10 A RESOLUTION

11 RELATING TO THE HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE OF THE RESIDENTS OF  
12 SANTA FE; DIRECTING CITY STAFF TO COLLABORATE WITH THE FAMILIES &  
13 FRIENDS AGAINST DRUGS (“FFAD”) ORGANIZATION TO ORGANIZE A  
14 COMMUNITY-WIDE PANEL DISCUSSION TO BRING AWARENESS AND OFFER  
15 SOLUTIONS TO THE HEROIN AND OPIATE ADDICTION PROBLEM THAT IS  
16 PLAGUING SANTA FE.

18 WHEREAS, there is a heroin and opiate epidemic that is plaguing Santa Fe; and

19 WHEREAS, many Santa Fe residents been affected by the devastating effects that heroin  
20 and opiate addiction has had on their families; and


21 WHEREAS, according to a recent national poll, 40% of high school seniors do not believe  
22 there is any great risk of using heroin; and

23 WHEREAS, there is a need for parents, teens, educators, elected officials and health care  
24 professionals to come together to bring awareness and offer solutions about the heroin and drug  
25 problem that is plaguing Santa Fe.

1 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE**  
2 **CITY OF SANTA FE THAT** in the interest of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of  
3 Santa Fe, City staff is directed to collaborate with the FFAD organization to organize a community-  
4 wide panel discussion.


- 5 1. The purpose of the panel discussion will be to bring awareness and offer solutions to the  
6 heroin/opiate addiction problem in Santa Fe and to provide a forum for questions and  
7 answers.
- 8 2. The panel discussion will take place at a City-owned facility.
- 9 3. The panel will consist of approximately 10 members that will include health care  
10 professionals, educators, counselors and City staff.
- 11 4. City staff shall facilitate the panel discussion.

12 PASSED, APPROVED, and ADOPTED this 9<sup>th</sup> day of October, 2013.


