Gonzalez moved to accept the In-Home Support Committee monthly report as submitted, and include it as a part of the public record with the Minutes. Mr. C de Baca seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

#### Senior Olympic Committee

Ms. Giron asked if the punch passes that will be issued on May 13<sup>th</sup> are free passes for the participants.

Mr. Vialpando said yes, the participants can use them at all of the recreational centers.

Mr. Alarid noted that the passes used to be for one year.

Mr. Vialpando offered to look into why the passes are not for one year anymore.

Ms. Lucero moved to accept the Senior Olympics Committee monthly report as submitted and include it as a part of the public record with the Minutes. Ms. Sanchez seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

#### **UNFINISHED/OTHER BUSINESS**

#### a) Update on Defibrillator Training

Lugi Gonzales noted that the schedule for defibrillator training is in the seniors' newsletter. [Copies of the schedule were distributed in the Members' Packets].

The Santa Fe Fire Department will offer free training on how to perform *hands-only* CPR, how to use AED defibrillator and what to do when calling 911. The schedule is as follows:

Pasatiempo-Wednesday, May 15th at 10:00 a.m.

MEG Center – Tuesday, May 21st at 9:30 a.m.

Ventana de Vida – Wednesday, May 22<sup>nd</sup> at 1:00 p.m.

Luisa Center, Friday, May 24th at 10:00 a.m.

Villa Consuelo Center, Wednesday, May 29th at 10:00 a.m.

The classes will last 45-60 minutes each. Santa Fe Fire Department Training Officer, Greg Cliburn will conduct the classes.

Mr. Vialpando noted that they invited staff from the Housing Authority to attend the trainings.

Ms. Lugi Gonzales will do the defibrillator maintenance for the month of May because Toni Ann Gallegos will probably not be able to do it.

#### b) First Aid, CPR and AED Training

Mr. Vialpando added that the DSS is in the process of closing out this year's budget and now is the time if anyone is interested in receiving **First Aid** CPR training. Interested individuals can contact him.

Ms. Giron suggested that they ask them to introduce the "DNR" (Do Not Resuscitate) card to the aging population at the training. She explained that a lot of people do not want to be resuscitated.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

There was no new business.

#### **COMMENTS FROM THE FLOOR**

Ms. Lucero was given condolences on the loss of her mother. Mr. Vialpando noted that a flower arrangement was sent to Ms. Lucero on behalf of the Board. Ms. Lucero sent a thank you card and Mr. Vialpando read it aloud to the Board Members.

#### The following are some program highlights:

- Our Foster Grandparents are about to complete the school year by the end of next week.
   Approximately 19 of 29 want to continue volunteering during the summer. Staff will start looking for volunteer opportunities for them at the different summer programs in the public schools or at local Head Starts.
- Our Senior Companion Program is still not recruiting anytime soon. All slots are filled and staff continues to remove requests for Senior Companions off of our waiting list. We also continue to receive requests for senior who are interested in joining the program. Although staff attempts to persuade them into joining the Foster Grandparent Program, the majority of them would like to volunteer assisting other senior citizens.
- Staff received our new contracts from the State of New Mexico, Aging and Long Term Services Department. The next step is for staff the get approval from our City Attorney's office and then get them approved by the Finance Committee and City Council, which is an annual formality. We do not foresee any difficulties in the approval process.
- Staff is in the process of reviewing our budget for the current fiscal year. I may be possible
  to take the FGP and SCP volunteers on a special recognition trip in early June. Last year,
  volunteers were treated to a bus ride, lunch and an educational movie and were thrilled at
  the opportunity to go.


