11	AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF SANTA FE FIRE CHIEF TO, FROM TIME TO TIME,
12	COLLABORATE WITH A VARIETY OF COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDERS WITH AN
13	INTEREST IN PROTECTING NEIGHBORHOODS FROM A WILDFIRE, TO PRODUCE
14	AND IMPLEMENT TANGIBLE WILDFIRE MITIGATION STRATEGIES; AND
15	AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO LOBBY THE LEGISLATURE, DURING THE 2014
16	LEGISLATIVE SESSION, FOR FUNDING TO IMPLEMENT WILDFIRE MITIGATION
17	STRATEGIES.
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19	WHEREAS, the risk to life and property from wildfires has risen significantly over the last
20	decade; and
21	WHEREAS, the United States Congress passed the 2009 Federal Land Assistance,
22	Management and Enhancement (FLAME) Act of 2009 ("FLAME Act of 2009"); and
23	WHEREAS, the FLAME Act of 2009 requires the Secretary of the Interior and the Secretary
24	of Agriculture to develop and implement a cohesive Wildland Fire Management Strategy
25	("Strategy"); and

WHEREAS, the Strategy is being implemented in three phases: planning for wildfire, responding to wildfire and recovering from wildland fire incidents; and

WHEREAS, the Strategy focuses on: restoring and maintaining resilient landscapes, creating fire adapted communities, and response to wildland fires; and

WHEREAS, fire adapted communities are more aware, prepared, resilient, and better protected from a wildfire threat; and

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe Fire Department has identified 27 neighborhoods which exist in the city of Santa Fe wildland urban interface; and

WHEREAS, 19 of the identified neighborhoods received a wildfire hazard rating of high, very high, or extreme; and

WHEREAS, solely removing trees to protect life and property is not an effective solution to the threat from a wildland fire; and

WHEREAS, there are five categories within four environments (Built, Natural, Social, and Response) that address wildfire hazard mitigation: (1) education; (2) engineering; (3) enactment/enforcement; (4) economic incentives; and (5) emergency response that are the most effective approach to reducing the affect a large wildland fire may have on the City of Santa Fe; and

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe Fire Department recognizes that individuals, organizations, businesses and government have to influence the effectiveness in planning, responding, and recovering from a wildland fire incident; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body desires for the City Fire Chief to, from time to time, collaborate with a variety of community stakeholders such as residents, builders, realtors, insurance agents, land managers and employees of the Fire Department with an interest in protecting neighborhoods from a wildfire to develop wildfire mitigation strategies to best protect life and property in the city of Santa Fe.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE

1	CITY OF SANTA FE that the Governing Body of the City of Santa Fe hereby authorizes the city of
2	Santa Fe Fire Chief to, from time to time, collaborate with a variety of community stakeholders with
3	an interest in protecting neighborhoods from a wildfire, to produce and implement tangible wildfire
4	mitigation strategies.
5	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City authorized to lobby the legislature, during the
6	2014 legislative session, for funding to implement wildfire mitigation strategies.
7	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk is directed to forward a copy of this
8	resolution to the City's legislative delegation and the City's lobbyist.
