15	Section 1. Section 6-10 of SFCC 1987 (being Ord. No. 1998-7, as amended) is
16	amended to read:
17	6-10 CHILDREN AND YOUTH COMMISSION
18	6-10.1 Creation; duties and powers.
19	A. There is created the "children and youth commission", hereinafter referred to
20	as the "commission." The commission shall be advisory to the governing body and shall
21	initiate, sponsor or otherwise create, along or in cooperation with other public or private
22	agencies, programs that enhance and further the development and education of Santa Fe's
23	children.
24	B. In accomplishing its tasks, the commission shall survey and assess the needs
2.5	of the children and youth within the city of Santa Fe; identify and recommend to the
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governing body existing legislation, policies, and programs that promote the healthy development of young people; determine priorities for program development; advocate in the community on behalf of children and youth; and plan short and long range improvements for young people by applying a results-based framework, from birth through the age of twenty-one (21).

- C. The commission shall conduct an annual strategic planning process that recommends funding priorities. Upon completion of the annual strategic planning process, the recommended funding priorities shall be presented to the governing body for review and approval.
- D. The commission shall make a recommendation to the governing body for the use of the children and youth fund for children and youth programs as set forth in Section 18-14 SFCC 1987.

6-10.2 Appointment; terms.

A. The Mayor, with the consent of the city council shall appoint at least seven (7) members and not more than seventeen (17) members to the commission. Of the original appointees two (2) commissioners shall serve terms of one (1) year; two (2) shall serve terms of two (2) years; and three (3) shall serve terms of three (3) years; thereafter, commissioners shall be appointed for the terms of three (3) years. Members appointed in excess of the seven (7) required members shall serve two-year terms. Pursuant to Section 9-2A-14.1 NMSA 1978, at least one appointee must represent each of the following entities: children's court, district attorney's office, public defender's office, public schools, and local law enforcement. Having at least one member from each of these agencies allows eligibility for funds from the state of New Mexico children, youth, and families department. The mayor may appoint a member of the mayor's youth advisory board as an ex-officio member. Members shall serve no more than two (2) consecutive terms unless continued membership is required to fulfil the city's funding

1	eligibility under Section 9-2A-14.1 NMSA 1978. After three (3) consecutive unexcused absences,
2	the chairperson shall automatically remove a commission member [shall be automatically
3	removed by the chairperson].
4	B. The commission shall elect the chairperson, organize, and adopt administrative
5	rules and procedures necessary to accomplish its purpose as set forth in Section 16-10.2.
6	C. All members of the commission shall reside in the county of Santa Fe and shall
7	be actively involved with children and youth issues. Members of the commission shall broadly
8	represent all areas concerned with the health and development of children and youth from birth
9	through the age of twenty-one (21)[7] and shall [be] represent[ative of] the city's general
10	demographics.

12	The commission shall have a full-time, paid, children and youth professional to administer
13	[the] programs overseen by the commission and other staff as deemed necessary. The children
14	and youth staff shall manage the children and youth fund; staff the commission; award, [and]

16	community to plan, coordinate, and fund activities, programs, and services that promote the
17	healthy development of children and youth.

The Bill amends the membership composition of the Children and Youth Commission to allow for a maximum of seventeen membership. This increase may allow for members of the Regional Juvenile Justice Board membership to continue their work with the Children and Youth Commission.
