### March 14, 2013

The Public Hearing of the City of Santa Fe Division of Senior Services Public Hearing was called to order by Ron Vialpando, DSS Director at 9:10 a.m. on this date at the Mary Esther Gonzales Senior Center, Santa Fe, New Mexico.

### **INVOCATION**

Invocation was led by Dennis Gonzales.

### PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

### INTRODUCTION OF ADVISORY BOARD MEMBERS

Mr. Andres Romero introduced the Board Members of the Division of Senior Services Advisory Board. The City of Santa Fe Division of Senior Services Advisory Board represents the City of Santa Fe and is made up of 11 Board Members and meets monthly to discuss program issues, as well as policies and procedures. These individuals volunteer their time, expertise and knowledge which make a difference with the senior program. The Board Members are as follows:

### INTRODUCTION OF DIVISION OF SENIOR SERVICES STAFF

Mr. Romero introduced Ron Vialpando, the Director of the Division of Senior Services. Mr. Vialpando introduced Isaac Pino, the Director of the Community Services Division.

Mr. Pino thanked the senior citizens for taking their valuable time today to participate in the public hearing to help them improve the senior services here in Santa Fe. He said they want to take care of the senior community the best that they can and the comments and feedback they receive today will help them direct their efforts in doing so.

Mr. Vialpando introduced Jenny Martinez, the Non-Metro Director for the Area Agency on Aging, which is one of the funding sources for the senior programs.

Ms. Martinez said the Area Agency on Aging is mandated by federal law to distribute both the state and federal funding they receive to the various senior programs, like the City of Santa Fe Division of Senior Services. She explained that the senior citizens are the real advocates for the funding. She noted that the monies come down from the federal government and from the New Mexico Legislature; goes to Aging and Long Term Care Services Department and then it goes down to Area Agencies. There are four area agencies in the State of New Mexico, which include the Indian, the Navajo, the City of Albuquerque and the Santa Fe Area Agency on Aging covers the rest of the State. There are a total of 32 counties, with the exception of the City of Albuquerque.

Ms. Martinez said as of Monday, they found out that there is no vehicle funding in this year's Capital Outlay, which is funding for the senior vans. She encouraged the seniors to contact their Legislators, House Representatives and the Governor to hopefully get the critical vans funded. She thanked the City for their funding contribution to the senior programs.

Mr. Vialpando introduced Juan Lopez who is with the Aging and Long Term Care Services Department.

Mr. Lopez also thanked the seniors for coming to the public hearing. He said this is an opportunity for them to hear from the seniors on the important senior services. He applauded the City of Santa Fe for their continued funding support for the senior programs.

### **PURPOSE OF HEARING**

Mr. Vialpando noted that the City of Santa Fe Division of Senior Services has to have a public hearing on the Older Americans Act and a related Request for Proposal (four-year proposal) that is being developed. This is the second year of the 4-year proposal.

The Older Americans Act was enacted by Congress in 1965 to ensure provision of social services to America's elderly population. The City's Division of Senior Services administers programs which provide a comprehensive social service delivery system for senior citizens in the community.

The City of Santa Fe is required to prepare and submit a comprehensive plan to the Area Agency on Aging. This has to include a budget and program goals which reflect the services that the Division of Senior Services provides to older adults (60 years of age or older.)

Mr. Vialpando explained that the following program services are critical to the planning and implementation process:

- Congregate meals
- Home Delivered Meals
- Transportation
- Home Management Services
- Respite (Alzheimer's) Care
- Supplemental Assistance
- Grandparents Raising Grandchildren
- Volunteer Programs
- Senior Employment Program
- Center Programming/Health Promotion

Mr. Vialpando reviewed the Division of Senior Services Organizational Chart noting that there are 69 employees in the Division.

Mr. Vialpando reviewed the Division of Senior Services Budget for FY2013-2014. He said 63% of their budget is earmarked for programs, Federal 14%, State 19% and 2% other (Project Income).

Mr. Vialpando explained the distribution funds by program service for 2013/2014.

### SERVICE DELIVERY PRESENTATION, BY RON J. VIALPANDO (POWERPOINT PRESENTATION)

A PowerPoint presentation was presented by various DSS staff members. [A copy is hereby incorporated to these Minutes as Exhibit "B". Please see Exhibit "B" for the specifics of this presentation.]

### PRIORITIZE SERVICES/ITEMS FROM THE FLOOR

The public commented and asked the following questions:

- A senior citizen asked for an explanation or interpretation of the rules and regulations so all seniors can follow them.

Mr. Vialpando will schedule a meeting with this senior.

- The Division of Senior Services was commended for all the great programs they offer the senior citizens.
- The Division of Senior Services Nutrition Program was acknowledged for the great meals they serve. They thanked the cooks for the delicious food they serve, especially here at the Mary Esther Gonzales Senior Center.
- Staff from the Mary Esther Gonzales Senior Center was acknowledged for being helpful.
- The atmosphere at the Mary Esther Gonzales Senior Center is very good.
- Melanie Montoya was commended and acknowledged for the outstanding job she does by several of the senior citizens participating in the public hearing today.
- All senior volunteers were thanked for volunteering their time.
- The senior citizens felt that the classes and day trips that are offered are wonderful.
- A suggestion was made that more senior citizens should attend the health promotion classes.
- The Division of Senior Services drivers were acknowledged for all they do.

### FINAL PROGERAM RECOMMENDATIONS

The following recommendations were ranked and prioritized based on the senior citizens' input and vote:

- 1) Transportation = 53
- 2) Home Delivered Meals = 49
- 3) Congregate Meals = 46
- 4) Respite = 42
- 5) Home Management Services = 41
- 6) Health Promotion = 40
- 7) Supplemental Services/Grandparents Raising Grandchildren = 38
- 8) Other = 37





Organizational Chart





### Percentage by Fund 2013/2014





# Distribution of Funds by Program Service 2013/2014



# Grandparents Raising Grandchildren








# Senior Employment Program






