11	SUPPORTING LEGISLATION IN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND THE		
12	STATE OF NEW MEXICO TO PROTECT THE RIGHT TO A SAFE ABORTION.		
13			
14	WHEREAS, New Mexico Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham signed an Executive Order		
15	2022-107 on June 27, 2022, prohibiting State employees from assisting other jurisdictions seeking		
16	criminal or civil penalties related to accessing reproductive healthcare, with limited exceptions;		
17	protecting medical providers from attempts at legal retribution, and establishing that the State will		
18	not entertain extradition attempts from other states relating to receiving or performing reproductive		
19	services, with limited exceptions; and		
20	WHEREAS, the State repealed a statute banning abortion during the 2021 regular session,		
21	when Row v. Wade was still the law of the land; and		
22	WHEREAS, according to the Center for Reproductive Rights, 970 million women/people		
23	with the capacity for pregnancy, representing 59 percent of people of reproductive capacity of		
24	reproductive age, live in countries that broadly allow abortion, while 41 percent live under		
25	restrictive laws; and

WHEREAS, legal restrictions on abortion result in higher numbers of unsafe abortions, compelling those seeking abortions to risk their lives and health by resorting to unsafe abortion practices¹; and

WHEREAS, according to the World Health Organization, 23,000 people with the capacity for pregnancy die of unsafe abortions each year; and

WHEREAS, people with the capacity for pregnancy across the world have fought for the right to access safe and legal abortion for decades; and

WHEREAS, in the United States, the 1973, *Roe v. Wade* Supreme Court decision recognized the right to receive an abortion under the 14th Amendment of the U.S. Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the 1992, *Planned Parenthood v. Casey* Supreme Court decision upheld the right to receive an abortion, adding that any restrictions should be evaluated under an "undue burden" standard; and

WHEREAS, in December of 2021, the Supreme Court of the United States heard oral arguments in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women 's Health Clinic*, concerning a Mississippi abortion law that directly challenged *Roe v. Wade*; and

WHEREAS, Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Clinic overruled Roe v. Wade; and WHEREAS, millions of people with the capacity for pregnancy lost their legal right to

WHEREAS, millions of people with the capacity for pregnancy lost their legal right to abortion when the Supreme Court overturned *Roe v. Wade*; and

WHEREAS, the greatest impact of this decision will be felt by persons from marginalized groups who already face significant barriers accessing abortion care, particularly low-income people of color; and

WHEREAS, research published in the Duke University Press, Demography (2021) 58
