1	provides alternative and non-motorized access to Santa Fe High School, and is nearby Kearn						
2	Elementary School; as well as runs along the city's Genoveva Chavez Community Center and						
3	nearby other city parks including Ragle Park, Herb Martinez Park, and Monica Lucero Park; and						
4	WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe's extensive park system provides residents and visitor						
5	alike, safe and beautiful areas to recreate, play and enjoy panoramic views; and						
6	WHEREAS a young, growing, and diverse group of Santa Fe residents lives nearly						
7	Ragle Park and the utilizes both the Arroyo Chamiso Trail and the handball courts at Ragle Par

9	WHEREAS, improving neighborhood access to Ragle Park and the Arroyo Chamiso						
10	Trail at Ragle Park north of Zia will provide improved quality of life and safer access to thi
