16	WHEREAS, nationally the cost of graffiti removal is estimated to be \$12 billion per
17	year; and
18	WHEREAS, research in Seattle, Washington found that 60% of graffiti is found on
19	public property; and
20	WHEREAS, during the first six months of 2017, the City of Santa Fe removed 550
21	instances of graffiti from across the City; and
22	WHEREAS, historically, graffiti abetment has occurred through criminalization and
23	repair; and
24	WHEREAS, the establishment of graffiti "free walls" in public spaces have been used to
25	offer legal opportunities for graffiti artists to learn and develop their skills; and

1	WHEREAS, such free wans may nelp foster a feeling of ownership and pride in the
2	community while creating a dialogue between government and the public.
3	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE
4	CITY OF SANTA FE that the City Manager is directed to undertake a feasibility study to
5	explore the potential development of free walls for street artists on municipal properties in the
6	City of Santa Fe in order to abate graffiti on public property.
7	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study shall be presented to the members of the
8	Governing Body within 90 days of adoption of this resolution.
